RE: NOEM OR JOHNSON ARE REAL THREATS TO THUNE IN GOP PRIMARY; THUNE SUPPORT FOR DEMOCRAT ELECTION BILL COULD BE POLITICALLY DEADLY

DATE: JANUARY 13, 2022

Fabrizio, Lee & Associates recently completed a survey of $n=400$ likely 2022 Republican Primary voters (RPV) in South Dakota (See methodology statement and key demographics on last page). In a hypothetical Republican primary matchup for U.S. Senate, Gov. Kristi Noem leads Sen. John Thune by a significant margin, a sign his path to re-nomination may not be an easy one. Rep. Dusty Johnson is also very popular with South Dakota RPV and would pose a serious challenge for Thune. Furthermore, Thune's support for Chuck Schumer and Bernie Sanders' voter bill is incredibly unpopular and would make his re-election all the more difficult.

South Dakota RPV are Unquestionably Pro-Trump and Anti-Biden

The job approval ratings of Presidents Trump and Biden are polar opposites among GOP primary voters in South Dakota. President Trump is approved of by a huge 84%, including 62% who *strongly* approve. Conversely, President Biden is more than 80-points underwater, as only 8% approve of the job he is doing while a staggering 91% disapprove of his job performance, nearly all of whom *strongly* disapprove. President Trump's support would be invaluable in a South Dakota Republican primary, while being tied to President Biden could be electorally fatal.

Noem and Johnson’s Images Far Outpace Thune’s among South Dakota GOP Primary Voters

Kristi Noem, Dusty Johnson, and John Thune have near universal name I.D. with the South Dakota Republican Primary electorate. However, the difference in the percent that view each person favorably and unfavorably differs significantly. More than 4-in-5 RPV view Kristi Noem favorably, including 65% who have a very favorable opinion. Johnson has a 70% favorable rating, with 37% viewing him very favorably. John Thune has the lowest net favorable image of the 3, with only 62% of RPV viewing favorably, and 37% very favorably. Furthermore, 1-in-3 GOP primary voters have an unfavorable opinion of Senator Thune, double the number of RPV who view Noem negatively and 8-points higher than Johnson’s negatives.

Noem’s Superior Image Propels her to a 9-Pt Lead; Thune Fails to Break 50% against Johnson

If the Republican primary were held today and Kristi Noem challenged John Thune, she would lead by a 49% - 40% margin, well outside the margin of error. Noem would only need to win over a sliver of the 10% undecided to break the 50% mark. Not only is she up by 9-points overall, but among “definite” voters for either candidate, Noem leads Thune, 41% - 31%.

John Thune leads Dusty Johnson, 47% - 30%, but fails to hit the critical 50% threshold. Furthermore, the undecideds in this ballot have a double-digit negative image of Thune (38% fav/53% unfav), indicating Johnson could close the gap considerably. Thune is leading, but Dusty Johnson has the strong name I.D. to make it a real race.

Support for Democrats’ Election Bill could be Deadly for Thune among GOP Primary Voters

John Thune’s support for Schumer and Sanders’ liberal Democratic voter bill would put the Senator at odds with 70% of the South Dakota GOP primary electorate. That is how many people say they would be less likely to vote for Thune if they knew he supported that bill. And most of those voters (60%) say they would be *MUCH* less likely to vote for John Thune. Even a majority of Thune’s own voters against Noem (52%) and Johnson (66%) would be less likely to vote for him if he supports the election bill. If he decides to vote “Yes” on this bill, John Thune could pay dearly at the ballot box.

METHODOLOGY STATEMENT: Fabrizio, Lee & Associates conducted a survey of 400 likely 2022 Republican primary voters from January 10 – 11th, 2022 in South Dakota. The interviews were split 70% cell phone via SMS to web/30% landline phone, using live operators for the landline phone portion. Geography was matched to past voter turnout in recent Republican primary elections. Gender, age, race/ethnicity, and education were matched to demographic profiles of likely voters based on the voter file and state data. Respondents were randomly selected from lists of known voters and new registrants since the 2020 Republican primary election. The margin of error at the 95% confidence interval for 400 voters is $\pm 4.9\%$.
