METHODOLOGY

This probabilistic survey was conducted April 6 - 9, 2022, with 800 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of $\pm 3.44\%$. Known registered voters were interviewed via live calls, and SMS. This survey was weighted to a likely general election voter universe.
