Dear Mr. Leopold:

This is the final response to your May 6, 2022, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Federal Protective Service (FPS). You are seeking emails, photographs, videos, memos, text messages, letters, directives, Intelligence Bulletins, suspicious activity reporting, open source intelligence and reports, Threat Assessments, and Situation Reports mentioning or referring to the Freedom/Trucker Convoy protests in the Washington, DC area.

To provide you with the greatest degree of access authorized by law, DHS has considered your request under both the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, and the Privacy Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552a. A search of DHS's FPS for documents responsive to your request produced a total of 111 pages. Two pages originated with DHS's Intelligence and Analysis (I&A) and are referred to that agency for review and direct response to you.

I have considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing the record set and have applied the FOIA exemptions as required by the statute and the Attorney General's guidance¹. I have

determined that seven pages are released in their entirety, 28 pages are withheld in full, and 74 pages are partially releasable pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(5), (b)(6), (b)(7)(A), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F), FOIA Exemptions 5, 6, 7A, 7C, 7E, and 7F.

Enclosed are 81 pages with certain information withheld as described below:

FOIA Exemption 5 protects from disclosure those inter- or intra-agency documents that are normally privileged in the civil discovery context. The three most frequently invoked privileges are the deliberative process privilege, the attorney work-product privilege, and the attorney-client privilege. After carefully reviewing the responsive documents, DHS has determined that portions of the responsive documents qualify for protection under the

- **Deliberative Process Privilege**

The deliberative process privilege protects the integrity of the deliberative or decision-making processes within the agency by exempting from mandatory disclosure opinions, conclusions, and recommendations included within inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters. The release of this internal information would discourage the expression of candid opinions and inhibit the free and frank exchange of information among agency personnel.

- **Attorney-Client Privilege**

The attorney-client privilege protects confidential communications between an attorney and his client relating to a legal matter for which the client has sought professional advice. It applies to facts divulged by a client to his attorney, and encompasses any opinions given by an attorney to his client based upon, and thus reflecting, those facts, as well as communications between attorneys that reflect client-supplied information. The attorney-client privilege is not limited to the context of litigation.

- **Government's Commercial Data Privilege**

The Government's commercial data privilege protects various government cost estimates. Release would not only cause harm to the government's decision-making process, it would also provide a contractor with insight into the government's price negotiation position. This would place the government at a disadvantage in their efforts to obtain fair and reasonable prices in the future.

FOIA Exemption 6: Pursuant to DHS Instruction 262-11-004, FOIA Officers at DHS have been instructed to withhold personally identifiable information (PII) and sensitive personally identifiable information (SPII) of DHS personnel unless a determination is made that the disclosure does not raise security or privacy concerns, or if those concerns are outweighed by any public interest in that information. [This policy is available online.](#) Under this policy, the names of senior leaders, spokespersons, and political appointees are generally releasable. With respect to this FOIA request, DHS applied FOIA Exemption 6 to protect PII of DHS employees, including names and contact information. To the extent that DHS has withheld employee PII within these records, it has been determined that the employee(s) has/have substantial and legitimate privacy interests and that these interests are not outweighed by any public interest in the operations of the Department.

FOIA Exemption 7(A) protects from disclosure records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings. I have determined that the information you are seeking relates to an ongoing criminal law enforcement investigation. Therefore, I am withholding all records, documents, and/or other material, which if disclosed prior to completion, could reasonably be expected to interfere with law enforcement proceedings and final agency actions related to those proceedings. Please be advised that once all pending matters are resolved and FOIA Exemption 7(A) is no longer applicable, there may be other exemptions which could protect certain information from disclosure, such as FOIA Exemptions (2), 7(C), 7(D), and 7(E).

FOIA Exemption 7(C) protects records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes that could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This exemption takes particular note of the strong interests of individuals, whether they are suspects, witnesses, or investigators, in not being unwarrantably associated with alleged criminal activity. That interest extends to persons who are not only the subjects of the investigation, but those who may have their privacy invaded by having their identities and information about them revealed in connection with an investigation. Based upon the traditional recognition of strong privacy interest in law enforcement records, categorical withholding of information that identifies third parties in law enforcement records is ordinarily appropriate. As such, I have determined that the privacy interest in the identities of individuals in the records you have requested clearly outweigh any minimal public interest in disclosure of the information. Please note that any private interest you may have in that information does not factor into this determination.

FOIA Exemption 7(E) protects records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which would disclose techniques and/or procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.

FOIA Exemption 7(F) permits the government to withhold all information about any individual when disclosure of information about him could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual. This exemption also protects physical security at critical infrastructure sites.


While an adequate search was conducted, you have the right to appeal the above withholding determination. Should you wish to do so, you must send your appeal and a copy of this letter, within 90 days of the date of this letter, to: Privacy Office, Attn: FOIA Appeals, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, 2707 Martin Luther King Avenue SE, Mail Stop 0655, Washington, D.C. 20528-0655, following the procedures outlined in the DHS FOIA regulations at 6 C.F.R. Part 5 § 5.8. Your envelope and letter should be marked "FOIA Appeal." Copies of the FOIA and DHS FOIA regulations are available at www.dhs.gov/foia.

Provisions of the FOIA allow DHS to recover part of the cost of complying with your request. In this instance, because the cost is below the \$25.00 minimum, there is no charge.

You may contact the DHS FOIA Public Liaison at 202-343-1743 or toll free 1-866-431-0486 for any further assistance and to discuss any aspect of your request. Additionally, you have a right to seek dispute resolution services from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) which mediates disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a non-exclusive alternative to litigation. ~~(U)~~ **People's Convoy Gives Up, Will Leave D.C. After Three Weeks [The Daily Beast]**

- Three weeks after the so-called "People's Convoy" landed in Washington, D.C., the group is calling it quits.
- Co-organizer Mike Landis announced Sunday night [March 27] that the group would pack its things up in the coming days and drive back to California.
- Landis further said that convoy-goers who remain posted up in Hagerstown, Maryland—who have experienced many freezing nights while camped out in the small town an hour and a half north of D.C. proper—will enjoy a southerly route back to California.

~~(U)~~ **People's Convoy Departs For California [The People's Convoy]**

- According to an official statement from the People's Convoy website, the demonstration departed the NCR on March 29, 2022 at 10:00AM EST.
- The convoy's destination is California, where they will continue to demonstrate against a myriad of proposed state-level legislation perceived to be dangerous to civil liberties and individual freedoms.
- A version of the statement was shared by the American Foundation for Civil Liberties & Freedom (AFCLF) via a [Twitter account](#) linked to their official website (see image below).
 - The AFCLF is one of the primary nonprofit organizations funding the continued presence of the People's Convoy, according to Open Source reporting. The AFCLF website has a

page dedicated to updates regarding the movements and activities of the People's Convoy demonstration.

- As of March 29, 2022 the official AFCLF website indicates an active fundraising effort amounting to \$1,743,457 out of a stated goal of \$5,000,000. The stated purpose of the funds are to support convoy participants in fuel reimbursement and "hard costs of the trucker". NFI regarding the exact meaning of the quoted verbiage.

Goin' Back to California

The organizers have determined to leave the Washington DC area and take the convoy back to the states and do what truckers do best. Roll.

The People's Convoy is leaving Hagerstown, Maryland, and is going cross-country back to California. The California state legislature is going to vote on the most invasive COVID-19 legislation yet. If the legislation passes, laws will be made that will make all state residents, including children, legally bound under criminal penalty of law to give up their basic medical freedoms in order to participate in society.

The ten bills that the Convoy objects to are as follows:

SB-871: Adds COVID-19 injection to list of immunizations for public/private school, regardless of FDA approval, no Personal Belief Exemptions, very rare Medical Exemptions (see 2098)

AB-2098: Classifies anti-covid medical opinion as "unprofessional conduct" subject to discipline by medical boards.

SB-866: Lowers the age of vax consent to 12 without parental consent or knowledge.

SB920: Authorizes the medical board to inspect a doctor's office and medical records without a patient's consent.

SB-1464: Requires Law Enforcement to enforce public health guidelines or lose their funding.

SB-1479: Requires schools to create long term testing plans and report test results to CA Dept. of Public Health.

SB-1390: Prohibits any person/entity from making statements government deems untrue or misleading by any means including on internet/ads.

SB-1184: Authorizes school health personnel to disclose child's medical info without parents consent to a third party.

AB-1797: Creates an immunization tracking system giving all government agencies access to vax records of all persons.

AB-1993: Requires proof of COVID-19 vax for all employees & independent contractors to work in CA.

The Peoples Convoy unreservedly condemns these violations of basic rights that are being considered for law by the legislature of California.

Marcus Sommers, co-lead organizer, says, "We're leaving the DC area but we are not abandoning this mission. Everything that we see in these ten bills in California is in the bullseye of what we oppose. To not raise the alarm and bring pressure against these measures would be a dereliction of duty. The People's Convoy is in this for the long haul."

recognizes that Americans have constitutionally protected rights to assemble, speak, and petition the government. FPS safeguards these rights and only reports on First Amendment protected activities for situational awareness [Redacted] (b)(7)(E) to assure the safety and security of the participants, public, federal assets, missions, facilities, and occupants.

FPS protected federal facilities within the National Capital Region (NCR); specifically, facilities in Washington, DC.

~~(U//FOUO)~~ According to [Redacted] (b)(7)(E) the 2022 Convoy to DC event is a movement of several groups and individuals who were inspired by the Canadian convoy who protested vaccine mandates, COVID-19 restrictions, and other issues in the Canadian capital of Ottawa, on January 28, 2022. The protest in Ottawa brought downtown vehicular traffic to a standstill for approximately three (3) weeks and closed border crossings for days at a time. The 2022 Convoy to DC plans to travel cross-country to the National Capital Region (NCR) to protest vaccine mandates, COVID-19 restrictions, and other issues. The convoy is scheduled to arrive in the NCR between February 28, 2022 – March 7, 2022. [Redacted] (b)(7)(E) indicates the potential for a blockade along I-495 Capital Beltway. Currently, it is unknown if the convoy plans to enter Washington, DC; however, traffic disruptions are expected due to undisclosed road closures in the DC area.

(U) At this time, it is unknown how long the 2022 Convoy to DC will be in the NCR.

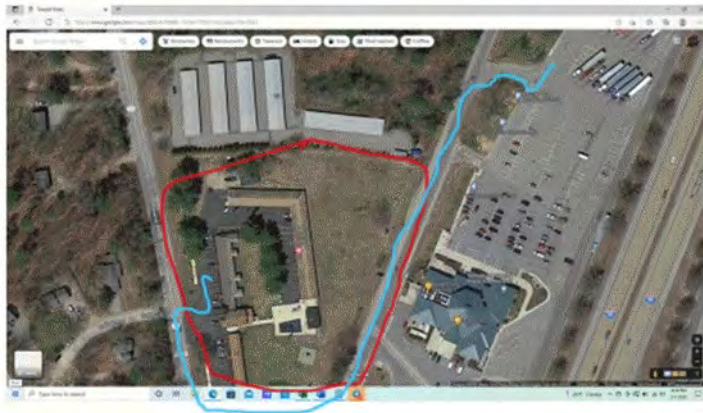

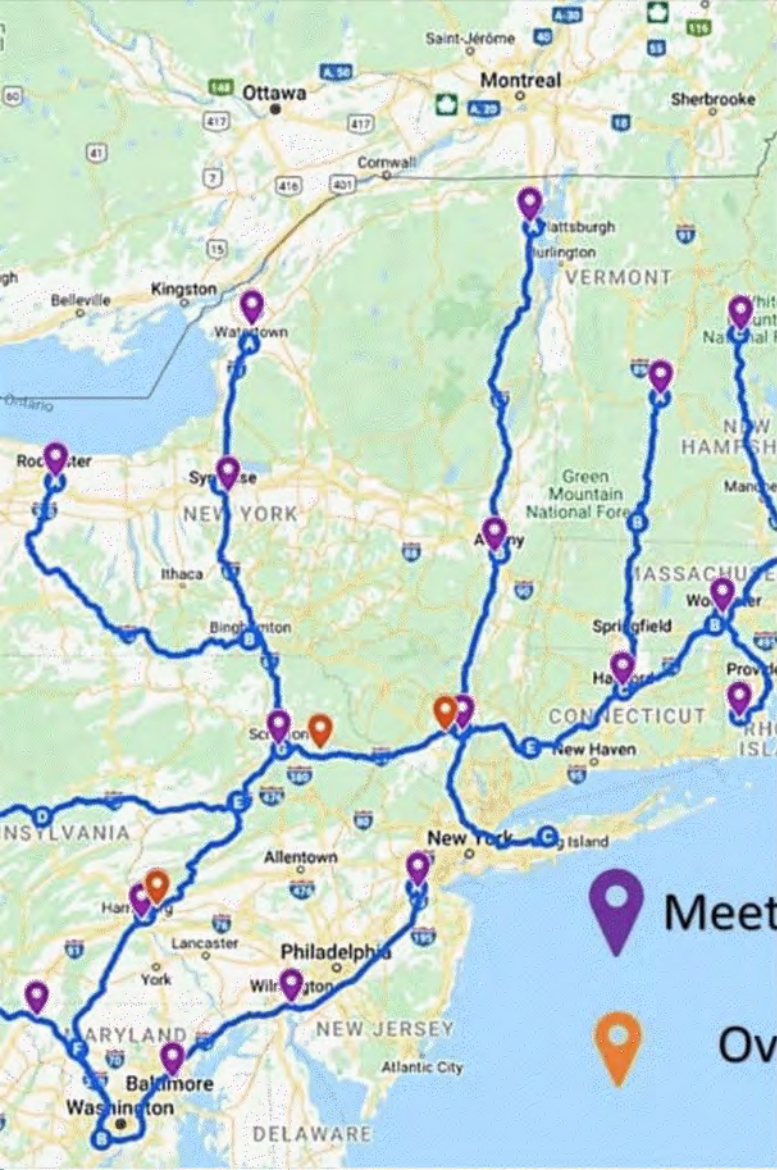

US 'freedom convoy' organizers seek to repeat Canadian protests



'Freedom convoys' have been organized in the US as part of the growing popular movement to protest against covid-19 mandates. The events have been shared on *Telegram* channels.

Most posts featured infographics/flyers that provided only minimal details for planned protests. Other posts reflected the nature of the convoy movement, which lacks a defined leadership and is driven by narratives rather than any top-down direction.

Events have been organized on:

- 8 February: A convoy was reported in Alaska organized in solidarity with the Canadian convoys.
- 12 February: A convoy intends to 'slow roll' near the 'Detroit Border' at 1.00pm. Participants will gather at 510 Thomas Edison Parkway in Port Huron.
- 13 February: A convoy protest at the Super Bowl in Los Angeles. Comments on *Telegram* claimed that roads and major thoroughways to and from the Super Bowl events will be blocked by the convoy.
- 4-5 March: Truckers and "all freedom loving Americans" were encouraged to gather at Coachella in Indio, California for a rally to "defeat the unconstitutional mandates." Organizers promised a "fuel reimbursement upon arrival for all attending this event."
- 5 March: A planned overpass support rally in Wisconsin for a convoy headed to Washington, DC.

- 5 March: A convoy will leave from Morgantown, Pennsylvania to Washington, DC.
- March: A convoy to Washington, DC from Florida. The exact date has yet to be determined, but would take place in the "first or second week of March."

Comments from the channels included:

- "You don't have to wait for a date, start USA convoys now. There is no fixed date...Alaska did it and didn't wait for the 1st of March or any other date."
- "USA needs to join now and in mass because we are losing some momentum and momentum lost is not good."
- A donation list included a range of food supplies and other materials.
- A map of showed proposed routs from the Northeast into Washington, DC.
- A list of interstate highways for convoys to travel along was circulated, but some questioned whether the information was accurate.
- There were calls to gather at state capitols.

The US Convoy for Freedom *Telegram* channel has seen a recent spike in interest and group membership. *Telegram* has been utilized to organize due to the banning of Freedom Convoy groups on **Meta** platforms, and because anti-mandate and anti-vaccine activists have increasingly turned to the platform during the pandemic to avoid content moderation.

The only date given for the US convoy to start is 1 March 2022. However, local convoys may be organized ahead of that date, including some that will join the proposed nationwide convoy to Washington, DC. Calls to action have primarily targeted the nation's capital, but some participants have called for a southern border blockade and a convoy to the Super Bowl LVI in Los Angeles.

A video posted to *TikTok* stated that there are already groups planning to move out from Sacramento and Barstow California on 1 March. The organizer stated that there were groups from the "northwest and southwest" that "want to go." He suggests that those groups "meet us somewhere coming across" the US and "if you are going to be a part of it you need to get yourself a CB [radio]."

~~(U//FOUO)~~ *Scope Note: This Public Safety Situational Awareness Notification is intended to provide law enforcement and other public safety officials situational awareness regarding circumstances that may impact the Emergency Services, Transportation, Commercial Facilities, and Government Sectors. It does not include a warning about any specific threat of violence and is intended to convey context for understanding and assessing potential impacts on emergency services and public safety risks that may arise. This notification is based on the Department of Homeland Security's assessment of the current threat environment.*

~~(U//FOUO)~~ The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has received reports of a convoy of truck drivers planning to potentially block roads in major metropolitan cities in the United States in protest of, among other things, vaccine mandates for truck drivers. According to (b)(7)(E) the group intends to start in California as early as mid-February and travel to Washington, DC as late as mid-March, reportedly gathering truckers as they travel across the country. Truckers from a similar event in Ottawa may join the Washington, DC event. However, as of the release of this notice, this event appears to be purely aspirational because the event is only being discussed online (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E) This could change quickly however, particularly since there are online discussions that suggest holding an event at a specific location near the Super Bowl on game day. While there are currently no indications of planned violence or civil unrest, if hundreds of trucks converge in a major metropolitan city, the convoy could potentially severely disrupt transportation, federal government and law enforcement operations, and emergency services through gridlock and potential counterprotests. The Ottawa convoy has prompted multiple investigations, including at least three for hate crimes, following vandalism and acts of intimidation, according to media reports.

~~(U//FOUO)~~ The proposed dates of the convoy are scheduled to coincide with Super Bowl LVI, scheduled for 13 February in Inglewood, California—a Special Event Assessment Rating 1 event—and the State of the Union Address, scheduled for 1 March in Washington, DC—a National Special Security Event. These events are of significant national importance and require extensive federal interagency support and planning for security and public safety. Super Bowl LVI and the accompanying events are multi-jurisdictional public events and are expected to draw approximately 70,000 attendees to the game and millions of people to the Los Angeles area. The aspirational convoy has the potential to divert public safety resources in both Los Angeles and Washington, DC and may impact law enforcement's and emergency services' ability to respond to calls for service.

~~(U//FOUO)~~ **Potential Vulnerabilities.** While the current convoy in Ottawa has led to widespread civil disruptions and nuisances for the citizens of the city due to noise, obstructions, “mischief to property,” and heightened tensions, to date the events have been largely non-violent. The mischief to property has included cars being damaged by rocks and eggs and being kicked, as well as “nails being strewn on roadways.” In Toronto, police have reported problems clearing the protests for passage of emergency vehicles. Public gathering locations are vulnerable to violence because of their relative accessibility and large number of potential targets. Organizations of all sizes, including businesses and critical infrastructure owners and operators face a variety of security risks. To help organizations mitigate potential risks in today’s dynamic and rapidly evolving threat environment, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency provides a [compendium of resources](#) for securing public gatherings, including unauthorized access to facilities, cybersecurity, active shooters, and bombings. Law enforcement and public safety partners should be alert to these concerns and any potential flashpoints, which risk an escalation into violence. DHS also encourages our partners to be prepared for any impacts to public safety; this includes maintaining situational awareness for potential violence in your jurisdiction, maintaining open lines of communication with federal partners, prioritizing physical security measures, and conducting outreach with non-governmental partners.

Update: (b)(7)(E) the status of delays at Ports of Entry (POE) between the U.S. and Canadian border:

Ambassador Bridge - Detroit, MI: No significant changes from 9 Feb. Outbound traffic to Canada remains closed on the Ambassador Bridge. Inbound traffic to the U.S. is open, but delayed. Canada Ministry of Transportation has installed signage on highways advising commercial trucks to utilize the Bluewater Bridge 65 miles to the north. The Detroit-Windsor Tunnel remains open to international Privately Owned Vehicle (POV) traffic both inbound and outbound from Canada.

POE Sweetgrass, MT: Canadian traffic in north and southbound lanes is still blocked by protestors at Coutts, Alberta (AB). Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) border checkpoint Coutts is still closed to inbound traffic and traffic from CBP POE Sweetgrass is being diverted to CBP POEs Del Bonita, MT and POE Piegan, MT. RCMP is diverting southbound traffic to the U.S. around the protestors. RCMP began issuing traffic enforcement citations to protestors whose vehicles were blocking traffic near Coutts, AB.

POE Pembina, ND: A blockade about a half mile north of the border in Canada has taken place. CBSA is advising commercial trucks to divert to either POE Warroad, MN or Dunseith, ND. The RCMP reports that the "Freedom Convoy" has farm equipment and commercial trucks placed across the road in both directions.

(b)(7)(E)

POE Blaine, WA: Uninterrupted traffic is moving across the border in both directions. On 9 Feb, 15 POVs gathered north of the Pacific Highway POE into Canada. The vehicle occupants are not blocking traffic and are peaceful.

Media is reporting that the auto manufacturing supply chain is beginning to be affected by the partial shutdown of the Ambassador Bridge that links Detroit, MI and Windsor, ON. Ford Motor Company announced it will shut down two Canadian plants and reduce production at a third plant. Global Automakers of Canada announced that Toyota Motor Corporation and Honda Motor Company would likely also be closing some production lines.

(b)(7)(E); (b)(7)(F)

Update (1317 ET, 9 Feb): (b)(7)(E) the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) confirmed Highway 402 is closed approximately 34 miles from the Blue Water Bridge. OPP is stationed at these points to prevent the convoy from continuing on Highway 402 toward the U.S.

(b)(7)(E) northbound and southbound traffic at the Sweetgrass Port of Entry, MT is blocked by protestors. There is no projected time for opening the lanes. A queue of 50 commercial trucks has formed on northside of protest area waiting to travel south. Approximately 35-45 commercial vehicles are in the Sweetgrass area waiting to travel north. CBP is contacting commercial drivers about diverting to other areas for travel north.

(b)(7)(E) no significant changes to traffic at the Detroit Ambassador Bridge since the last update.

(b)(7)(E); (b)(7)(F)

Update (0304 ET, 9 Feb): (b)(7)(E) that outbound traffic to Canada remains closed on the Ambassador Bridge. Inbound traffic from Canada is open, but delayed. Windsor Police Department (WPD) has closed one entrance to the bridge and is routing traffic through a second entrance. Canada Ministry of Transportation has installed signage on highways advising commercial traffic to utilize the Bluewater Bridge 65 miles to the north. The Detroit-Windsor Tunnel remains open to international POV traffic both inbound and outbound from Canada.

(b)(7)(E) all commercial lanes remain open on the Bluewater Bridge in Port Huron, MI. There are currently no wait times for inbound commercial vehicles from Canada. Outbound commercial traffic to Canada remains heavy.

Traffic at the Sweetgrass Port of Entry in MT is constant and moving in both directions. The Premier of Alberta is expected to make an announcement on the status of COVID-19 mandates. RCMP anticipates blockages depending on the outcome of the Premier's announcement.

(b)(7)(E)

Update (1123 ET, 8 Feb): (b)(7)(E) both the north and south lanes of the Sweet Grass Port of Entry (POE) in MT are now passable for semi-trucks. Blockade vehicles have cleared the area.

(b)(7)(E) a second blockade on a highway leading to the main U.S. border crossing is ongoing near Milk River, Alberta, approximately 14 miles north of the Sweet Grass POE, which is slowing access to the U.S. border.

(b)(7)(E) there are no significant changes to inbound commercial traffic at the Port of Detroit, MI since the last update.

(b)(7)(E); (b)(7)(F)

Update (0445 ET, 8 Feb) (b)(7)(E) the status at the Ambassador Bridge remains unchanged. U.S. outbound lanes to Canada remain blocked and inbound lanes from Canada to the U.S. remain delayed.

(b)(7)(E) privately owned vehicle (POV) traffic is being diverted to the Detroit-Windsor tunnel with no delays. The Blue Water Bridge 68 miles NE of Detroit in Port Huron, MI is experiencing a 1 hour and 50 minute delay for commercial and no delay for POV traffic.

(b)(7)(E) is reporting delays on the Canadian side of the Sweet Grass Port of Entry (POE) in MT. Truckers are blockading the northbound and southbound lanes of Canada Highway 4, a half mile north of the Sweet Grass POE. Commercial traffic cannot clear the truck blockade, however, Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) and the Royal

Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) are attempting to facilitate POV travel by navigating POVs on the road shoulder past the blockade. CBP is continuing to process north bound commercial and POV traffic through the POE. The traffic once in Canada is being diverted around the blockade by the RCMP.

(b)(7)(E); (b)(7)(F)

Update (0019 ET, 8 Feb): (b)(7)(E) that the CBP Port of Entry operations remains open. Detroit outbound lanes to Canada remain blocked on the Ambassador Bridge. Detroit inbound lanes from Canada have reduced traffic flow with only 20 to 30 trucks per hour being able to transit the Ambassador Bridge.

The organization "Freedom Convoy" which was organized to protest vaccine mandates in Canada has been identified as the source of the blocked lanes.

The CBP Port Huron Port of Entry continues to process commercial traffic. Port Huron outbound traffic is currently very heavy.

(b)(7)(E)

Overview (1152 ET, 7 Feb): (b)(7)(E) is reporting that the Ambassador Bridge between Detroit, MI and Windsor, ON is closed due to protest activity.

Report: At 2050 ET, [redacted] (b)(7)(E) that I-75 Ambassador Bridge to Canada is closed in both directions. They are recommending that motorists use the Detroit-Windsor tunnel or use the Blue Water Bridge from Port Huron, MI to Sarnia, ON.
