Summary of actions

- DPH outreach to the Chinese community remains a top priority. Round table meeting held today with Chinese Community stakeholders, including 50 different organizations, family associations, merchants, and community leaders.
- SFDPH Department Operation Center (DOC) continues to expand to accommodate operational, logistical, and administrative needs.
- DPH Supply Unit is actively locating and securing adequate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for staff; PPE is in high demand at this time from commercial suppliers, which may impact availability and/or order turnaround time.
- Collaboration at the regional level to coordinate messaging and guidance to pre-hospital providers (aligning with Health Officers' strategies), as well as 911 dispatch screening parameters and standards.
- DPH Primary Care personnel are bringing PPE training and guidance to outpatient clinics.
- CCSF Departments outside of DPH have been working together to accommodate space, time, and staff for the DOC. Resources are being identified and made available to support the nCoV-2019 activation response
- DPH is engaging with hospital partners to coordinate placement of PUI cases and confirmed cases, develop standard protocols for transport and relocation across the city, region and the State.
- CCSF Laboratories are preparing to receive and test specimen (if needed) 7 days a week.
- 2 San Benito confirmed cases continue to be hospitalized in in San Francisco. The SF community is not at risk as proper transport and isolation techniques are being followed.

We've been corresponding for years and when I saw this post I emailed him last night. Here is his response, which he said I could share (he mentions his wife. Jody Lanard is also a risk communication expert):

Lovely to hear from you, Kathy. I thought I might. Lots of former colleagues, clients, friends, media contacts, etc. have been reaching out.

With some reluctance, Jody and I have been reaching back.

There will be more on the website in the days to come, I think. I sent my webmaster one thing today (yesterday here in Australia – but I'm keeping my thinking on NYC time), but she obviously didn't post it. I have two more things I've written but won't post till they're published or it's clear they won't be. And Jody and I have a long list of additional things we want to write/say if and when we get to them.

In spite of all that, most of what we have to say is a recycling of things we have said before. If I were going to recommend two old articles to Dr. Angell or anyone, they would be "Fear Is Spreading Faster than SARS": And So It Should! and Containment as Signal: Swine Flu Risk Miscommunication. Sadly, we may end up having need as well for What to Say When a Pandemic Looks Imminent:

Messaging for WHO Phases Four and Five, though that was written with H5N1 in mind, and the imminent coronavirus pandemic looks like it will be orders of magnitude less severe. Some of what I wrote about stigma also seems on target, especially Coping with Ebola stigma.

(It's kind of neat that the four links I thought of first as relevant to this coronavirus were from SARS, swine flu, bird flu, and Ebola.)

I'd be grateful for your thinking on what risk communication problems you're seeing this time around.

Below a broader summary I sent yesterday to a shipmate. I'd appreciate your feedback on anything I should change next time some friend asks me what I think is going on. Here it is:

In a teeny-tiny nutshell:

Thank you so much for talking today. A few quick notes from our conversation to get others up to speed (please correct or add if needed). I've added Janice and Tiffany from our Operations Section, and Kelly who has been helping us think through placement.

- Any person who is diagnosed with novel Coronavirus (nCoV) **and** meets usual criteria for acute hospital admission could be taken at ZSFG (no change)
- We discussed that for now, CDC guidance has been to admit all cases for isolation and also serial specimen collection, even if they do not meet usual clinical criteria for admission to an acute bed. Adrian will check on this, but feels given CDC guidance and the national and international public health emergency declarations, admitting an asymptomatic case should be possible if coordinated through the Administrator on Duty (AOD).
- For LHH, there are two issues (we clarified that we are NOT currently considering placing cases at LHH, only possibly persons under investigation (PUIs) while awaiting test results.
 - Most of their isolation rooms are licensed as a SNF. PUIs would not
 meet SNF licensing requirements for admission, so the CDPH Licensing
 and Certification district office would have to grant a waiver. Adrian is

Nothing hugely earth-shattering in the message. Basic ATD standard (8 CCR 5199) compliance, including:

- the selection and provision of personal protective equipment (PPE),
- training of staff on the selected PPE including proper donning and doffing technique, and
- medical qualification for respirator use and respirator fit testing, are all moving forward.

Complicated by a fast-evolving case definition its going to take a bit time, but sooner, rather than later, basic training to all front-line staff who may have initial (incoming) patient contact, not just providers, will be needed on what steps are needed when a suspect patient presents. Contents might include where (which room) etc the patient should be placed, who should be notified, and some general risk communication and hazard mitigation steps (close door to patient room, post sign, etc) specific to each facility will be needed. OSH staff who were in the PPE "train the trainer" session this afternoon indicate that clinic staff present voiced some concern about "not knowing what's going on", a common problem when you move further away from the DOC.

- Employer's plan if an exposure incident occurs and surge plan, if applicable.

Examples of engineering controls include airborne infection isolation rooms or areas, exhaust ventilation, air filtration and air disinfection. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) continues to closely monitor an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) that was initially detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China in December 2019.

This CDC Health Alert Network (HAN) Update provides a situational update and interim guidance to state and local health departments that supersedes guidance in CDC's HAN 426 distributed on January 17, 2020. It also adds

Issues Raised by Local Partners so far:

* Will there be an emergency proclamation in the state to enable reimbursement or will these costs be reimbursed outside of the Stafford Act?

Response from CalOES and CHHS was that they are unaware of any planned state emergency declaration but would be pushing the federal government hard to reimburse these costs.

* Who is issuing the quarantine order? This has implications for either the federal or local government entity. Only federal law enforcement can

- * Who is issuing the quarantine order? This has implications for either the federal or local government entity. Only federal law enforcement carenforce a federal quarantine. US Marshall would have to enforce. What will happen to folks who do not comply?
- * We are assuming that we aren't going back in time to find folks who traveled from Wuhan/Hubei in the last 14 days; is this accurate?
- * Exactly what are the required protocols for quarantining or self-quarantining? This is a daunting task with dozens of people for 14 days. This active monitoring will far exceed what was done for ebola (small numbers).
- * San Mateo commented that only 2% of those coming into SFO will stay in their county, and that they have no intent to keep these travelers in their county, there is no way to operationalize this and he will let passengers go to their desired destination.
- * Federal government should be partnering directly with local jurisdictions and providing information and answers to their questions directly.
- * There is no way to be operational so quickly, Sunday by 2 pm in California.
- * There are a lot of resources needed: phones, thermometers, masks, capacity to feed people, housing that keeps folks isolated (and apart from each other) for 14 days, staff to follow up daily with everyone, testing and care arrangements for folks who become symptomatic (yet not sick enough for hospital care), and managing close contacts of any folks who become symptomatic.
- * Staffing needs will be large, even Los Angeles, the largest county health department in the country says they are unable to operationalize this for a large number of travelers. Quarantining a large number of people will mean they are located at various sites and what is the expectation if someone becomes symptomatic?
- * Everyone believes that CDC has the best intent, but the fact is there would need to be hundred of people to conduct this type of operation, and this seems to fly in the face of everything we have been doing.
- * San Francisco said that their plan for travelers coming into their county, which is small in geographic area, would be to self-quarantine at their destination site, what they believe is a practical compromise.
- * Concerns were raised about following airport emergency plans. Given that a public health emergency has been declared, planes should arrive in an isolated area. This will be a logistical nightmare people will have vehicles at the airport and family members waiting to pick them up.
- * How will we transport folks from the airport to quarantine housing and then to medical care/testing as needed? Probably not a great idea to keep people all together.
- * Can we have guidance for schools and universities who are asking if they should be excluding students who traveled to the Hubei province in the last 14 days, and perhaps exclude those who traveled to China in the last 14 days?
- * Is there a new case definition for novel corona virus if a negative test no longer rules out novel coronavirus? Seems impossible that the definition would be someone who has traveled to Hubei (or China) and has a fever and respiratory symptoms. Can we rule out folks who test positive for a different respiratory illness? And what is the implication for identifying and active monitoring of close contacts? Are we recommending that close contacts self-quarantine for 14 days since we can never rule out a case just because their test is negative? That would be problematic for health care
- * How will notification be managed between jurisdictions if the folks who are ordered to self-quarantine take themselves to another county (where they live); LHD's currently manage these exchanges but if the feds are issuing orders, we wonder how this works?
- * How can we manage the potential for the health care system to be inundated with worried well? The implications that folks who have traveled to China in the last 14 days may be carrying the virus even if they aren't sick will increase calls to providers for testing and increase visits.
- * How are we to communicate what it means for the federal government to declare a public health emergency? We are flooded with calls asking if this means we should be telling folks to cancel public events, especially lunar new year events which attract large numbers of Chinese residents.

Three Confirmed Cases of Novel Coronavirus in California

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of Public Health has been informed that one person in Santa Clara County has tested positive for novel coronavirus 2019. This information is confirmed by the Santa Clara County Public Health Department and the U. S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention laboratory.

Currently, the California Department of Public Health confirms a total of three cases of novel

coronavirus in California: one individual in Santa Clara County, one individual in Los Angeles County and one individual in Orange County have tested positive for novel coronavirus 2019.

"It is understandable that some Californians may be nervous about potential spread of novel coronavirus, but the risk to the general public in California remains low," said Dr. Sonia Angell, California Public Health Department Director and State Health Officer. "The Department of Public Health has been closely tracking this virus and we are actively engaged with our local health departments, the CDC and local governments to make sure Californians remain safe and healthy."

At this time, no other persons infected with novel coronavirus (nCoV 2019) have been identified in California. Currently, the immediate health risk from novel coronavirus 2019 to the general public is low.

It is very important for people who have recently traveled and who become ill to notify their health care provider of their travel history. Those who have recently traveled to China or who have had contact with a person with possible novel coronavirus infection should contact their local health department or health care provider.

The Department of Public Health has been prepared and is continuing with the following actions:

- Providing information about the outbreak and how to report suspect cases to local health departments and health care providers in California.
- Coordinating with CDC personnel who are doing screening of travelers from China at SFO and LAX.
- Assuring that health care providers know how to safely manage persons with possible novel coronavirus 2019 infection.
- Supporting hospitals and local public health laboratories for collection and shipment of specimens for testing at CDC for novel coronavirus 2019.
- Activating the Department of Public Health's Emergency Operations Center to coordinate response efforts across the state.

The novel coronavirus 2019 outbreak in China continues to evolve and California is prepared for more cases that may arise. The California Department of Public Health considers this a very important public health event; we are closely monitoring the situation and providing updates to partners across the state to support their preparedness efforts.

As with any virus, especially during the flu season, the Health Department reminds you there are a number of steps you can take to protect your health and those around you:

- Washing hands with soap and water.
- Avoiding touching eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoiding close contact with people who are sick are all ways to reduce the risk of infection with a number of different viruses.
- Staying away from work, school or other people if you become sick with respiratory symptoms like fever and cough.

The California Department of Public Health will not be providing additional information about the patient beyond what is being shared by the Santa Clara County Public Health Department. For more information about nCov-2019, please visit the <u>CDPH website</u>.





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
