I agree that a strategic review of the management of Holyrood Park is long overdue. Even before the pandemic the park was in a shocking condition and it is obvious the costs of getting it into a proper state will be enormous. Amongst other things I suggest that it should be questioned if HES are the right body to manage it; I don't think it has the corporate mindset to cope and wonder if it ever will.

Last weekend no doubt you will have seen the BBC's article on the Radical Road; https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-scotland-edinburgh-east-fife-61321634. It seems that the press are starting to do a better job of scrutinising HES and what's happening on the ground than the Board or Parliament.
