JANUARY 6 WITCH HUNT COMMITTEE WAITS 16 MONTHS TO SEEK MO BROOKS' TESTIMONY

In a blatant political effort to affect whether a conservative is elected from Alabama to serve in the U.S. Senate, the Nancy Pelosi January 6 Witch Hunt Committee waited 16 months to ask Congressman Mo Brooks to testify the week of May 9, just two weeks before Alabama's Senate Primary.
