

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
SDC FY21 Q1 Results


- 100% Classification Rate
 - 0 of 1,117 CDS Trackable Apps not classified
 - FIRA, SOTA, and PERA accounted for 81.2% of Apps.
- Consequence Delivery in FY20 Q1 /FY21 Q1 Comparison



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Post-apprehension Indicators





Avg App per Recidivist

- FY20 Q1 FY21 Q1 Comparison
 - Primary Outcome Indicator Recidivism Rate
 - Displacement % increased, 14% in FY20 Q1 vs. 16% in FY21 Q1



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Performance Measurement

- 100% CDS implementation.
- Recidivism rate through the application of more effective and efficient consequences.
 - 23.5% in FY20 Q1, vs. 9.36% in FY21 Q1
- The average number of times a recidivist is apprehended.
 - 2.44 avg. apps in FY20 Q1, vs. 2.28 avg apps in FY21 Q1
- The percentage of apprehensions of deportable subjects that result in the application of the most effective and efficient consequence for each alien classification, as determined by CDS.
 - 12.62% in FY20 Q1, vs. 22.61% in FY21 Q1
- The percentage of apprehensions of deportable subjects that result in the application of the least effective and efficient consequence for each alien classification, as determined by CDS.
 - 5.07% in FY20 Q1, vs. 42.63% in FY21 Q1
- USBP Nationwide multiple year recidivist rates by quarter.

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Conclusions

- SDC FY21 Q1 Summary
 - Volume of work (CDS Trackable Apps) decreased
 - Use of VR as a percentage increased substantially
 - Use of ER and Reinstate decreased
 - Use of least effective and efficient consequence increased from 5% to 42%
 - Displacement % increased
 - Recidivism Rate decreased from 23.5% to 9.4%



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
