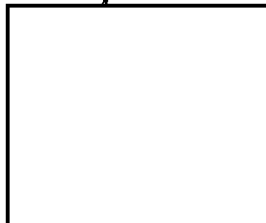
**Synopsis:** Threat made against U.S. Congressman Ed Pastor.

**Details:** On 1/30/1997, the staff of Congressman Pastor notified the Phoenix FBI of a voice message that was on their voice mail on the aforementioned date, received at 4:57 a.m. The message was as follows:

"This is [redacted] we built a bomb. We are black. We don't like Mexicans. We are going to plant a bomb in your office."

[redacted] The Congressman's staff had no past history with either [redacted] Congressman Pastor is planning travel to Washington, DC, on 1/31/1997. He is out of the office today, traveling to Tucson, Arizona.

The Phoenix Division is continuing with its investigation and will report future developments to both CID and WFO.

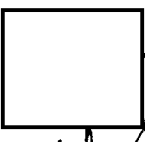

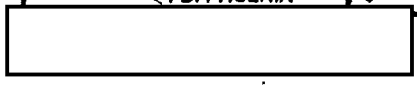

On January 31, 1997, [REDACTED] contacted the offices of Congressman Pastor and Congressman Shadegg, and apologized for making the telephonic threats.
