

SDC FY20 Q4 Results


- 100% Classification Rate

 - FIRA, SOTA, and PERA accounted for 78.58% of Apps
- Consequence Delivery in FY19 Q4 /FY20 Q4 Comparison






Post-apprehension Indicators

- SDC trend analysis in FY20 Q4
 - Volume of work (CDS Trackable Apps) decreased
 - Use of Reinstatement increased, use of all other consequences decreased
 - Average days between re-apprehension decreased from 29-days in FY19 to 18-days in FY20
 - Use of most effective and efficient consequence increased from 7.57% in FY19 to 12.48% in FY20
 - Recidivism Rate Increased
