ORDER FOR DISMISSAL

On February 1, 2022, the Department of Health Services (Respondent) issued a Statement of Deficiency ("SOD KY9P11") that cited two regulatory violations and a Notice and Order letter that included a *Notice of Violation; Order to Comply with Requirements; Notice of Imposed Forfeiture; Notice of Right to Appeal* ("Notice and Order") to Petitioner. Pursuant to Wis. Stat § 227.42 and Wis. Admin. Code §DHS 89.59, Petitioner filed an appeal of that action.

On April 20, 2022, the Division of Hearings and Appeals received a *Stipulated Settlement Agreement* signed by both parties. The terms of that settlement agreement are incorporated by reference into this order and a copy of the agreement is attached.

Pursuant to Paragraph 9 of the *Stipulated Settlement Agreement* entered into by the parties, the above-captioned matter is DISMISSED with prejudice.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

This is a final administrative decision. You may petition for an administrative rehearing by submitting a specific written request to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 4822 Madison Yards Way, Madison, WI 53705-5400. This request must be received by the Division within 20 days of the date of this Order. The process for requesting a rehearing petition is contained in Wisconsin Statutes § 227.49. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.

APPEAL TO CIRCUIT COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be served and filed no more than 30 days after the date of this hearing decision (or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing request, if you ask for one). For purposes of appeal to circuit court, the Respondent in this matter is the Department of Health Services. Appeals must be served on the Secretary of that Department, either personally or by certified mail. The address of the Department is: 1 West Wilson Street, Room 651, Madison, Wisconsin, 53703. The process for appeals to

circuit court is in Wisconsin Statutes §§ 227.52 and 227.53. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.
