To Members of the Alaska Legislature:

On behalf of our members, and in response to numerous requests from the Legislature about the impacts on our organizations of a vote for concurrence, we share the following:

- A long-term, sustainable fiscal plan has been a decades-long legislative priority for each of our organizations
- At the beginning of this session, our organizations shared our priorities for this session with the legislature
- A concurrence vote for the Senate budget is not conducive to a long-term, sustainable fiscal plan
- A concurrence vote for the Senate budget defeats many of the legislative priorities that the businesses we represent identified
- It is not the responsibility of our organizations to be influenced by potential deals that we are unaware of that are being made between parties in Juneau
- It is the responsibility of our organizations to advocate for the policies that allow the businesses we represent to continue to operate and to advocate against the policies that harm their businesses

We hope this is helpful and appreciate your understanding of our responsibility to the businesses we work for and represent.
