- 4) Communications with non-governmental entities: All records exchanged between the above list of DHS officials and individuals working for or representing Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Apple, Amazon, or Google that include the following phrases or any combination of them:
- a. Mis-information
- b. Dis-information
- c. Mal-information
- d. False narrative
- e. Misleading narrative
- f. Conspiracy theories
- g. Fake news
- h. Perceived ideological opponents"

Due to the increasing number of FOIA requests received by this office, we may encounter some delay in processing your request. Consistent with 6 C.F.R.
