PROSECUTING ATTORNEY CASE SUMMARY AND REQUEST FOR BAIL AND/OR CONDITIONS OF RELEASE

The State incorporates by reference the Certification for Determination of Probable Cause prepared by Sgt Detective Ryan Raulerson of the Issaquah Police Department for case number 20-13002.

The State requests the court set bail at \$2 million for each defendant. While the Defendants have no ascertainable criminal history, their activities demonstrate they are a danger to the community. In a dark section of Renton Issaquah Road, they created an Uber account with a fake name and an email they both disavow for the purpose of hailing a stranger, Cherno Ceesay to their location. When he arrived, they stabbed him to death in the course of trying to steal his car, a Kia Sportage. When his car crashed, they left him dying in his car and stole his phone, presumably to cover up their involvement in this crime. They took other actions with their phones to cover their tracks and avoid detection from police, such as disconnecting their phones from the network.

Both Defendants told police they are from Nevada and have no ties to King County. They are a flight risk and an extreme danger to the community at large.

CERTIFICATION FOR DETERMINATION OF PROBABLE CAUSE

That Ryan Raulerson is a Sergeant with the Issaquah Police Department and has reviewed the investigation conducted in Issaquah Police Department Case Number 20-13002;

There is probable cause to believe that Olivia Breanna Lennon Bebic (and Devin Kekoa Wade (**1999**) committed the crime(s) of Murder 1st (RCW 9A.32.030). This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

On December 13th, 2020, at 2135 hours a 911 call was received from 8224 Renton-Issaquah Road SE, Issaquah, King County WA. The residents at the location had found Cherno A Ceesay DOB 11/6/92 sitting in his car alone, and having been stabbed to death. His car had crashed into a tree.

Our investigation revealed the following:

Ceesay drove for Uber, a ride share company. Uber allows individuals to request rides via the internet or a phone application. Uber drivers then accept these rides through the Uber application and transport the individuals making the requests for rides.

At 20:50 hrs, an individual using the email <u>Plutowade@gmail.com</u> and the call back phone number of XXX-XXX-7190 created an Uber account. At 21:03 hrs, that account requested an Uber respond to 8308 Renton-Issaquah Road with a drop off location in Issaquah approximately 2 miles away. Ceesay accepted the fare. At 21:18 hrs, Ceesay arrived in the location of the fare.

At 8224 Renton-Issaquah Road SE, which is approximately 100 feet from the scheduled pickup location of 8308 Renton Issaquah Rd SE, a witness heard a loud sound outside his house around 21:25 hrs. He looked out and saw Ceesay's car, a Kia Sportage, crashed into a tree. He saw the headlights on and exhaust coming from the car. He also saw what he believed to be a cell phone flashlight moving near the car. He got dressed and went out and found Ceesay. The witness and responding fire personnel said Ceesay was hanging from the driver's seat, held by his seatbelt, with his door open. He had no pulse, and though they tried to save him, he was deceased. Both the witness and fire personnel noticed that Ceesay had a large cut wound to his neck.

Ceesay's cell phone was missing from its dash holder. The charging cable was hanging out of the vehicle. Ceesay's wallet remained in his center console. He was stabbed multiple times, including a large wound on his right neck.

The Medical Examiner performed an autopsy and found multiple stab wounds to the right back of Ceesay's head, to the right side of his neck, and to his right ear. The wounds travelled back

to front and were consistent with being stabbed from behind. The Medical Examiner said the cause of death was homicide and that Ceesay would have gone unconscious within seconds of being stabbed in his neck and would have died soon after.

Uber provided location data of Ceesay's phone and for the phone that requested the fare. Uber indicated that location data is available as long as the phone is connected to the Uber application.

According to Uber records, after the murder, Ceesay's phone and the phone that had requested the Uber fare traveled together North on Renton-Issaquah Road SE for a few hundred yards. The phone using the <u>plutowade@gmail.com</u> email address then disconnected from the Uber App, while Ceesay's phone remained connected to the Uber App for 155 mins. Ceesay's phone traveled to SE 41st Place in Factoria near the Factoria Mall. The Bellevue Police Department was able to provide Bellevue traffic camera data and located a white vehicle with a black bag attached to the roof of the vehicle whose route perfectly corresponded with the GPS locations of Ceesay's stolen phone. Video showed it was a Nissan Altima with a Nevada license plate (discovered when investigators located the vehicle). Issaquah and Bellevue PD found this car on December 15th, 2020, and found that it had a Nevada license plate, in the location near Factoria Mall where Ceesay's phone had traveled after the murder.

Investigators found that Olivia Breanna Lennon Bebic (**Constitution**) and Devin Kekoa Wade (**Constitution**) had been previously associated with the vehicle. Later that night, Bellevue arrested Bebic and Wade for shoplifting. They were arrested from the listed vehicle and their Nissan Altima with Nevada license C-123 was impounded for a warrant. When police searched the car pursuant to the warrant, they found Ceesay's phone in the center console of the Altima. They found a knife with blood in the driver's door pocket and a tool knife with blood in the passenger door pocket. They also found an iPhone using XXX-XXX-7190. Records for this phone put it in the area of the scene at the time of the murder. Police also located another phone, later identified as belonging to Bebic, with the phone number of XXX-XXX-1684.

On December 16, 2020, police interviewed Bebic and Wade.

Olivia told police that the Nissan Altima is her car, and that Devin Wade is her boyfriend. She said they live in the car with their two dogs, Pluto, and Lila, at the SE 41st Pl in Factoria near the Factoria Mall. She said they sleep in their car and spend most of their time in their car with the dogs. She said that she and Devin are always together. She confirmed Devin's phone number was XXX-XXX-7190 and that his phone was always with him. She said she had her own iPhone XS. She provided number as XXX-XXX-1864 and an email of **Section 21**. When asked about <u>plutowade@gmail.com</u> she said she did not create that email, if it existed. She pointed out that it was her dog's name and her boyfriend's name. She said she always uses her own phone because they each have their own phones.

She had little detailed memory of Sunday December 13, 2020, but she did remember they woke up at 11 am and started delivering food for a food delivery application. She did not remember

any restaurant where they would have picked up food or any delivery location other than she was sure they made a delivery in Issaquah at 1600-1615. She said Devin was driving the Altima for the deliveries and she was the passenger. After the 1600 delivery, they went to SE 41st Pl in Factoria where they remained. When shown a picture of Ceesay, she said he did not look familiar to her. When confronted with the XXX-XXX-7190 and Ceesay's cell phone locations after the murder, she said she did not know what to say and eventually asked for a lawyer.

When the jail officers were bringing Devin Wade to meet with the detectives, Bebic yelled at him, "Don't tell them anything. Ask for a lawyer!"

Devin Wade claimed to not own a working phone. He said he has not had a phone since he left Las Vegas in February 2020. He said that they used Olivia's phone XXX-XXX-1864 for the food delivery app and to deliver food. Devin confirmed he had a dog named Pluto, that he and Olivia were always together, and that he and Olivia lived in the Altima at the Factoria location. Devin denied knowledge of <u>plutowade@gmail.com</u>. He said the brakes in the Altima recently stopped working so they had not delivered food since Saturday or Sunday- he could not specifically remember. He said the last food delivery they did was in Seattle. He said he had a bad memory and did remember much about Sunday except they probably got food and took a nap. He thought he was in Factoria all day. When they asked if his phone number was XXX-XXX-7190, he said his girlfriend told him to request a lawyer.

From phone data received from Uber, the phone service provider, and the actual phone, investigators initially believed that Uber had been tracking the phone using the number XXX-XX-7190, as this had been entered into the application as a call back number. After examining the phones belonging to Bebic and Wade, it is also possible, that the Uber application could have been tracking Bebic's phone (XXX-XXX-1864), as the it appears that the Uber application had been downloaded on her phone.

Data from Wade's Phone (XXX-XXX-7190) and his cell phone provider records show he was in the area of the murder before and during the murder. During that time, he used his phone to interact with ride share applications and he makes phone calls to tow companies. His phone's flashlight was off and on but was on from 21:15:55 until 21:25:52.

At 19:21 hrs, investigators believe that an Uber account was created, or that an email confirming such account was accessed, on Wade's phone using Bebic's known email address,

Data from Bebic's Phone (XXX-XXX-1864)

Data from Bebic's phone is limited to the information on the device. Investigators have not yet received location data from the cellular service provider.

On December 13th, 2020 at 15:46 hrs, Bebic's phone was used to search for how many stolen cars Washington, Facts + Statistics: Auto Theft. At 1548 hrs, Bebic's phone is used to search for

At 1548 hrs, Bebic's phone is used to search for the "10 most stolen cars in WA." At 19:02 and 19:11, Bebic called AAA. At 19:23 hrs, her phone was also used to call a towing company.

Shortly after 19:00, Bebic's phone was used to search for "can you bring your dog on Uber, Uber help, and pet friendly rides."

At 20:50 hrs, a second Uber account was set up. Investigators believe that this account was set up on the phone belonging to Bebic. This Uber account was created with the name Stephanie Tylor, and the email address <u>plutowade@gmail.com</u>, and Wade's phone number XXX-XXX-7190. It should be noted that the name Stephanie Tylor does not appear to exist in Washington and appears to be made up for the purposes of hiding the actual identity of the individual creating this account. This Uber account was eventually used to summon the ride from Ceesay.

On December 13th, 2020, at 23:54 hrs Bebic's phone accesses an email on the plutowade@gmail.com that states the payment had failed for the Uber fare with Ceesay. The credit card (ending in 0908) used to order the fare from Uber was found stored on Bebic's cell phone.

Internet searches through Bebic's phone suggest that she was searching for information about the murder and was looking for ways of erasing her digital footprint. It also appears that the two were searching for information about SeaTac airport which would indicate that they were looking for opportunities to flee the area.

There is probable cause to believe that Bebic and Wade attempted to rob Cherno Ceesay of his Kia Sportage when he responded to their request for an Uber ride. During the course of this attempt, they caused his death by stabbing him.
