Position Description Summary

The George Washington University Law School seeks applications for a one-year graduate fellowship, specializing in national security, cybersecurity, and foreign relations law, beginning July 1, with the possibility of renewal for a second year. The Fellow will serve as a Visiting Associate Professor of Law.

Fellows receive an annual stipend of \$65,000, health insurance, and other benefits associated with a full-time position at GW. These benefits include GW's Tuition Remission Benefit, which may provide an opportunity to complete course work as a candidate in GW degree programs such as a Master of Arts in Security Policy Studies, Master of Professional Studies in Cybersecurity Strategy and Information Management, Master of Professional Studies in Homeland Security, or GW Law LL.M.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities

The Fellow can expect to have the opportunity to teach one course per year in the fields of national security, cybersecurity, and foreign relations law, as well as to write one publishable paper each year, and would help coordinate high-level conferences, speaker series, and other scholarly, professional, and public-facing projects and events. The Fellow will also be expected to assist in the Law School's administration of the Program, including through writing promotional materials, advising students, and representing the Program at events. Minimum Qualifications

We are seeking applications from candidates who have:

- a J.D. (or equivalent international degree and U.S. LL.M.);
- published scholarship in the field or strong legal writing and research skills; and
- professional experience in national security, cybersecurity, and foreign relations law, or a comparable legal field
