Dear Mr. Williams:

Thank you for your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated November 16, 2020, previously assigned to FOIA Tracking Number 2021-F-06458, which was referred to the Office of Foreign Labor Certification (OFLC). You requested documents pertaining to public records relating to how the Chicago National Processing Center (CNPC) determines whether an H-2A employer's request for a declaration of contract impossibility will be approved or denied.

OFLC Subject Matter Experts located 142 pages of which 22 pages are responsive and available for public disclosure. The majority of documents are subject to Exemption 5 of the FOIA. Under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act at 5 United States Code (USC) § 552(b)5, Exemption 5 as amended, protects the decision making processes of Government agencies, advisory opinions, recommendations and deliberations. The purpose of this privilege is to encourage open, frank discussions on matters of policy between subordinates and supervisors; to protect against premature disclosure of proposed policies before they are finally adopted; and to protect against public confusion that might result from disclosure of reason and rationales that were not in fact ultimately the ground for an agency decision. The deliberative process privilege also permits the Government to withhold "inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party in litigation with the agency.

Due to the nature of this request, OFLC has determined that the records in this partial response must be withheld. Although a few documents subject to Exemption 5 may have portions that could be released, without the heavily redacted information as well, the documents would not provide any informational value or give tangible information about the Government's proposal to modernize the H-2A Temporary (Agricultural) Labor Certification Program. Therefore, we are withholding these records pursuant to Exemption 5 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C 552(b)(5).

Partial denials or redactions represent adverse disclosure decisions. You have a right to administrative appeal **by writing** to the Solicitor of Labor within 90 days from the date of this letter. You must include the grounds for the appeal, a copy of your initial request, and any amendments thereof. You may also include supporting statements or arguments, but this is not required.
