This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated August 19, 2021, received in our office on August 26, 2021.

You asked for the following records:

- All documents referencing the tax Court case Estate of Franklin Z. Adell, Deceased, Kevin R. Adell, Temporary Co-Personal Representative, Petitioner v. Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Respondent, Docket No. 1188-11
- 2. All documents referencing any attempts to collect money base on decisions entered in the above-reference case from Kevin Adell in his personal or representative capacity.
- 3. All documents referencing Kevin Adell's form 1040, any taxes owed in relation to his 1040 tax form forms
- 4. The administrative file pertaining to collection, civil examination and/or criminal investigation activity relative to Kevin Adell.
- 5. All documents pursuant to summonses issued to third parties which are not otherwise included in the administrative file describe above.
- 6. Audit trail
- 7. All documents in the possession, of Revenue Officer Michael Bryant referencing Kevin Adell.
- 8. All documents in the possession of any Government employee working at the Fort Myers IRS Office, referencing Kevin Adell.
- 9. Third party contact report referencing Kevin Adell.
- 10. All files referencing Kevin Adell that were prepared by independent consultants, international examiners, economist, engineers, and any other specialist assigned to review Kevin Adell's tax liabilities which are not otherwise included in the administrative file.

I sent you a letter on September 27, 2021, requesting additional time to search for and collect the records requested in your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request.

I need additional time to review the records. I expect to complete your request by February 7, 2022. Please consider contacting me to arrange an alternative time frame for processing the request or limiting the scope of your FOIA request, which may reduce the time in processing your request.

Please be aware that extending the time for responding to your request will not delay or postpone any administrative, examination, investigation, or collection action.

You do have the right to file suit for a judicial review. You can file suit after October 8, 2021. File your suit in the U.S. District Court:

- Where you reside, or have your principal place of business,
- Where the records are located, or
- In the District of Columbia

Rule 4(i)(1)(C), of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, requires you to send the IRS a copy of the summons and complaint as well as to the Attorney General and the United States Attorney for the district in which the action is brought. You must send the IRS copies, by registered or certified mail, to:
