Did you or have you at any time contributed funds to that organization, if so what were the circumstances surrounding that contribution?
- A. I have not.
- Q. Have have members of your family ever or past family have ever contributed to that party?
- A. My ex-husband, Richard Burton may have at one time, I am not sure because he was a friend of Jane Fonda and David Sutherland and he's a very generous man. He may well have I really don't know.
- Q. But you were sure that you personally have ver contributed to that party?  $\mathcal{S}_{\mathcal{A}}^{\mathcal{M}}$
- have GNW A. I am not, as I am pretty stingy. No I know I haven't.
- Q. The reason I ask this question is because in 1969, David Hilliard, Chief of Staff of the Black Panther Party, stated that "We the Black Panther Party advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence." And further in 1970 Henry Douglas the Cultural Director for that organization stated, "The only way to make this racist U.S. government administer justice to the people it is oppressing via the taking of arms against killing the officials. Do you or have you ever advocated these same actions?
- A. Of course not and I know that my ex-husband, Richard Burton did not go along with that either, if he did givenanyemoney at all it was to help some citizen that was in jail. He would never have gone along with that theory.
- Q. Do you have anything further you would like to add to this statement?
- A. No.




1. The parties were married the 15th March 1964 in the Unitarian Church in Montreal, Province of Quebec, Canada. No child is born from the matrimony; however, the parties adopted the child Maria Burton, born the 8th January 1961.



2. The two parties are British. The Swiss Federal Law of 25th June 1891, concerning the Civil Rights of established temporary residents of foreign nationality, and article 59 of the "Einführungs-und Uebergangsbestimmungen" of the Civil Swiss Code, at no 7h, forsee that a foreign spouse, who lives in Switzerland, can apply for a divorce at the judge of his residence, if he proves that, according to the law and jurisprudence of his country, the cause of divorce is admissible and the Swiss tribunal is recognized.

Concerning the divorce for English people, living in a foreign country, Mr Schnitzer, in a handbook of International Private Law, 4th issue, page 396, expresses the opinion, that a decision will be recognized, if the spouses, at the time of the presentation of the plaint, had their domicile in the above mentioned country. It is sure that the spouses Burton-Taylor have no domicile in England or Great Britain, and that they have been living in Switzerland for ten years. The plaintiff is registered in the commune of Saanen since the 12th December 1961, and the defendant since the 4th January 1965. The spouses Burton possess a Swiss residence permit "C", therefore they are considered as foreign people established in Saanen. They are subject to paying taxes. The plaintiff owns a house in Gstaad, and every year, without exception, spends there a shorter or longer period of time.


Since the question of legal residence is fundamental, according to art. 23 of Civil Swiss Code, one might ask himself wether it is enough, when someone lives a certain time, but not continuously, at a certain place, for considering that the person in question has his legal residence at that place. But one has to notice, that the spouses Burton are forced, because of their work, to be away from their home in Gstaad, the greatest part of the year. That is the reason why the residence in Gstaad must be considered as being their legal residence; as the plaintiff declared in her deposition during the parties' hearing, she has no other domicile. That is why the English law recognizes the Swiss jurisdiction. According to the Swiss law, a cause of divorce must exist. Then, the plaintiff must prove that the cause of divorce



is recognized as such by his or her nationality law (see Schnitzer's handbook for International Private Law, page 379). In the present case, it is established that the general cause of divorce is contained in the Matrimonial Causes Act 1950, and more precisely under the provisions concerning bodily harm and mental cruelty. Therefore, according to English law, the behaviour of either or both spouses may be considered as symptomatic of a profound dissension. In consequence, the district court of Saanen has been accepted as the competent court.

- 3. The parties met each other when working at the film "Cleopatra" in Rome. The common work led them so near, that a love affair began, which became a real and profound bond. The first years of marriage were useful for the common edification and success. But with the time, the fact that each party had the same profession but a well established career, created difficulties. More and more, it became obvious that their personalities, which are both very strong, clashed with one another. Violent arguments began, which eventually ended not only in words, but also in physical aggression. In all this, alcohol played a big role. The abyss between the parties, the hard arguments and fighting, led them so far, that in summer/autumn 1973 they decided to divorce.
- 4. There is in general a profound dissension when the spouses are no longer prepared to continue matrimony, and when every reason for being together has disappeared. This seems to be the situation with the Burton couple. On the basis of the acts and the parties' hearing, the court is unanimously convinced that the Burton couple is profoundly destroyed and cannot be healed.

The pronounced personality of the two stars was the basis for contradictions and tensions, which could not be mitigated with the passing time. The continual hard arguments, which often ended in violence, led the parties to a situation without any issue. One has to deplore that a last mutual trial for saving the couple broke down. It seems that the two parties are resigned and are today complete strangers to each other. Presently, they live separately, for neither




of them can suffer the presence of the other. The court has no grounds to doubt about the rightness of the parties' argument. In such a case, one cannot require from the parties the continuation of common life. One must really speak about a profoundly disturbed marriage, since obviously the two parties have no longer the force to believe in the possibility of saving the marriage. That is the reason why the divorce of the couple has to be pronounced.

- 5. There is no natural child born from the couple. Instead the parties adopted together the child Maria Burton, born the 8th January 1961. The parties proposed the custody of the child to the plaintiff. There is nothing to say against this assignment, for she has already brought up four children and nothing has been shown that could speak against her capacity to bring up children.
- 6. For the other consequences of the divorce, the parties came to an agreement, in a detailed additional convention. This convention contains in particular, clauses concerning the interests of the adoptive child Maria and for the rest, appears equitable, with consideration of the financial relation of the parties. The court is of the opinion that the agreement is to be approved. Moreover, one must notice that the judge must respect the parties' wishes, when they conclude the contract about the strict financial consequences of the divorce. He must not interfere without need, into the liberty of the parties, about the elaboration of their financial relations; and even if one of the parties makes an opposite request, he must refuse only when there are important reasons for doing so (Practice of "Zivilgesetz Buch", 5/1974, page 328-331).

Considering these circumstances,

## it is recognized that:

1. The marriage contracted between the parties on the 15th March 1965 in Montreal, Province of Quebec, Canada, is legally dissolved, at the request of both parties, in application of art. 142 of the Civil Swiss Code.



- 2. The custody of the child Maria, born the 8th January 1961, is given to the plaintiff.
- 3. The convention between the parties, signed the 1st of June 1974 and the 27th May 1974, the convention of divorce and the additions of 25th June 1974, are legally approved.
- 4. According to the convention, the tribunal's costs are supported half and half by the parties and each party will pay for its own costs.

The present judgement was verbally notified to the parties by the Court.

After the opening of the judgement, the parties' lawyers explained that one must renounce the legal possibility of appeal, therefore the judgement became final on the 26th June 1974.

On 4/19/77 I was directed by the Deputy D.D. to discreetly locate a telephone number or address where Subject, or John Warner, her USC husband, could be located or contacted since information had been received indicating that she may be an overstayed B-2. I was advised that they had been married in Arlington County, Va. in September, 1976 and may be living in Faufquier, County, Va. A check of the Arlington County records on that date did not reveal any record of marriage.

On 4/20/77 the Faurquier County records were searched and revealed that they had been married in that county in December, 1976. Warner's address was listed as Upperville, Va.

His residence was located (it is a large farm outside of Upperville) and his housekeeper was interviewed. She indicated that he has a residence in Georgetown that he uses during the week and that he can be contacted through his secretary at I did not identify myself to the housekeeper. (b)(6)

This information was passed on to the Deputy D.D. and on 4/21/77 I was informed by my supervisor that the D.D. had contacted Warner who told him that Subject had last entered the U.S. at LOS on 3/31/77 as a B-2 until 9/30/77, and that an I-130 would be filed forthwith. I was further advised that the D.D. had directed that no further action should be taken by the investigative section at this time and that the case should be considered closed.

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

## 'NO RESPECT'

## Lawmaker Asks: Should U.S. Bar Liz, Burton?

WASHINGTON (UPI)

A Georgia congresswoman called on Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy Tuesday to determine whether Actress Elizabeth Taylor and Welsh Actor Richard Burton should be barred from the United States.

Rep. Iris F. Blitch (D-Ga.), in a speech inserted in the Congressional Record, said it was the right of the American people "to ostracize those who show no concern for either flag or people particularly innocent children - or show no respect for either, cherished institutions or God."

MRS. BLITCH, a grandmother completing her final term in Congress, said "It



is my hope that the attorney general in the name of American womanhood will take the measures necessary to determine whether or not Miss Taylor and Mr. Burton are ineligible for re-entry into the United States on the grounds of undesirability.'

At the same time displeased lawmakers asked the House Rules Committee to authorize a congressional investigation of sex in movies. They said the morals of youth were in jeopardy.

Rep. Joseph P. Addabbo, (D-N.Y.), said Anthony and Cleopatra "were angels compared to what is going on in between Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton."

Miss Taylor is an Englishborn American citizen. Burton is a Welshman.

Burton became the beautifull actress' frequent companion during the filming of "Cleopatra" in Rome. Miss

Taylor announced during the interlude that she and her fourth husband, singer Eddie Fisher, planned a divorcė.

Mrs. Blitch said the relationship between Miss Taylor and Burton lowered the prestige of American women abroad, and damaged goodwill in foreign countries, particularly Italy.

She said one of the "uglier effects" of the triangle was the fate of the eight children belonging to Miss Taylor. Fisher, and Burton.

"The real truth of the matter is that the producers of "Cleopatra" in their overzealous quest for box office exploitation have been derelict in their duty not only to the people, but to God and country as well." Mrs. Blitch said. "To make a mockery of profit out of that which is ordained by our Lord, is a blasphemy of the highest order."

Mrs. Blitch cited newspaper articles which indicated that Burton had no intention of marrying Miss Taylor and suggesting that she should get 10 per cent of his earnings because his fee rose to \$350,000 per picture as the result of his new image as a great lover.

The House Rules Committee took no immediate action on the request for an inquiry into the movies. But Chairman Howard W. Smith (D-Va.) said there was considerable favorable sentiment for one. Some committee members suggested proad inquiry, to include pa perback books, television and smut in the mails.
