Officer Troy Clark DSN 27073, signing this complaint under penalty of perjury or personally appearing before the undersigned District Judge and being duly sworn, states that on or about the 27 day of February, 2022 at or near 7830 Old Seward Hwy Anchorage, Alaska, Third Judicial District, the defendant, did unlawfully commit the following offense(s):

- Murder in the First Degree (direct intent): 1 count(s): AS 11.41.100 (a)(1)(A)
- Murder in the Second Degree - (intend serious injury): 1 count(s): AS 11.41.110 (a)(1)

I, Troy Clark, being first duly sworn upon oath, depose and state:

A. This Investigation: APD Case # [REDACTED]

- On 02-27-2022 at about 01:44 hours there were numerous 911 calls made from [REDACTED] Anchorage, Alaska, which is a night club/ bar. The 911 callers reported that numerous gun shots were fired from within the business. One of the callers reported additional gun shots being fired from the parking lot of the business. Some of the 911 callers then reported that someone was shot and was down, not moving, inside the business.
- The Anchorage Police Department (APD) dispatched Patrol Officers and the Anchorage Fire Department (AFD) dispatched medics to the business. When APD Officers arrived on scene they found a victim in the bar, laying on the dance floor. The victim was shot multiple times. APD also found numerous spent shell casing inside the business laying on the floor. The victim was identified as [REDACTED]
- APD Officer and AFD medics attempted life saving measures on [REDACTED] but were unsuccessful in reviving him. [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased on scene.
- Employees of [REDACTED] provided APD with video surveillance footage from cameras inside the business and cameras that showed footage of the parking lot. APD Officers and Detectives reviewed the footage from the cameras.

5. The surveillance footage from inside the business showed the suspect dancing on the dance floor. The suspect appears to wear a baseball cap, glasses, a jacket, baggie jeans and basketball type athletic shoes. At some point it appears the suspect gets in a brief altercation with an unknown person on the dance floor. It appears the suspect pulls a firearm from a pocket or waistband and fires multiple shots. The suspect runs out of the business.
6. The surveillance footage from outside the business shows patrons and employees standing around (normal night at the bar). The outside camera has a microphone. In the footage approximately five-gun shots can be heard. It appears the same suspect male can be seen walking south from the business. The suspect walks south across the parking lot and walks out of view. In about the same area an unknown SUV, possibly a Cadillac Escalade, leaves the same area. The SUV drives away at a high rate of speed, northbound on Old Seward. Detectives reviewed additional video camera footage in the area. It was determined that the vehicle that was leaving [REDACTED] was a KIA Telluride.
7. The Anchorage Traffic Engineer, Eric Armagost was contacted by detectives. Armagost has access to camera's that are attached to various traffic lights in Anchorage (traffic cam). Armagost provided traffic cam footage for the intersection at 76th and Old Seward, Old Seward and International Airport Dr, Old Seward, and Tudor, two cameras at Tudor and New Seward, Tudor and Lake Otis, Tudor and Piper, Tudor and Tudor Center Drive, and Muldoon and 32nd.
8. Detectives reviewed the traffic cam footage and "followed" the Telluride from [REDACTED] at about 01:45 hours. The Telluride went north on Old Seward and then turned east on Tudor. The Telluride then continued east on Tudor to the Muldoon curve, when it started going northbound. The Telluride can be seen turning eastbound on Williwa Av from Muldoon at about 01:54 hours.
9. At about 11:41 hours detective drove down Williwa Av to look for a Telluride that matched the description of the vehicle leaving Al's Alaska Inn. Detectives found the Telluride at [REDACTED]. The Telluride has an Alaskan Plate of [REDACTED].
10. Detectives ran the plate, [REDACTED] in APSIN (DMV) and found that it is registered to WILLIAM JAMAL GARY (D.O.B. 06/29/1985). The plate is registered to [REDACTED] and has been since 02/26/2021. GARY's name was ran in AP SIN and he list [REDACTED] as his address since 02/11/2022.
11. Detectives pulled DMV photos of GARY and compared the photos to the surveillance footage at [REDACTED]. It appears that GARY is the suspect who shot and killed [REDACTED].
12. During interviews, with the security at [REDACTED]. Detectives were told that the suspect got into the bar by showing his Pennsylvania driver's license. GARY listed Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania as his place of birth in APSIN. GARY's license status was checked in Pennsylvania. Detectives were told that GARY was issued Pennsylvania driver's license # [REDACTED] in 2012.
