Re: Complaint No. 20053 - filed by Anonymous against Lt. Kathryn Waaland

Dear Sunshine Ordinance Task Force:

The San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) is in receipt of the Complaint filed by Anonymous against Lt. Kathryn Waaland for allegedly violating Administrative Code (Sunshine Ordinance), Sections 67.21 (b)(1) by failing to respond to a records request in a complete and timely manner, 67.26 withholding of records. SFPD disagrees.

SFPD received the public records request from Anonymous on October 16, 2019 (reference # P009436) requesting copies of all records created, sent, or received from Jan. 1, 2019, to present in response to SB1421 requests. (**Attachment 1**).

On November 21, 2019, SFPD received SOTF complaint no. 19124 filed by Anonymous for allegedly violating Administrative Code (Sunshine Ordinance), Sections 67.21, 67.25, 67.26, 67.27, by failing to by failing to assist in a timely or complete manner, by failing to provide a timely or complete response to a records request, by failing to provide rolling responses, by failing to withhold the minimal portion of public records, and by failing by provide written justification for withholding. On November 25, 2019, SFPD provided Anonymous with copies of all records produced by SFPD in response to SB1421 requests which were previously released to the public. On November 26, 2019, SFPD provided the corresponding letters for each record release detailing the exemptions applied to the redactions.

SFPD received a follow to public records request P009436 from Anonymous on November 27, 2019 (reference # P009975) which stated, in part, the following:

"However, you appear not to have provided copies of those records to the original requestors in a manner in accordance with the Sunshine Ordinance because you: have failed to identify a "clear reference" such as by footnote for each redaction (SFAC 67.26), excluded GPS location tags from the Bodycam footage, compressed videos to incomprehensibility thus failing to provide exact copies, and provided incomprehensible black and white copies of color photos. I will require exact copies and clear references for each redaction or withholding, as I intend to challenge your withholdings and

redactions. Please also provide an SFAC 67.21(c) statement of the existence, quantity, nature, and form of responsive records within 7 days." (Attachment 2).

SFPD provided monthly updates to Anonymous from December 9, 2019, to February 19, 2021. (Attachment 3).

Anonymous filed a Petition to the Supervisor of Records for a written determination. On August 6, 2020, the Supervisor of Records responded to Anonymous' Petition. As a determination was completed for the Petition, SFPD closed reference no. P009975. (Attachment 4).

In response to Anonymous' request for a clear reference for each redaction, SFPD is in the process of revising all productions to include an overlay exemption code to each associated redaction to all previously produced records in response to SB1421 records request. This process is ongoing. To date, SFPD produced records with overlay exemption codes for each redaction from January 29, 2019, to January 31, 2022, under the original reference no. P009436 (Attachment 5).

The SFPD submits the following supporting documents to the Sunshine Ordinance Taskforce for your consideration:

- 1. Anonymous public record request P009436 on October 26, 2019.
- 2. Anonymous public record request P009975 on November 27, 2019.
- 3. SFPD extension letters to Anonymous from December 9, 2019, to February 19, 2021.
- 4. Anonymous' Petition to the Supervisor of Records for a written determination and Supervisor of Records' response on August 6, 2020.
- 5. P009436 SFPD's productions sent to Anonymous from 2019 to 2022.

SFPD will, of course, respond to your request in compliance with the law. But, as explained below, we will face time constraints in doing so.

Prior to January 1, 2019, California Penal Code Section 832.7 protected from public disclosure peace officer personnel records and the information in those records subject to certain narrow exceptions. But on September 30, 2018, Governor Brown signed into law SB 1421, which, effective January 1, 2019, amended Section 832.7 to create additional exceptions to the confidentiality for peace officer personnel records, thus making available to the public a broad range of records that previously could not be disclosed.

These new exceptions relate to specific incidents or determinations, allowing for the public release of:

- the report, investigation, or findings regarding an officer's discharge of a firearm at a person;
- the report, investigation, or findings regarding an officer's use of force that results in death or great bodily injury;
- a sustained finding that an officer engaged in sexual assault involving a member of the public; and
- a sustained finding that an officer was dishonest directly relating to the reporting, investigation, or prosecution of a crime, or directly relating to the reporting of, or investigation of misconduct by, another officer. (See Penal Code § 832.7(b)(1)(A)-(C).)

SFPD has received a number of requests for previously confidential peace officer records made public as a result of the passage of SB 1421. Despite our best efforts to respond promptly, a backlog has quickly developed and will remain for some time.

SFPD must balance its duty to respond to public records requests with its duty to perform the broad range of tasks performed by SFPD personnel that result in keeping the peace and maintaining safety in our communities. Responding to your request will be quite burdensome and time-consuming, especially when coupled with our duty also to respond to like public records requests from others. SFPD will not be able to respond within the customary time frame without unreasonably impinging on its ability to perform its other duties.

It is in this rare circumstance that we find it necessary to invoke a rule of reason to guide the timing of our response to your public records request. As the City Attorney has stated on pages 97-98 of the *Good Government Guide*, which is available on the City Attorney's website, the law recognizes that when there is a conflict between a department's performance of its wide range of duties, and its responsibilities under public records laws, reason demands flexibility in the timing of responses to requests. Under this rule and given the SFPD's other public obligations, we will not be able to devote an unlimited amount of staff time to your request and like requests. Nevertheless we intend to provide a complete response to your request, but it will take longer than ordinarily is the case.

Over time, we expect this backlog problem to recede, and expect to be able to move more quickly on requests such as yours, particularly if the records being sought have already been reviewed in order to respond to an earlier request. We intend to provide records in response to your request, and other like requests, on a rolling basis. We anticipate providing a production of documents responsive to your request no later than Friday, January 10, 2019.

As the City Attorney has stated on pages 97-98 of the *Good Government Guide*, which is available on the City Attorney's website, the law recognizes that when there is a conflict between a department's performance of its wide range of duties, and its responsibilities under public records laws, reason demands flexibility in the timing of responses to requests. I will require exact copies and clear references for each redaction or withholding, as I intend to challenge your withholdings and redactions. Please also provide an SFAC 67.21(c) statement of the existence, quantity, nature, and form of responsive records within 7 days."

SFPD will, of course, respond to your request in compliance with the law. But, as explained below, we will face time constraints in doing so.

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These new exceptions relate to specific incidents or determinations, allowing for the public release of:

- the report, investigation, or findings regarding an officer's discharge of a firearm at a person;

Re: Petition to Supervisor of Records

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter responds to your petition to the Supervisor of Records concerning your request to the San Francisco Police Department ("SFPD") dated October 4, 2019, seeking certain police misconduct records. You requested all records SFPD had produced under SB1421. SFPD produced thousands of pages of documents and video footage with thousands of redactions on a number of bases. The department provided you a list of the legal exemptions it relied on. Your petition contests every redaction that SFPD made. Due to the extremely burdensome nature of your request and your petition, the fact that you have submitted at least 40 petitions to this office, and the local state of emergency that the Mayor declared on February 25, 2020, we have taken an extended period of time to review this petition and respond. Rather than review, summarize and address every redaction that you contest, covering thousands of pages, we are responding generally to your petition and find that SFPD properly redacted the records on the following bases:

- 1. Confidentiality of peace officer personnel records (Government Code § 6254(k), Penal Code § 832.7, 832.8);
 - 2. Privacy (Government Code § 6254(c), California Constitution Art. I, Sec. 1);
- 3. Investigative files of a local law enforcement agency (Government Code § 6254(f); Administrative Code § 67.24(d));
 - 4. Identity of informer privilege (Government Code § 6254(k), Evidence Code § 1041);
- 5. Official information privilege (Government Code § 6254(k), Evidence Code § 1040); and
- 6. Criminal offender record information and information derived from the California Law Enforcement Telecommunication System (Government Code § 6254(k), Penal Code §§ 11105, 11145, 13100 et seq.); and
- 7. Attorney-client privilege and attorney work product doctrine (Government Code §§ 6254(k), 6276.04, Evidence Code § 954, Code of Civil Procedure § 2018.030).

We decline to address your technological complaints about the way SFPD produced footage from body cameras, including the information you believe they withheld based on the file format or compression. With regard to the blurred images, we understand that SFPD

generally obscures portions of body camera footage, like faces, based on privacy, and we find that is generally proper.

Finally, we agree that the identity of individuals who made public records requests is not private and should be produced if it has not been already. Home addresses, personal email addresses, and personal phone numbers may be withheld based on privacy.

On Nov. 20 you received an SFAC 67.21(d) petition from this email address re: an Oct. 4 request from us to SFPD for certain police misconduct records. At the time I alleged that SFPD was simply refusing to provide us any records; that is no longer the case, and we have received on Nov. 25 the beginning of a rolling records response. We now allege instead that public records or parts of records are being improperly withheld.

You may consider the Nov. 20 petition from this email address withdrawn, and consider this a new SFAC 67.21(d) petition for a written determination that all or some of the following parts of records are public and for all associated orders to disclose. We will continue to pursue before the SOTF in 19124 Anonymous v. Scott et al., instead of before you, an SFAC 67.25 violation for SFPD's refusal to (prior to our complaint) provide rolling responses.

SFPD on Nov. 25 published 85 records online on "Sendgrid," with what appears to be 12 duplicates, for 73 unique records. The record names, our numbering scheme for reference, and the URLs that SFPD published are in Appendix A. You may get the records themselves from SFPD's published URLs below, or from SFPD itself, as they are too large to include in the petition and many are audio/video files that I cannot embed herein. On Nov. 26, SFPD published 41 additional documents listing general exemptions. However, since no "clear reference" is made indicating which redaction is associated with which exemption, these redactions remain unlawful under SFAC 67.26, and I still challenge all of them. Furthermore, the justification documents themselves have redactions (determination 3).

Please determine the following are public parts of records:

1. **PDF documents:** - All textual redactions in records #1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 81, 82, 83, 84 (which are all PDFs). None of these textual redactions have a clear reference to a statutory or case law exemption justifications, and are thus unlawful withholdings, and must be disclosed.

2. Bodycam footage:

a. The following parts of the original bodycam records #55-76 (inclusive): Office Name/Badge number, GPS location tags, and original timestamps. This information has been stripped from the MP4 files provided to us without any justification. From publicly available Axon documentation for the 'Body 2' cameras used, we believe this information does exist, was recorded, and must be disclosed. No justification has been provided for withholding this information. SFPD appears to store the original records in a service called

- "Evidence.com" and we would like copies of the full record stored therein (except exempt parts).
- b. The original uncompressed bodycam audio and video footage in records #55-76 (inclusive). The CPRA requires exact copies, and the Sunshine Ordinance requires minimal withholding. Some of these videos have been compressed to incomprehensibility. SFPD may lawfully redact (with justification) exempt parts of the video, but has no authority to damage the rest of the video record through compression.
- c. All "visual" redactions in records #55-76 (inclusive). There are numerous blurrings of the record. I am challenging all of them as unlawful, since none have any clear reference to justification whatsoever.
- 3. **Record response redactions** redactions in the following responses appear to withhold the identity of a records requestor, however public records requests are themselves public records
