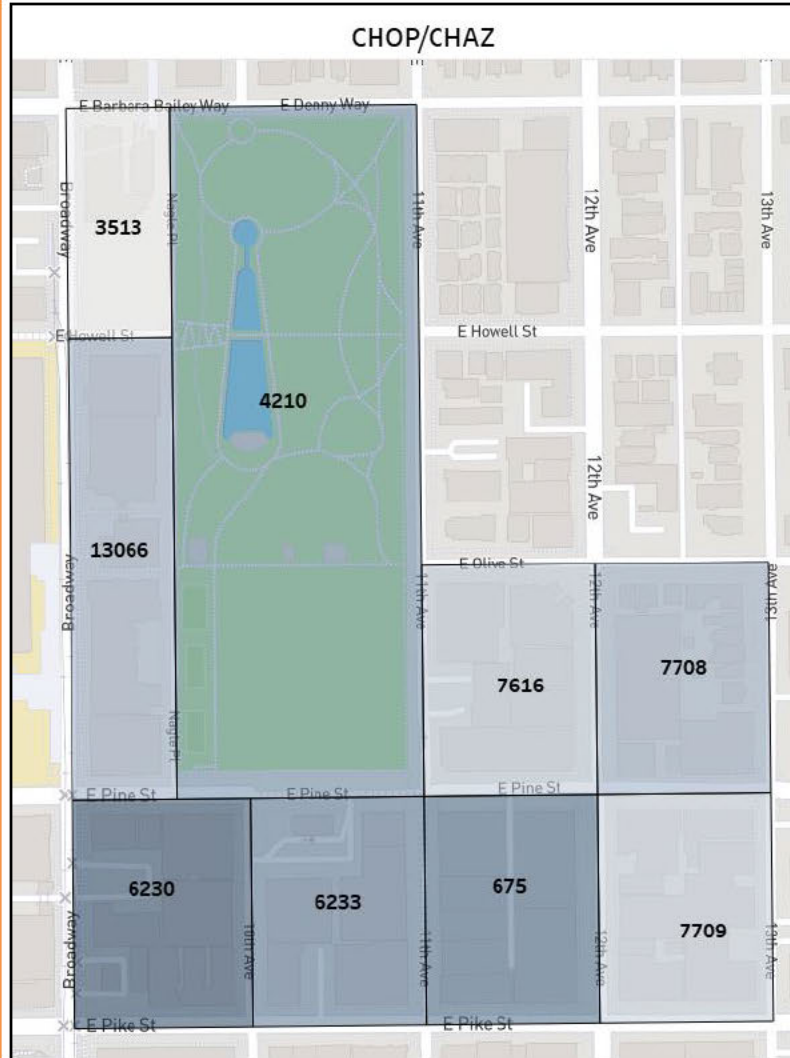

CHOP Reported Offenses (June 8-30, 2020)

This data represents National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) terminology which is the standard for law enforcement agencies. The terminology is defined by the FBI. Some of these terms are different than local codes and would not be the terms we would choose. To find out what the definitions of these terms are please see the [NIBRS manual](#).

NIBRS Offense totals are based on distinct count of Reporting Event Number by offense and do not represent the number of victims. All offense sort orders, and approval statuses are included. Counts exclude Out of Jurisdiction and unfounded offenses. Offense data is dynamic and will change based on reporting and/or investigative updates.

*Only includes reported offenses that fall within the CHOP selected census blocks. Some offenses may fall outside of these boundaries and will not be reflected in the data.





I am not sure who decided to do it, but for at least the last few months I have noticed that the Department website (<https://www.seattle.gov/police/need-help/collision>) has been referring all accidents that don't result in injuries to WSP's on-line report system (<https://fortress.wa.gov/wsp/wreccr/OMVCR/>). It would really help with the TRU load if we can have 911 call-takers refer all the Hit & Run reports we are currently taking by phone to this WSP website. Is it possible to have at least a temporary order issued for this?

Log the PEO to the call as usual and handle the call using usual policies and procedures. Send the address of the call to the PEO s telephone number listed on their unit resource in CAD via text message using Smart911.
