RE: State Assumption of the Clean Water Act 404 Permitting Program

Dear Senate Finance Committee Members,

United Fishermen of Alaska (UFA) is the statewide commercial fishing trade association, representing 37 commercial fishing organizations participating in fisheries throughout the state and the federal fisheries off Alaska's coast.

On behalf of UFA, we urge you to remove the Department of Environmental Conservation's (DEC) request for \$4.9 million in the operating budget to fund the assumption of the Clean Water Act 404 permitting program. We believe that DEC's assumption of the program threatens Alaska's wetlands and salmon rivers that support our fisheries.

Alaska's wetlands and headwater streams provide essential habitat for juvenile salmon and other important fish species. The Clean Water Act 404 permitting program authorizes the dredge and fill of wetlands and streams for development projects. While we support development and other industries in Alaska, we also must ensure that projects are developed and permitted in a way that protects critical fish habitat. We are concerned about DEC's statements regarding its desire to assume the program to streamline the permitting process and reduce enforcement and mitigation requirements. That approach can have major implications for the protection of fish habitat and our fisheries.

We are also concerned that this proposed budget appropriation is not nearly enough to fund a complicated permitting program. Only three states have assumed the 404 permitting program due to its high cost. DEC has yet to provide a feasibility study to analyze the true cost of the program to the state of Alaska, including exposure to and costs of potential lawsuits. Without that analysis, we believe it is unwise to start a program that the state may not be able to adequately administer.

Finally, it is also highly unlikely that stable funding will be available for the program over the long-term. DEC's budget cuts over the last several years have led to fewer staff and cuts to programs that protect sensitive habitat and our fisheries. Future staff cuts and budget reductions for this permitting program will inevitably lead to a streamlined approach and result in permits issued that do not protect our wetlands, rivers and salmon habitat and not be able to meet EPA's minimum standards.

UFA respectfully requests that the Senate Finance Committee remove the \$4.9 million funding appropriation for DEC to assume the Clean Water Act 404 permitting program from the operating budget.
