Public Records Release

The Department of Police Accountability (“DPA”) is producing records in response to a public records request made under California Penal Code § 832.7.

The responsive records in this production include documents related to SF DPA Case No. 0662-08. The case files are available to view or download on <https://sfdpa.nextrequest.com/requests/20-2> in a folder labeled “0662-08.”

As a preliminary matter, some of the above referenced file contains allegations of misconduct that are not subject to disclosure. Penal Code § 832.7 requires that peace officer personnel files be confidential except for four categories: (1) officer involved shootings, (2) uses of force that cause great bodily harm, (3) sustained findings of sexual assault, or (4) sustained findings of dishonesty. If a file therefore qualifies for disclosure under one of those four categories but also contains additional, unrelated misconduct, the unrelated conduct remains confidential pursuant to Penal Code § 832.7 and is redacted.

Redactions have been made to these records pursuant to the following exemptions:

On the above date and time Officer Higa #1295 and I were dispatched to [REDACTED] PII Great Highway regarding a call of a burglary. 3116E SFPD Officers Cravalho # 1783 and Morgado #466 also responded and were the first unit to arrive on scene. Prior to our arrival, Officers Cravalho and Morgado advised dispatch that shots had been fired upon them at 48th and Taraval St. Officers Cravalho and Morgado advised dispatch that a male in a black jacket "opened fire" on them and he was running up Taraval Street.

Upon arrival, Officer Higa and I observed Officer Cravalho running eastbound on Taraval Street. Officer Cravalho stated "Be careful the guy in the black jacket just shot at us, he is running eastbound on Taraval Street at 47th Avenue." Officer Higa and I responded to Taraval St. and 47th Avenue in our marked police vehicle. I observed a male wearing a black jacket and black ball cap running northbound on 47th Avenue. The suspect began walking on the west side of the street in between the parked vehicles and I then lost sight of him.

Officer Cravalho and Morgado told me the following: Officer Morgado and Cravalho were driving northbound on 48th Avenue when they observed a subject on a bike that may have been responsible for the burglary. Officer Cravalho exited the marked patrol vehicle to detain the suspect. Officer Morgado being the driver tried to catch the suspect on the bike with the patrol vehicle. As Officer Morgado drove the vehicle towards the suspect, the suspect then pulled a gun from his waistband and began shooting at Officer Morgado. Officer Cravalho observed the suspect shooting at Officer Morgado. Fearing for his own and Officer Morgado's life, Officer Cravalho began to return fire at the suspect with his department issued firearm. The suspect then turned and began to fire his handgun at Officer Cravalho. After Officer Cravalho and the suspect stopped shooting, the suspect fled eastbound on Taraval Street towards 47th Ave.

Numerous SFPD Officers throughout the city responded (CAD# [REDACTED] ID) and a perimeter was established. Contreras #1082 at Operations was notified at 0109 hours and a command post was established at 47th and Taraval Street. SFPD Specialists and Tactical Units arrived onscene and assisted in the operation.

Sgt Kato #692 established a Command Post.

Officers Cravalho and Morgado were transported to SFGH by Medic 18 for their injuries they sustained during the incident. Officers Higa and Palma responded with Medic 18 to SFGH.

3X301, Captain Tittel #2104 arrived onscene at 0110 hours. 4T300 Captain Mcdonagh #377 arrived onscene and established tactical command. Captain Sanford #1414 was notified of the incident and responded to the scene.

Officer Higa and I responded to [REDACTED] PII Great Highway to meet with (R/W1) [REDACTED] ID and (R/V1) [REDACTED] ID. [REDACTED] ID told me the following: [REDACTED] ID exited his condo to walk his dog and he noticed his garage door open. [REDACTED] ID observed a male pulling up the garage door from the inside of the garage. An (S1) unidentified individual rode a (S/R) bike out of the garage and continued southbound on Great Highway. The other male in the garage, later identified as (B1) [REDACTED] ID stated "I wasn't in your garage," and walked south on Great Highway. [REDACTED] ID called his [REDACTED] PII from the lobby and told her to call the police and she did immediately. [REDACTED] ID then followed (B1) [REDACTED] ID on foot until the area of 47th and Santiago and then heard what he thought were fire crackers and voices

shouting. [REDACTED] then walked back home. [REDACTED] provided SGT Dare #897 with an (E1) written statement prior to my arrival. I provided [REDACTED] with a follow-up form with a case number.

Officer Higa talked to (R/V) [REDACTED] and he told Officer Higa the following: The (S/R) bike was last seen at 5-18-07 at 2300 hours and was stored in the garage. This was the (S/R) bike that [REDACTED] observed the suspect riding out of the garage with and onto the Great Highway. The bike was later recovered at 48th/ Taraval Street. [REDACTED] was provided a follow-up form with a case number. [REDACTED] was asleep during the incident and did not see or hear anything.

Insp. Gainor #1524 and Insp. Philpott #65 arrived and took charge of the investigation.

I determined the possible point of entry and exit was the garage door. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] did not give anyone permission to enter and or to take their property.

While conducting our interview with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] the Tactical and Specialist Units located (B1) [REDACTED] hidden in a bush at Santiago and Great Highway. See (E4), (E5) Statements provided by Officer Pera #958 and Sgt. Lalor #873 regarding the above listed incident. Sgt. Lalor entered the use of force in the log and notified Sgt. Kato.

A cold show was conducted and suspect [REDACTED] was positively identified by [REDACTED] as the person who was in his garage. An (E2) SFPD Cold Show Admonition was completed by Officer Rouede #974 and signed by [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] was later transported to SFGH by Medic #19 for injuries he sustained, with Officers Oshita #4112 and Guardado #395. (S1) was not located despite an intensive search. [REDACTED] was treated by attending physician [REDACTED] at SFGH.

The five separate crime scenes were established and maintained by SFPD Officers. (See attached Crime Scene Logs.) The integrity of the scene was preserved until Inspectors Gregory #986, Gee #574 of CSI responded to process the scene. All evidence was collected and booked by CSI.

While at the command post Officer Apodaca #303 interviewed (R/W2) [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] told Officer Apodaca the following: [REDACTED] was in front of his house and heard gun shots. [REDACTED] observed a male in a black jacket walking fast eastbound on Taraval Street to 47th Avenue.

Officer Chan #1886 took (E6) 15 photos of the damage to SFPD vehicle #531 at 48th/Taraval. The (E6) photos were booked at Taraval Station as evidence. Officer Chan provided me with a (E7) written statement.

At approximately 1:00 am, I exited my condo ~~to~~ to walk the dog. As I was standing on the sidewalk about to cross the street I noticed that my garage door was opening. Earlier in the night at approximately 11:00 pm, the garage doors were not operating. As the garage door was opening I observed a male pulling up the garage door from the inside. As the door reached about halfway open an individual rode a bike out of the garage. Both of the individuals were white males. The individual on the bike rode past me and headed south on the great highway. I asked "what are you doing in my garage". The individual on the bike said nothing and rode away. I was contacted by Officer Pera (by phone) concerning an Officer involved shooting in the Taraval District. I was told that the suspect had shot at the Officers, they returned fire and the suspect fled. Station units were setting up a perimeter with numerous members of the Specialist Team and Tactical Team responding. I responded to the scene. A helicopter was requested but was not available from any outside agencies. San Francisco PD no longer has an Air Unit to assist its Officers.

I arrived on scene and assumed tactical command, I was provided with a briefing concerning the incident. 3x301 Capt Tittle was on scene, I spoke to A/Sgt. Smith and we developed a plan to sweep the last known direction of the suspect- N/B 47 Th Ave from Tarava'. I then received information from Sgt. Burke that a blood trail was found at [REDACTED] PII 47 Th Ave leading up the stairs. A station unit had locked down the rear of the home and discovered the back door was kicked open. An interview with the neighbor revealed that the resident: [REDACTED] ID was on vacation and the rear door should be closed /locked.

A skirmish line was established and a protective sweep of the [REDACTED] PII block of 47 Th Ave was conducted. A new perimeter was established around [REDACTED] PII 47 Th Ave. A plan was developed and 3X301 Capt Tittle was briefed. Due to the blood trail leading to the house, the open rear door, and the need to conduct a well being check on the resident, [REDACTED] PII, the well being of the possible wounded suspect an entry into the home was authorized. Lt. Cota and Captain McDonagh arrived on scene and took over tactical command. Prior to the entry, Sgt. Burke and I knocked on the front door and then used a bullhorn to call out to anyone inside of the home. We did not receive a response. Members of the tactical unit along with Officer Byrne and K-9 "Roddy" conducted the search with negative results. The blood trail led N/B 47 Th Ave to Santiago and I had observed a blood mark on the corner wall.. No items were damaged during the search and Co I Officers secured the house. The back door had not been forced open just left unlocked.

The area of Santiago Street was searched for evidence, We then cleared S/B 48 Th Ave. A request was then made to search the lower Great Highway, upper Highway and the beach area. Teams were deployed to handle the searches. Sgt. Burke contacted me; he told me that he discovered a suspect hiding in the bushes on the lower Great Highway near Santiago. He then requested additional units as the suspect was failing to comply with his orders. A K-9 unit was request and an Officer with ERIW also responded. I arrived on scene from my beach location to hear numerous officers giving the suspect verbal commands. I used a car P.A. system to broadcast my orders for B- [REDACTED] ID to surrender or a K-9 unit would be deployed. I could tell that the suspect was not complying and did not see him appear from the bush area. I authorized Officer Byrne to release his K-9 "Roddy" to effect the arrest/detention of B- [REDACTED] ID. The officers on scene were in harms way as E- [REDACTED] ID was aware of their positions and the Officers were unable to see his hands to determine if he was armed. The wanted [REDACTED]

suspect in this case had used deadly force upon officers immediately as they arrived on scene. I watched as "Roddy" entered the bushes and returned with a patch of cloth. I watched as numerous units ordered B- [ID] out of the bushes and attempted to pull him out. Due to the nature of the call and his failure to comply I instructed the Officers to retreat and ordered the K-9 to be released again. This time I could see Officer Byrne holding onto "Roddy" as he struggled with the suspect. I ran to the scene as Roddy pulled B- [ID] out of the bush area. Roddy had a hold of B- [ID] shoulder area and did not let go as [ID] violently resisted. I attempted to move in and handcuff [ID] Officer Byrne yelled "that he was going for it," as he reached for his waist band area. I observed [ID] reaching with his hands into his front waistband area. Fearing that he was going for a weapon, his prior actions and the safety of my fellow officers I kicked [ID] at least 3-4 times in the arm-chest-waist area. My use of force- (kicks) caused [ID] to stop reaching into his waist and to cover up his body. He was now in a defensive position as "Roddy" kept a hold of his shoulder. This action by Roddy pinned [ID] to the ground and did not allow him to move about freely. Numerous Officers attempted to handcuff [ID] but were unable to as Roddy was still controlling the suspect. Officer Byrne (the K-9 handler) coordinated the handcuffing in a safe fashion that did not allow any officer to get hurt. [ID] was bleeding from a hand-finger wound. A 408 was ordered for [ID] immediately. Officers on scene conducted a secondary search of [ID] for weapons and additional wounds.

A search of the immediate brush area under [ID] was conducted and Officer Garden #404 recovered a black semi auto pistol on top of the dirt. During the struggle with the K-9, [ID] had his black jacket and Black baseball cap pulled off his person. I noticed that B- [ID] had a bleeding hand wound and marks around his shoulder area. The black jacket had a lot of blood around the sleeve/cuff area. The blood appeared to be soaked into the jacket, not fresh blood from a bite wound.

Lt. Cota arrived on scene, I notified him immediately of my use of force and the bite by K-9 "Roddy" on the suspect. A/Lt. Kato was also notified. The suspect was transported for treatment of his injuries.

The following Officer's were on scene during the arrest: O'Brien, O'Leary, Lozano, Garden, Pera, Byrne and Sgt. Burke. Other Officers arrived during the arrest-handcuffing. The evidence was processed and recovered by CSI. The Homicide inspectors were notified of the events. We conducted additional searches in the area for suspects and evidence. I conducted a use of force investigation on scene and did not discover any additional witnesses. I determined that the suspect's actions caused injury to himself and only the force necessary to effect the arrest was used. I responded to Co. I and completed a use of force entry for Officer Byrne, K-9 -Roddy and myself. It was determined that [ID] may have "HEP-B", a report of contact will be completed by all team members.

A copy of this statement was booked by me at Co-E and faxed to the reporting Officer. Due to the active search for an attempted murder suspect Crime logs were not completed by SOG Officers.

While working violence reduction in the Western Addition with Officer Dowke #799 we responded to Taraval and 47th street in regard to a shooting. Upon arriving I assumed Specialist Team duties. One of these duties was to search for the suspect with Sgt. Burke #2240. While searching we located a suspect, later to be identified as (B) [REDACTED] hiding inside a large bush near the intersection of The Great highway and Santiago. [REDACTED] was face down wearing a black jacket and black baseball cap. Sgt. Burke and I repeatedly gave verbal commands to [REDACTED] with negative results. [REDACTED] refused to comply with our orders or to show us his hands. Based on [REDACTED] being non-compliant, his clothing, his close proximity to the shooting, an unrecovered firearm, blood on his person and his hazardous hiding spot we determined that it was too dangerous to attempt a physical control on [REDACTED]. Officer Byrne #828 responded with his dog and detained [REDACTED] who continued to resist and refuse our verbal commands, see Officer Byrne's report. While Officer Garden #404 searched the area where [REDACTED] was hiding in the large bush he located a handgun which was partially buried, see Crime Scene Report. While working with my K9 partner "Roddy", we responded to the area of 48th and Taraval to assist with the search for a suspect who had fired numerous rounds at officers and fled the scene. While searching the area of the Great highway, I heard Sgt Burke #2240 advise that he had located a possible suspect hiding in a large bush near the intersection of 48th and Santiago. Sgt Burke was ordering the subject from the bush but the subject refused to comply. Sgt Burke continued to give the subject orders but the subject ignored them. Sgt Burke noticed that the subject matched the suspect description and he broadcast that over the radio. Officers at the scene requested that a K9 unit respond to the scene to assist with taking the subject into custody.

I responded and upon arrival, I brought my dog to the bushes where the subject was located. I noticed the subject was sitting on the ground in the bush. I ordered the subject out by stating "come out or my dog may bite you", but he refused to comply with my orders. Other officers were also shouting orders but they were also ignored. I gave my dog a bark command to show the subject that in fact there was a police dog on scene. The dog began to bark and I yelled come out or I will send the dog. The this order was also ignored.

I realized that we were in a very dangerous situation and that the subject could see the officers better then we could see him. I was completely unable to see the subjects hands. I could see that the subject was reaching his arms downward. I felt that the subject could shoot and kill any of the officers before we could even see a gun.

I heard Sgt Laylor #874 order me to send the dog. I gave my dog a bite command and sent him into the bush. The dog entered the bush, made his way through the thick branches and bit the subject on his upper torso. I had a 15 foot long leash on the dog. With the leash, I attempted to pull the subject from the bushes while the dog was on the bite but when I pulled, the subjects jacket tore and the dog came out of the bushes with the torn piece of jacket in his mouth. Sgt Laylor then ordered that the dog be sent back in. I again gave the dog a bite command and sent him back into the bush. The dog bit the subject once and held on. I was then able to pull the subject from the bushes and into a grassy area and while doing so, I watched the subject reach towards his waistline with his left hand. I thought he was reaching for a gun and I shouted "he is going for it". At this time, Sgt Laylor stepped up to the subject and kicked his arm away from his waistline.

Numerous officers surrounded him to take him into custody. The subject began to struggle with the dog and it appeared to he that he was trying to roll over. Officers then began to handcuff the subject but they were unable to cuff his right wrist while the dog was still on the bite. The officers told me of this and told me to remove the dog from the bite so he could be cuffed. I gave the dog a command to release and he did so. The subject was then handcuffed and taken into custody.

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An ambulance was called for the subject. Upon arrival, the ambulance crew began to treat the subject for his injuries. I took photographs of the subjects injuries and while doing so, I observed that the subject was bleeding from a wound on his finger. I heard the subject state that he was bit on the finger by my dog but the wound did not appear to be consistent with a dog bite injury. When the paramedics removed that subjects shirt, I noticed injuries consistent with a dog bites on the left side of the subjects back and on the subjects upper right biceps. I also noticed that the subject had what appeared to be dried blood on the front side of his pants. There was no blood on the subjects T-shirt, near the area of the dog bites. Neither the bite on his back and biceps had bled. At this time, if the dog bites had bled, the blood would still be fresh. I believed that the subject was indicating that the dog bit his finger as a way to cover up and injury sustained during the shooting.

I observed the jacket that subject was wearing and I noticed that there was a rip and a piece of material missing on the left back and that one of the wrist areas of the jacket had dried blood on it.

41300, Capt. Mcdonagh #377 and 4T201, Lt. Cota #357, who were on the scene were advised of the dog bites. Sgt Laylor advised me that he would enter the dog bites in the use of force log at Taraval Station. I made a duplicate entry in the use of force log at the Tactical Unit. I retained the photo disk for my K9 Records. I booked the original copy of this statement as evidence at Co C.

On Saturday 5/19/2007 at 01:00 hours I was on duty in full uniform working as a patrol sergeant in the Bayview District, radio call sign 3C115. I heard over PIC channel 8 that 31200 Sergeant Kato call for Tactical and Specialist Units to respond to the area of 47th Avenue and Taraval Street for an incident in which a suspect shot at uniformed officers who were investigating a burglary. I responded to the scene as a specialist sergeant. As this event unfolded and throughout the incident of trying to locate this suspect, I became aware that the suspect had left a blood trail along the path that he took in his attempt to elude the police. I personally saw some of this blood trail on the front steps, and along the wall around the front steps at [REDACTED] 47th Avenue. While looking at this blood residue, it was obvious that the blood was smeared onto the wall from the person's hand while walking up and then down the stairs. I could see that the blood was from the suspect's hand, leading me to believe that our suspect had a hand wound. I last saw the blood trail on the North facing wall of the Southwest corner building at 47th Avenue and Santiago. The blood trail seemed to indicate that the suspect fled South along the building line on the West side of the street of 47th Avenue from Taraval towards Santiago, then he went West on Santiago from 47th Avenue.

Later, in the early morning hours, Officer Pera and I were part of a squad of officers searching/walking Northbound in a skirmish line that stretched from the Lower Great Highway to Ocean Beach. Officer Phil Pera and I located a person, who was arrested as the suspect in this incident. We found the suspect hiding inside a "hedgerow" that was along the grass between the Lower Great Highway and the Upper Great Highway at Santiago. When I first encountered this suspect, I saw only about a 15 inch by 3 inch piece of nylon which turned out to be his black puffy coat, inside the underbrush of this hedgerow. As I walked inside the underbrush to investigate, I pushed on the piece of nylon, and discovered the suspect. I saw that he had covered up himself with leaves, and brush in an attempt to conceal himself. I identified myself verbally as a police officer and ordered him to come out of the brush. The suspect replied, "I'm homeless and just trying to sleep, leave me alone." At this point Officer Pera and I were probably four feet away from the suspect and both of us had our department issued weapons and flashlights on the pointed at the suspect. Officer Pera and I gave the suspect numerous commands to come out of the brush, and to show his hands. The suspect was concealing his hands under his body. His refusal of showing us his hands was a point of concerned for us for several reasons. Primarily it was an officer safety issue, because we suspected this person to be our suspect, who had shot at uniformed officers with a handgun, which still had not been recovered. It was also an issue, that this person, who was maintaining that he was only a homeless person, who was not involved in the shooting incident, refused to show his hands, which if shown, might reveal a presence of a wound, which would have further confirmed that he was the suspect that had shot at the police and fled.

For several minutes, numerous officers including Officers Phil Pera, Keith Matthews, Angel Lozano and I gave the suspect numerous commands to show his hands and crawl out of the brush. The suspect remained in his position in the brush with his hands concealed under his body.

At this point Officer O'leary suggested that we call for a SFPD Dog unit to assist in getting the suspect out of the brush and in custody. Officer Byrne and his dog arrived on scene and Officer Byrne admonished the suspect that if he didn't come out of the bushes with his hands in the air that he (Officer Byrne) was going to release the dog on him (the suspect). The suspect continued to refuse to show his hands or come out of the bushes as he was ordered to. Officer Byrne released the dog on the suspect. As the dog moved towards the suspect, barking, the suspect held up his hands in front of his face in a defensive move to protect his face, anticipating that the dog was going to bite him. Prior to the dog contacting the suspect, I could see that the suspect had dried blood on his hands, which was consistent with the blood trail of the suspect that had fled from the police. I also saw Officer Byrne's dog bite and contact the suspect by the suspect's coat. I was right on the suspect as he was taken into custody. I never saw Officer Byrne's dog bite or contact the suspect's hands. Officer Byrne's dog dragged the suspect out of the brush where he was placed into custody.

I later saw Officer Jason Garden locate and seize a semi-automatic type pistol in the dirt under where the suspect was located.

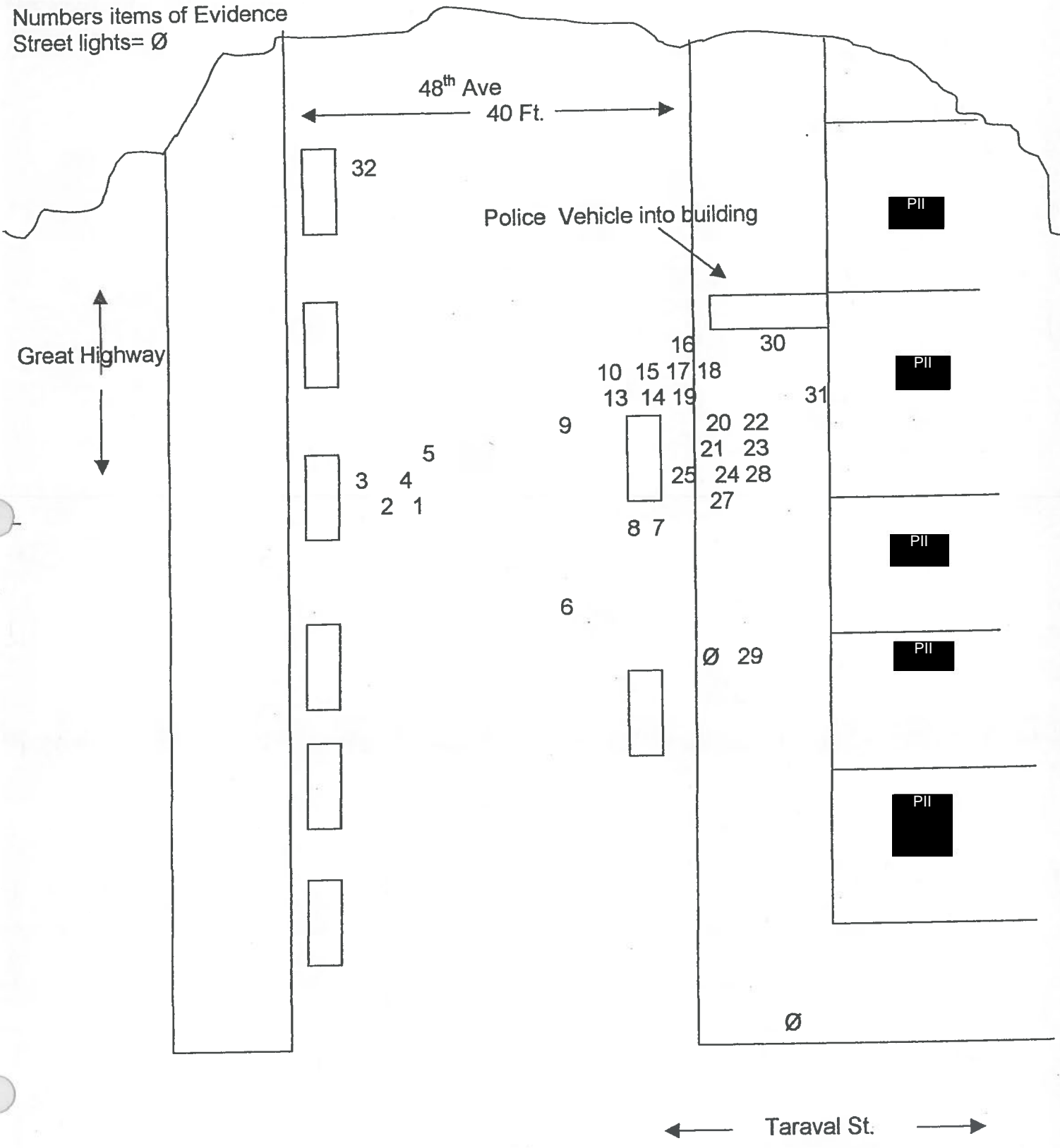

Purpose:

I was sent to the [REDACTED] PII block of 48th Ave. to investigate a shooting between a police officer and a burglary suspect. Once there I was met by Capt. Titel # 2104, who told me that two Officers were driving north on 48th Ave. in a marked police car when they spotted a burglary suspect who was riding a bicycle south on 48th Ave. The passenger officer got out of the vehicle to stop the suspect and the suspect rode his bike up onto the sidewalk to avoid the officers. The suspect then started shooting at the officers and hitting the police vehicle three times around the right front passenger door. The passenger officer returned fire and shots were exchanged between one officer and the suspect. The suspect was able to flee south on 48th Ave. and east on Taraval St.

Scene Description:

At the time that I arrived it was dark and the main source of light was streetlights in the area. The weather was clear at ground level and very cool with moist air from the ocean, which was only across the Great Highway. The actual shooting occurred in front of [REDACTED] PII and [REDACTED] PII 48th Ave. where the police vehicle had driven into the driveway and came to rest in front of [REDACTED] PII 48th Ave, after striking the building head on. I could see what looked like three bullet holes into the front right door of the vehicle and there was damage to the right outside rearview mirror. A green Nissan van (Calif. Lic. # [REDACTED] PII) was parked facing north in front on the same building. Shell casings littered the area around the van, with 9mm shell casings found in the area in front of the van and on the sidewalk next to the van. Forty Cal. shell casings were found to the rear of the van and on the opposite side of the

street. The rear window of the van and the right rear window had been completely shot out. The left rear tire was flat and the left front door had a bullet hole near the bottom, going into it. The right front window had been struck by one bullet and the cone pattern on the inside of the glass indicated the bullet came from the outside of the van on the sidewalk. Above the same window can be seen an oblong channel in the metal of the roof that starts out as a shallow groove and spreads out and goes deeper into the metal until it comes to an abrupt end. This is where a bullet coming from the area of the sidewalk ricocheted off the vehicle. Also on the right front door was a thin line of blood that was running down the side of the door. A few feet away on the sidewalk were several drops of blood, which is the beginning of a trail of blood that can be followed south on 48th Ave. to Taraval St. and east on Taraval St. to 47th Ave., and then north on 47th Ave. to the intersection of 47th Ave. and Santiago St. The last signs of blood were found on the front side of the building at [PII] Santiago St.

Other items found in the area were the bike left by the suspect and a holster that had a pouch for an extra magazine in front of it. The magazine in the pouch was damaged and may have been struck by a bullet. The floor plate of the magazine and the spring was found in front of the van on the street (items 9 and 10 in the drawing). The magazine still had the follower and 14 9 mm rounds in it along with some small shavings of lead that were found in the magazine pouch of the holster. There was also damage to the garage door on [PII] 48th Ave. about an inch from the bottom where a bullet entered and was lodged in the wood. This bullet came from the street and was not removed at this time because of the damage removing it would do to the garage door.

While working on the scene I was called to the intersection of Great Highway and Santiago St. to do a GSR test on a suspect who had been taken into custody at the location. An Officer using a dog had located [ID] [ID] hiding in the bushes; [ID] had refused to come out of the bushes and had been bitten by a police dog prior to being brought out of the bushes by the officers. At the time I did the GSR test, [ID] was in an ambulance. He had blood on both hands and both hands were dirty and had sand on them. A Beretta 92 FS was also located in the bushes where [ID] was found. After the area was photographed I collected the gun.

While I collected all the evidence at the main scene and booked it, later several officers from the CSI unit also arrived and collected evidence or helped with packaging at a later time. Inspector Gee # 574 processed the original burglary scene. Officer Sweeney # 605 arrived and collected samples of the blood trail from 48th Ave. and Taraval St. and east on Taraval St. to 47th Ave., and then north on 47th Ave. to the intersection of 47th Ave. and Santiago St. Inspector Ganster # 1830, Officers Schmidt #1334 and Phillips #1637 also arrived and tried to develop a print on a painted stucco wall on the outside wall of the stairway at [PII] 47th Ave. This was done with negative results. A search of the of the area from [PII] Santiago St. west to where [ID] was found in bushes on the Great Highway was made by Officers Schmidt and Phillips looking for any signs of a blood trail that might have been missed at night. This search produced negative results.

D.A Eliot Beckleman called me after I left the scene and told me he had been listening to the interviews with the Officers involved and that they had mentioned seeing flashes on the street as if bullets had ricocheted off the street. He asked if I had any bullet fragments. I told him that I did have some, and he asked me to go back to the scene and see if I could locate more. I did return to the scene right away with Inspector Ganster, Officers Schmidt, Sweeney and Phillips. We made a second search of the scene and extended that search out even farther and located one piece of lead in front of [PII] 48th Ave. near the west curb. We also located possible damage to the front of the building that may have been made by bullets near the north side drain pipe about 7 feet up the wall.

Later the same morning Inspector Gaynor #1524 called me asked that we go back to Taraval St. between 48th Ave. and 47th Ave. and search the sidewalk and street on the north of Taraval St looking for a 40 Cal cartridge that one of the officers may have ejected from his gun. This search was made right away by officer Sweeney and Schmidt with negative results.

On Sunday morning 5/20/07 at about 7:30 I was contacted by Inspector Gaynor. He asked that we make a further search of the 47th Ave. and Santiago St for any more signs of blood. All the previous officers responded and we extended the search by one block in each direction going north on 47th Ave. to Rivera St. and east on Santiago St one block with negative results.

PURPOSE OF EXAMINATION

The purpose of this examination was to conduct genetic analysis on the blood swabs (Item #14) and compare results with the submitted reference sample from [REDACTED] ID (Item #4).

RESULTS OF EXAMINATION

Biological Evaluation

Blood swabs and control swabs from sidewalk

The blood swabs (Item #14A-1 and Item #14A-2) consisted of intact cotton tipped applicators with red stains; these stains tested positive in a presumptive chemical test for blood. The control swabs (Item #14B-1 and Item #14B-2) consisted of intact cotton tipped applicators with grayish-black stains; the control swab (Item #14B-1) tested negative in a presumptive chemical test for blood. A portion of each blood swab (Item #14A-1 and Item #14A-2) and control swab (Item #14B-1) was sampled for genetic analysis.

Item #14B-2 was not examined at this time.

Blood swabs and control swabs from right side of Nissan

The blood swabs (Item #14C-1 and Item #14C-2) consisted of intact cotton tipped applicators with red stains; these stains tested positive in a presumptive chemical test for blood. The control swabs (Item #14E-1 and Item #14E-2) consisted of intact cotton tipped applicators with brownish-black stains; the control swab (Item #14E-1) tested negative in a presumptive chemical test for blood. A portion of each blood swab (Item #14C-1 and #14C-2) and control swab (Item #14E-1) was sampled for genetic analysis.

Item #14E-2 was not examined at this time.

Water control swab

The water control swabs (Item #14D-1 and Item #14D-2) consisted of intact cotton tipped applicators with no visible stains. A portion of the water control swab (Item #14D-1) was sampled for genetic analysis.

Item #14D-2 was not examined at this time.

Item #4-2, Item #4-3 and Item #4-4 were not examined at this time.

Genetic Analysis

The **blood swabs** (Items #14A-1, #14A-2, #14C-1 and #14C-2), **control swabs** (Items #14B-1 and #14E-1) and **water control swab** (Item #14D-1) were subjected to a DNA extraction process. Subsequently, the reference sample (Item #4-1) was subjected to a DNA extraction process. All samples were amplified and typed using the AmpFISTR Profiler Plus DNA typing system. Genetic analysis results indicate that no DNA was detected on the control swab taken from the sidewalk (Item #14B-1).

Genetic analysis results indicate that DNA from a single male donor was detected from the blood swabs taken from the sidewalk (Item #14A-1 and Item #14A-2). This DNA profile is the same as [REDACTED] ID DNA profile (Item #4-1). Therefore, [REDACTED] ID is included as a possible source of the blood on the sidewalk (Item #14A-1 and Item #14A-2).

Blood swabs and control swab from right side of Nissan

Genetic analysis results indicate that no DNA was detected from the control swab taken from the right side of the Nissan (Item #14E-1).

Genetic analysis results indicate that the same single male donor detected on the blood swabs from the sidewalk (Item #14A-1 and Item #14A-2) was also detected on the blood swabs taken from the right side of the Nissan (Item #14C-1 and Item #14C-2). This DNA profile is the same as [REDACTED] ID DNA profile (Item #4-1). Therefore, [REDACTED] ID is included as a possible donor of the blood on the right side of the Nissan (Item #14C-1 and Item #14C-2).

DNA STATISTICS

The probability that a random unrelated individual, by chance, would possess the same DNA profile as that detected from the blood on the sidewalk and the blood from the Nissan is approximately 1 in 106 trillion for US Caucasians, 1 in 6.9 trillion for African Americans, 1 in 361 trillion for California Hispanics, and 1 in 409 trillion for the general Asian population.

Attempted murder charges for suspect in officer shootout

(05-22) 17:14 PDT SAN FRANCISCO -- A man who San Francisco police say opened fire on two officers responding to a reported bicycle theft over the weekend was charged today with two counts of attempted murder.

Francisco Valle, 50, also faces felony burglary and firearms charges, and if convicted could spend life in prison. He was arraigned today in San Francisco Superior Court, where bail was set at \$1 million. He remains in custody.

Police say they received a call early Saturday from a resident on the 2000 block of the Great Highway who reported that a man was in the building's garage stealing a bicycle. When officers arrived at the scene, they spotted the suspect on the bicycle and confronted him, according to police accounts. Police say the suspect fired at the officers and missed, but hit their patrol car. One of the officers returned fire, hitting Valle, who then fled. He was found later hiding in some bushes at Santiago Street and the Great Highway, according to police.

Valle was treated for minor injuries. The two officers also sustained minor injuries when they dove for cover.

Valle, who police say lived in San Francisco and Daly City, is scheduled to return to court Thursday to enter a plea.

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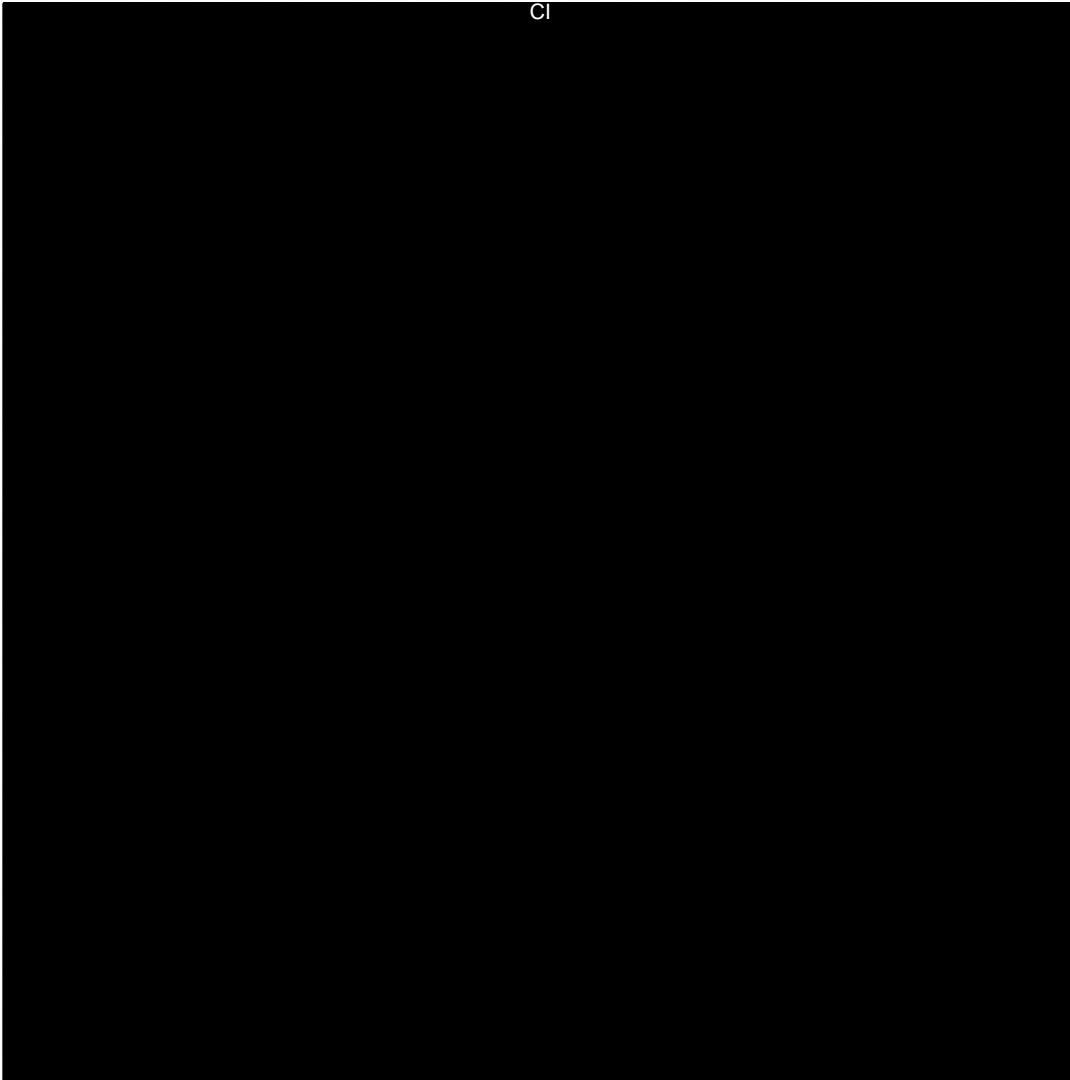

The man saw them and immediately went up onto the sidewalk. Ofc. Cravalho, who was in the passenger seat with the window down, asked the man to stop so they could talk to him, but the man took off S/B down the sidewalk. Ofc. Morgado put the car in reverse and caught up with the man. Again, Ofc. Cravalho ordered the man to stop. The man got off the bike and ran. Ofc. Cravalho got out of the radio car and gave chase on foot. The man ran behind a parked minivan. Ofc. Cravalho approached the minivan from the rear with his service revolver at low ready. He saw the man crouched near the front of the minivan.

The suspect did not see Ofc. Cravalho. He appeared to be focused on the patrol car. As Ofc. Morgado drove the patrol car up onto the curb in front of the minivan, facing W/B, the man stood up, raised a gun and "lit up" the patrol car with gunfire. Ofc. Cravalho called out shots fired on the radio and the man looked around with a look of "What the f...k?" and came at Ofc. Cravalho with his gun pointed at him. Ofc. Cravalho fired several shots at the suspect, shattering the windows of the minivan. As the suspect drew closer, Officer injuring his knees and cutting arms on the broken glass from the minivan's shattered windows. The suspect stood right over him and Ofc. Cravalho though he would

shot, but the suspect just stood there. Ofc. Carvalho got up, ran across the street and jumped over the hood of a parked car, where he saw his partner hiding behind the car. He reloaded, looked up, saw the suspect running off and gave chase, but the suspect got away. He heard sirens approaching. He decided to stop running after the suspect because he did not want to get ambushed, so he waited and set up a perimeter until the other officers arrived.

Officer Cravalho later learned that, when the suspect shot at Ofc. Morgado in the patrol car, Ofc. Morgado got out and ran for cover across the street, and that he was also injured when he dove for cover. Ofc. Cravalho also learned later that one of his shots had struck and disabled the suspects magazine, causing his gun to malfunction, which probably saved Ofc. Cravalho's life.

It should be noted that the complainant was not interviewed. I spoke to him several times (he is in PII facing charges in this matter.) I advised him he should not speak to OCC until he has consulted with his attorney. I spoke to his attorney, Jonathan McDougall, PII, who advised me he declined to have his client speak to OCC pending his criminal trial.

Recommended finding:

UF for discharging a weapon: (Ofc. Dennis Cravalho #1783) the complainant stated the officers fired at him for no reason. the investigation proved the officer fired when the complainant fired upon the patrol car and turned the weapon on the officer. The officer's conduct was lawful, proper, an necessary. **Proper Conduct.**

3 or he had to lift his jacket up or what happened?
4 MORGADO: His jacket was unzipped.
5 GAN: Okay.
6 MORGADO: From what I remember 'cause I remember seeing him
7 with his- when he went up and then came back down and then came
8 back up with a gun, I saw it was open.
9 GAN: You know what kind of jacket it was?
10 MORGADO: No.
11 GAN: You know what color it was?
12 MORGADO: It was black.
13 GAN: Was it like a windbreaker or a thin jacket or like a
14 down jacket?
15 MORGADO: It wasn't a down jacket. It wasn't one of those
16 puffy jackets. It was -it just looked like a regular black
17 jacket. Like it came down to the waist area.
18 GAN: Okay. All right. So, he comes out with what kind of
19 gun?
20 MORGADO: Ah, it looked like a handgun. And ah, to be
21 honest with you, I don't know what type of gun. I didn't see the
22 gun that closely.
23 GAN: Okay. And where exactly are you when you saw the gun?
24 MORGADO: I'm in the vehicle.
25 GAN: Uh huh.
26 MORGADO: Coming around the front end of the van.
27 GAN: So, you're pulling up to the sidewalk?
28 MORGADO: Right.

1 GAN: Okay. Then what happened?

2 MORGADO: Ah, when he- the guy comes up, he points the gun
3 at me. Starts taking rounds off at the car.

4 GAN: While you're in the car?

5 MORGADO: While I'm in the car.

6 GAN: Did you hear the car get hit?

7 MORGADO: I heard the car -something get hit. I didn't know
8 if it was the car. My car, I didn't know.

9 GAN: You heard some kind of bullets [unintelligible].

10 MORGADO: Right. And the windows were down and I actually
11 heard a bullet go by.

12 GAN: Was this guy looking right at you when he was doing
13 it?

14 MORGADO: He was -yeah. He was-

15 GAN: Pointing right at you?

16 MORGADO: Pointing right at me and shooting right at me.

17 GAN: Okay. Do you know how many times he fired at that
18 point?

19 MORGADO: At that point, he had to have let off at least
20 five rounds.

21 GAN: Okay.

22 MORGADO: Um, 'cause I - I could hear it go, you know, pop,
23 pop, pop, pop, pop. And he just kept on shooting. Um, when- at
24 that time, when the shots were going, like I said, I tried to put
25 it into park and the last thing I remember was the car was still
26 going and I said, forget this, opened up the door and bailed out.

27 GAN: Okay so let's clear it up right up now so I don't
28 forget. You came back and got the keys eventually, right?

1 MORGADO: Yeah.

2 GAN: Did you just put the car into park and get the keys
3 out?

4 MORGADO: I don't remember. I don't remember.

5 GAN: Okay. All right. Then let's go back. So, now you're
6 -you're getting out of your car.

7 MORGADO: Um hmm.

8 GAN: Okay. What -what happened next?

9 MORGADO: I- I hit the pavement. Um, and then I just
10 thought I- I stayed low to the ground and I did like a crawl-
11 running motion on the ground, you know, my feet up but my hands
12 on the ground and still just low to the ground.

13 GAN: Uh huh.

14 MORGADO: And as I'm trying to go across, I can see a couple
15 of bullets hit the pavement.

16 GAN: So, rounds are still being fired at you?

17 MORGADO: Yeah.

18 GAN: Okay. All right. Then what happened?

19 MORGADO: And I heard- I heard Dennis shooting because his
20 gun was louder. And -

21 GAN: Let me ask you a question. So, you heard the
22 different sound of the firearm?

23 MORGADO: Yes.

24 GAN: Okay. When - when was the first time you heard what
25 you believed were sounds of Dennis' gun being fired? Where were
26 you at?

27 MORGADO: When I hit the pavement the first time, ah, that's
28 when I heard Dennis' gun go off. When I -when I opened up the

1 door and hit the pavement.

2 GAN: So, after you got out of the car and hit the pavement-

3 MORGADO: Yeah.

4 GAN: You hear-

5 MORGADO: That's when I heard Dennis' gun go off.

6 GAN: Okay. Ah, and you heard -and you saw something

7 striking the ground?

8 MORGADO: Yeah.

9 GAN: And do you know whose rounds those were by any chance

10 by the sound?

11 MORGADO: Well, I saw the rounds hitting the ground when I

12 was across, like almost across the street. I was in the middle

13 of the street crawling.

14 GAN: Oh, okay.

15 MORGADO: And so they were -when I was going across the

16 street, I felt the rounds come- a couple of rounds hit the ground

17 next to me.

18 GAN: When you're getting out of the car, you're crawling on

19 the pavement and eventually you make it across the street to the

20 car?

21 MORGADO: Right.

22 GAN: How long did that take for that to occur?

23 MORGADO: Seconds.

24 GAN: Okay. Now you get across the street. And when you

25 get across -while you're moving across the street, do you still

26 hear shots being fired?

27 MORGADO: Yes.

28 GAN: Okay. Now you're at the back of the car or in front

1 of the car?

2 MORGADO: I'm at the front of the wheel.

3 GAN: Oh, by the engine block.

4 MORGADO: Right.

5 GAN: That's right, I'm sorry. And you still hear gunshots,
6 from both different sounds of the guns?

7 MORGADO: From both guns, yeah.

8 GAN: Okay. Then what happens next?

9 MORGADO: Ah, I hear Dennis' gun go dry and I hear him still
10 pulling the trigger and it was going, click, click, click, click.

11 GAN: And how do you know it was Dennis' gun?

12 MORGADO: Because -well, I kinda figured it was him. I
13 don't know for sure if it was his.

14 GAN: Well let's put- let me ask you another question. You
15 hear the click. Do you hear any sounds of the other gun?

16 MORGADO: I hear his -no. Well, I hear a couple gunshots
17 still going off.

18 GAN: From the other gun? Not Dennis' gun?

19 MORGADO: Right. What I thought was the other gun because
20 it was a lower - a lower gunshot.

21 GAN: Right. And that's after you heard some clicks from
22 Dennis' gun?

23 MORGADO: Right.

24 GAN: Okay. Or you heard some clicks going. It could be
25 Dennis' gun.

26 MORGADO: It could be Dennis' gun, right.

27 GAN: Yeah, but you did hear some firing of the gun with a
28 different sound than what you believe was Dennis' gun.

1 MORGADO: Right.

2 GAN: Okay. And [unintelligible] because -I'm assuming the
3 first round you heard that -when you first pulled in front of
4 that suspect, is what you believe was the suspect's weapon being
5 fired?

6 MORGADO: Right.

7 GAN: So, you heard that sound-

8 MORGADO: Right.

9 GAN: And you heard another sound that you believe was-

10 MORGADO: Dennis.

11 GAN: So that's how we know what sounds we're talking about.

12 MORGADO: Right.

13 GAN: Okay. So you're at the car, ah, you hear a couple
14 more, at least a couple more that we know of the other gun being
15 fired.

16 MORGADO: Um hmm.

17 GAN: And then what happened?

18 MORGADO: I heard Dennis yelling something. Um, I don't
19 know what he was saying at that point. I said, Dennis, take
20 cover, take cover. And ah, I didn't know where he was at that
21 time. I knew he was off to the right-hand side somewhere because
22 of I dropped him off but I didn't know if he was still up at that
23 van or if he was back further. I had no idea where he was at.
24 Ah, [unintelligible] and I see him, you know, that first sight
25 was behind the vehicle where I was at.

26 GAN: Okay. And you guys ask- he says, are you okay?

27 MORGADO: Right.

28 GAN: Have you been shot, something to that effect.

1 MORGADO: Right.

2 GAN: Um, now -okay. Okay. Um, you know when you're
3 crawling along in the car and- and you were across the street and
4 something ricochets of the ground-

5 MORGADO: I was in the middle of the street.

6 GAN: You're in the middle of the street.

7 MORGADO: Yeah.

8 GAN: And which way were those going? Could you tell where
9 they were going?

10 MORGADO: They were going toward me 'cause they- when they
11 were hitting, I could see the red- you know, the ah, spark off
12 the cement up and over. In front of me.

13 GAN: Was it hitting the street?

14 MORGADO: They were hitting the street.

15 GAN: They were hitting the street.

16 MORGADO: Yeah.

17 GAN: So, where do you believe those were coming from?

18 MORGADO: Ah, I - I don't know. I - I believe it was the
19 guy shooting at me still.

20 GAN: Okay, well let's do this, like kind of what direction,
21 we're talking about. I'll draw this out. Here's Taraval.

22 MORGADO: Um hmm.

23 GAN: Here's 48th. Here's lower Great. So, you went what?
24 North up here, right?

25 MORGADO: No. Down here.

26 GAN: I can draw in that minivan.

27 MORGADO: Minivan was about here. I don't know. I think it
28 was like three or four out.

1 GAN: Yeah. Yeah. It's all parking here. Ah, and then the
2 car you were behind about?

3 MORGADO: Directly across.

4 GAN: Okay. Then do a line with an arrow in which way you
5 think those ricochets were going.

6 MORGADO: The ricochets were coming this way. And I think-
7 'cause when I was crawling, I got out here and I came straight
8 this way like this.

9 GAN: And put a little "x" where you were at on that car.

10 MORGADO: On the corner there.

11 GAN: Yeah. Okay. Kinda like a -

12 MORGADO: Yeah.

13 GAN: Okay. Ah, okay so, [unintelligible]. From the time
14 it took you - at the- when you got behind that car across the
15 street, behind the engine block, how long was it before your
16 partner got behind the car with you?

17 MORGADO: Um, I mean if -it was pretty quick.

18 GAN: Um hmm.

19 MORGADO: Ah, maybe, you know, five seconds. It was pretty
20 quick.

21 GAN: Okay. It was fairly quick.

22 MORGADO: Yeah. Everything happened really quick.

23 GAN: We're not talking minutes here. We're talking-

24 MORGADO: Yeah.

25 GAN: Because everything is moving fast.

26 MORGADO: Right.

27 GAN: Okay. So, you guys get behind a car. You guys both
28 check to make sure each other is okay.

1 MORGADO: Right.

2 GAN: Um, then what happened?

3 MORGADO: Um, Dennis says- he's running. I get up and he
4 was still fumbling um, with his gun. I think he was doing a
5 reload.

6 GAN: Dennis was.

7 MORGADO: Dennis was.

8 GAN: Okay.

9 MORGADO: Um, I look up over, I don't see anybody here and I
10 don't see anybody running northbound. Um, and then the- this car
11 was obstructing some of my view this way.

12 GAN: That car he was behind.

13 MORGADO: Was behind.

14 GAN: Yeah.

15 MORGADO: Couldn't really see this way. And then Dennis
16 starts yelling, he's running up Taraval, running up Taraval. Um,
17 automatically- after he says that, Dennis takes off running.

18 GAN: Okay.

19 MORGADO: This way in front- from the back of the vehicle
20 this way, up to Taraval.

21 GAN: Okay.

22 MORGADO: And then eastbound Taraval.

23 GAN: And what do you do?

24 MORGADO: I look over and I see Dennis' two magazines.

25 GAN: And where are they at?

26 MORGADO: They're on the - they're right by the tire on the
27 curb behind the ah, vehicle on this side.

28 GAN: On the ah, on the curb side of the-

1 MORGADO: On the curb side of this vehicle.

2 GAN: That's where he had two magazines on the ground?

3 MORGADO: Two magazines on the ground.

4 GAN: Okay.

5 MORGADO: I grabbed them, look at them- one is still full.

6 The other one it appeared to be empty.

7 GAN: Um hmm.

8 MORGADO: Um, at that time, I thought he maybe holstered an

9 empty mag. So, I grabbed his- I grabbed both magazines. After

10 that, ran back to the car, grabbed the keys and then ran - ran in

11 front of this car this way.

12 GAN: In front of that minivan?

13 MORGADO: Yeah.

14 GAN: Okay.

15 MORGADO: Looked back, saw that this car was all shot out,

16 the windows.

17 GAN: Okay.

18 MORGADO: Um, kept running and then I see Dennis up at 47th

19 when I'm turning the- turning the corner and then I'd say about

20 fifty feet in, I spot Dennis up at 47th.

21 GAN: At the corner of 47th and-

22 MORGADO: At the corner of 47th and Taraval.

23 GAN: And Taraval?

24 MORGADO: Um-

25 GAN: Was he with any other officers at the time?

26 MORGADO: Ah, yeah. When I'm - when I'm actually running, I

27 get the keys and I'm running - excuse me. When I'm running this

28 way to the car to grab the keys, a unit flies by this way.

1 GAN: Down 48th?
2 MORGADO: Down 48th to Taraval.
3 GAN: Okay.
4 MORGADO: And then they come up this way and then made a
5 left -when I rounded the corner, I see them making a left and you
6 can hear-
7 GAN: Onto 47th?
8 MORGADO: Right. And I heard Dennis, you know, screaming,
9 you know, he's got a 221, he's got a 221. And ah, so then those
10 officers took cover.
11 GAN: Do you know who those officers were?
12 MORGADO: Palma and [Hegel].
13 GAN: Okay. Okay. So now you eventually turn the corner
14 onto Taraval from 48th?
15 MORGADO: Correct.
16 GAN: Okay. And what happened then?
17 MORGADO: Um, again, I see Dennis behind a vehicle on the
18 opposite side of 47th, on the eastside of 47th, um, hugging the
19 building line and then he's calling, saying that there's a
20 suspect behind some vehicle. I don't know if he gave a
21 description of the vehicle or not but he said the guy's behind
22 the vehicle. So, then we took cover- me, Officer Palma and I
23 don't know where Hegel was at that time, take cover on the
24 westside of 47th.
25 GAN: Um hmm.
26 MORGADO: Until other officers got there and then we closed
27 down the perimeter.
28 GAN: Okay. And then what happened? I mean more units

1 arrived, I guess?

2 MORGADO: More units arrived. Um, then ah, when more units
3 arrived, they -the - the Sergeants were having people, you know,
4 shut down the corner. I know an Ingleside unit flew by me. I
5 told them to stay on the lower Great Highway and ah, Taraval.
6 And that my vehicle was there and that's where the crime scene
7 began. So, they - they - they went there and started securing
8 from what I know, my vehicle. Um, and then after that,
9 paramedics came and brought the ambulance [unintelligible].

10 GAN: Yeah, I see you have injuries on your hand.

11 MORGADO: Hands, knees and elbow.

12 GAN: Is that from getting out of the car and -

13 MORGADO: Yeah.

14 GAN: Running for your life and crawling onto safety and
15 getting cover?

16 MORGADO: Yep.

17 GAN: Okay. All right. Ah, Mike?

18 PHILPOTT: Nothing.

19 GAN: [Unintelligible]?

20 FEMALE: No.

21 GAN: Joe?

22 MALE: Nothing.

23 GAN: All right. Well, the last thing is I'm gonna show you
24 a photospread. And I'm sure you heard that, you know, somebody
25 was taken into custody. It may be the person. It may not. You
26 know how that goes. The form that you have read to everybody in
27 your life, but now you have to actually read it. If I can find
28 it. I'll do the rest. Do you recognize anybody? If you do, you

1 do. You don't, you don't.

2 MORGADO: In-between those.

3 GAN: Between three and five?

4 MORGADO: Yeah.

5 GAN: What makes you say between three and five?

6 MORGADO: 'Cause I don't remember seeing that straight of
7 hair.

8 GAN: On, like on number one?

9 MORGADO: Yeah.

10 GAN: Okay. Going by hair, anything else?

11 MORGADO: Same color [unintelligible] he's kinda lighter.

12 GAN: A little bit lighter?

13 MORGADO: Yeah.

14 GAN: [Unintelligible].

15 MORGADO: Yeah.

16 GAN: Photograph should [unintelligible]. Okay. Can you-
17 but you're saying it's the hair?

18 MORGADO: Yeah.

19 GAN: Between three and five?

20 MORGADO: Yep.

21 GAN: All right. Just kinda like write that down on the
22 bottom. Ah, just say, recognized by - or, you know, hair or
23 however you want to say it and then sign your name to it. Okay.
24 And go ahead and sign the ah, this drawing [unintelligible].
25 Okay. Anything else? Anything else you want to add or anything
26 or anything you think I forgot to ask or-?

8 SR. INV. DENNIS MAXON: All right. This interview is
9 regarding OCC Case Number 0662-08. It's taking place on June
10 18th, 2009 at the OCC. It is about five minutes after 12:00.
11 Conducting the interview is Senior Investigator Dennis Maxon.
12 Also [unintelligible]. The member being interviewed is Officer
13 Dennis Cravalho, Star Number-

14 OFC. DENNIS CRAVALHO: 1783.

15 SR. INV. MAXON: Okay. And his attorney is?

16 ATTY LIDIA STIGLICH: Lidia Stiglich.

17 SR. INV. MAXON: Officer Cravalho, have you read the
18 statement of [REDACTED] ID [REDACTED] ?

19 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I have.

20 SR. INV. MAXON: Concerning an incident at you said
21 lower Great Highway on May 19th, 2007. Have you read General
22 Order 2.08?

23 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I have.

24 SR. INV. MAXON: Have you read Rule 21, General Order
25 2.01?

26 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I have.

27 SR. INV. MAXON: Have you read Section 1(a) of General
28 Order 2.04?

1 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I have.

2 SR. INV. MAXON: Do you understand these orders?

3 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I do.

4 SR. INV. MAXON: Are you prepared to be interviewed at
5 this time?

6 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, sir.

7 SR. INV. MAXON: Here we go. So let's just start at the
8 beginning. What was your assignment that night?

9 OFC. CRAVALHO: I was the patrol over the Sunset area.

10 SR. INV. MAXON: All right, so you were in a radio car?

11 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I was in a marked patrol car.

12 SR. INV. MAXON: Marked patrol car, and you were in full
13 uniform?

14 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I was.

15 SR. INV. MAXON: Did you have a partner in your car?

16 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, I did.

17 SR. INV. MAXON: And who was that?

18 OFC. CRAVALHO: Officer Paulo Morgado.

19 SR. INV. MAXON: And who was driving?

20 OFC. CRAVALHO: He was.

21 SR. INV. MAXON: He was, okay. What brought your
22 attention to this situation?

23 OFC. CRAVALHO: We got dispatched to it via radio.

24 SR. INV. MAXON: What was the narrative of the dispatch?

25 OFC. CRAVALHO: What they stated was a burglary in process
26 out of a garage.

27 SR. INV. MAXON: And did you get a description of the
28 subject?

1 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, we did.

2 SR. INV. MAXON: And what was that?

3 OFC. CRAVALHO: It was so long ago. It was a Hispanic male-
4 dark hair, and it stated he was ridin' a bicycle.

5 SR. INV. MAXON: So what did you do?

6 OFC. CRAVALHO: Proceeded to the area that they dispatched
7 to, which was I think it was lower Great Highway, and I think at
8 the time the call came out, it was let me see--I'm trying to
9 think of the streets--go alphabetically. [I think] Taraval. He
10 was approaching Santiago from Great Highway.

11 SR. INV. MAXON: And what happened next?

12 OFC. CRAVALHO: A primary unit actually picked up the call,
13 and primary meaning they dispatched another unit to the call. We
14 actually backed them up. And we proceeded down Great Highway
15 northbound, and we were coming from I want to say Sloat.

16 SR. INV. MAXON: Right.

17 OFC. CRAVALHO: And as the dispatcher kept putting out the
18 description and direction, because they stated that I guess the
19 victim was following the suspect who broke into the garage. We
20 approached Taraval and Great Highway, and we noticed a gentleman
21 fitting the description riding his bicycle in the middle of the
22 street going southbound on lower Great Highway. He saw us. He
23 immediately went up onto the sidewalk. My window was down at the
24 time. I advised to my partner--stated I think that's him, fits
25 the description. So we pulled up alongside of him. He was on
26 the sidewalk. Asked him to stop. I said hey, can you stop? I
27 want to talk to you. Just then he took off on the bicycle still
28 up on the sidewalk going southbound. My partner put the car in

1 reverse, which we caught up to him backwards--I would say maybe
2 ten fifteen feet from Taraval. I again yelled at him. I stated
3 stop, get off the bike, I want to talk to you. He got off the
4 bike, and proceeded to run, which I thought--I immediately exited
5 my vehicle, jumped out of the car, and I came around a minivan
6 that was parked, and when I came around, he was crouched down by
7 the front tire. At this time, I already advised my dispatch
8 that I was in foot pursuit, which I thought. So when I came
9 around, I didn't know what he was doin'. I had my service
10 revolver pulled out. Stated in my dispatch that I had one at
11 gunpoint. He never knew I was behind him--never. Even--he was
12 more focused on the patrol car, so when the patrol came around,
13 and pulled into the front of the minivan, now facing westbound,
14 and kind of like [block his path] from taking off. As soon as
15 he saw that, he jumped up and just lit up the car with fire. As
16 soon as that happened, I started yellin' over the air, and I
17 returned fire, and I still remember the look he gave me, 'cause
18 he turned around, and kind of looked at me like where the "f"
19 did you come from. He never knew I got out of the car. But
20 they're saying that's pretty much what saved our lives, because
21 he actually put three bullet holes in the door, in one--in the
22 passenger door where I was sitting, and then one in the front
23 window. So thinking my partner was in the car dead, I'm yellin'
24 over the air, and I'm returning fire. Well when he turns and
25 looks at me, he stands up, or he's actually already standing up.
26 He turns around, and starts runnin' at me shooting. Not a lot
27 space between a minivan. There was no place to hide, so I
28 crouched to one knee, and I'm trying to return fire. My service

1 | revolver goes empty, which I thought. Later I found out that
2 | when I was returning fire, my finger hit the magazine release,
3 | and it released the magazine about maybe an inch or two, so it
4 | wasn't engaging, so I thought it was empty. He kept comin' at
5 | me. I kept swearing I hit him. I go for cover, as he got
6 | closer, and when I dove, I dove behind the minivan, where there
7 | was broken glass everywhere. I ended up blowin' out my knee
8 | when I landed, because I landed straight on my knee, and I ended
9 | up cutting up all of my arm, because I landed on the broken
10 | glass. He came over the top of me, and I thought he was going to
11 | shoot me, but for some reason, he didn't. I started rolling in
12 | the middle of the street. I got up and I dove over a parked car.
13 | Went sliding over the hood, came up to the other side, and when
14 | I came up to the other side, there was my partner. So I asked
15 | him if he was hit. He said no. He asked me if I was hit. I
16 | said no. I got up. I reloaded, watched him run westbound up on
17 | Taraval, so I came runnin' up behind him, as I'm screaming over
18 | the radio. Still returning fire, because he's [turnin'] at me.
19 | I see a patrol car comin' down Taraval westbound. He turns
20 | northbound onto [47th]. I come up behind, and I turn onto 47th
21 | and he's gone. And there was no way that he could've took off on
22 | me, because I was right behind him. So I'm like okay, I'm not
23 | going to get ambushed again. So I waited and set up a perimeter.
24 | Everybody came out, and I would say maybe—I was made to leave
25 | the scene, because I had blood all over me. They thought I was
26 | hit and everything. So medics came out and took me to the
27 | hospital. I heard later they found him about maybe two to three
28 | hours later. They found him hiding in some bushes, and he still

1 had the firearm on him. And they looked at it, and they said the
2 reason why he couldn't shoot me was because one of my rounds
3 actually broke the magazine that was in the firearm that he had.

4 SR. INV. MAXON: Wow! So you said that you went—dove
5 over the car. That was not the patrol car.

6 OFC. CRAVALHO: No, no it was our parked car that was across
7 the street. 'Cause for him not to get a single shot at me, I
8 was rolling in the street on Great Highway. And I rolled almost
9 all the way across the street. Luckily there wasn't any cars
10 comin', because it was late at night—about 1:00/1:30. So luckily
11 nobody took me out while they were drivin' by. But I was
12 sensible enough to get up and jump over a car. So
13 [unintelligible] alive and well, which I thought he was actually
14 in the patrol car at the time.

15 SR. INV. MAXON: So he had gotten out of the car.

16 OFC. CRAVALHO: What happened was, he had—I found out later
17 that when he started shootin' at the car, my partner fell out,
18 or jumped out, but landed on the ground? The car rolled and hit
19 the building, and he ended up doin' an army crawl with I guess
20 rounds still going off. So he was able to get up and run to the
21 other side of the street.

22 SR. INV. MAXON: That pretty much tells the story. So
23 the statement is that you came up behind him. He didn't see
24 you, but he had already started firing at the patrol car.

25 OFC. CRAVALHO: As soon as he saw a patrol car take position
26 in front of that minivan, he just popped up, and just started
27 goin' off on the patrol car. When I mean going off, I mean
28 shooting at the patrol car.

1 SR. INV. MAXON: So how many rounds do you think you
2 fired?

3 OFC. CRAVALHO: I couldn't—I couldn't even guess.

4 SR. INV. MAXON: Did you put in more than one—carry more
5 than one clip?

6 OFC. CRAVALHO: Well that was thing like I said, I thought I
7 had emptied a clip, but like I said, it disengaged about an inch
8 or so. So when I reloaded, I dropped that clip on the ground and
9 reloaded it with another magazine. I couldn't tell you. It's
10 just everything just happened so quick, that I couldn't even
11 count.

12 SR. INV. MAXON: Your weapon was functioning okay?

13 OFC. CRAVALHO: Oh yes.

14 SR. INV. MAXON: No problems.

15 OFC. CRAVALHO: No, not at all.

16 SR. INV. MAXON: Did you notice if he was wounded at
17 all? Could you see?

18 OFC. CRAVALHO: No. Could not. I mean the way that he was
19 comin' at me, I actually thought he was wearing a vest or
20 somethin', 'cause I know I hit him being that close, 'cause I
21 was at the back of the minivan. He was in the front, and with
22 nothin' between us. So it was interesting to find out later
23 where the rounds went.

24 SR. INV. MAXON: So after they—you went to the hospital,
25 what happened to you?

26 OFC. CRAVALHO: I ended up going into surgery, and I was
27 almost—I was almost out a whole year.

28 SR. INV. MAXON: That was on your knee?

1 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes.

2 SR. INV. MAXON: Did you go to Homicide that night? Did

3 they-

4 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes, they took me there that--after I was

5 released from the hospital, they took me there that same night.

6 SR. INV. MAXON: Directly to Homicide, or to the station

7 first?

8 OFC. CRAVALHO: No.

9 SR. INV. MAXON: They interviewed there?

10 OFC. CRAVALHO: Yes.

11 SR. INV. MAXON: All right. I think that about covers my

12 questions. I don't think I really have anything else. Counselor

13 do you have anything?

14 ATTY STIGLICH: No.

15 SR. INV. MAXON: This concludes the interview at 12:17.

16 Thank you very much, Officer.

17 OFC. CRAVALHO: Thank you.
