Alaska: 2022 Elections

Governor: Gov. Mike Dunleavy (R) is the first choice of 45%, followed by Les Gara (D) at 24%, Bill Walker (Non-Partisan) at 17% and Charlie Pierce (R) at 6%. 8% of voters are undecided. In the second round, Pierce is eliminated. When his voters' second choices are redistributed to remaining candidates, Dunleavy leads with 54%. In the final round, Walker is eliminated leaving a margin of 59% to 41% for the incumbent over Gara with 13% of voters not ranking either.

Senate: Republican Kelly Tshibaka leads Sen. Lisa Murkowski (R) among first choices by a 43% - 35% margin with Democrat Patricia Chesbro at 13%, Republican Buzz Kelley at 1% and 7% undecided. In the final round, after eliminating Kelley and Chesbro, the final two candidates are in a dead heat, finishing at 50% of votes going for Murkowski and 50% for Tshibaka. Specifically, 227 respondents from the core sample are voting for Murkowski on the final ballot vs. 224 picking Tshibaka. It is an understatement to call that within the margin of error.

House: Rep. Mary Peltola (D) leads Sarah Palin (R) 45% to 30% among first-choice votes. Nick Begich (R) is in 3rd at 20%, while Chris Bye (L) gets 2%. Only 3% are undecided. In the final round, Peltola wins 53% - 47%, with Palin picking up slightly more than half of Begich's voters, and 30% ranking neither candidate.


ARP[®] Alaska: 2022 Elections – Governor's Race (18+)

Governor: Gov. Mike Dunleavy (R) is the preferred first choice of 45% voters, followed by Les Gara (D) at 24%, Bill Walker (Non-Partisan) at 17% and Charlie Pierce (R) at 6%. 8% of voters are undecided. Redistributing votes down to two candidates results in a final margin of 59% - 41% for Dunleavy over Gara, with 13% of voters not ranking either.


Dunleavy's 16% among voters 50+, who are likely to make up almost 60% of Alaska's November electorate, is similar to his overall edge. In addition to nearly maxing out among Republicans, he leads Gara by 6-points among Independent/non-partisan voters.

There is a sizable gender gap both among the 18+ and 50+ electorates with the final round candidates tied among women voters, but Dunleavy is winning men by a 2:1 margin. There's an even larger education gap with Gara up 16-points among voters with college degrees, but trailing by 40% among those without. Dunleavy's best segment regionally are voters who say they live in a rural area on the road system, while Gara leads among the smaller segment of rural voters who live off the road system.

Dunleavy's image is split at 49% favorable – 47% unfavorable. His job approval is better at 52/45. Gara is less well-known, with 33% viewing him favorably and 26% unfavorably. As a former governor, Walker is better known, but underwater at 36% favorable – 50% unfavorable.

Senate: Republican Kelly Tshibaka leads Sen. Lisa Murkowski (R) among first choices by a 43% - 35% margin with Democrat Patricia Chesbro at 13%, Republican Buzz Kelley at 1% and 7% undecided. In the final round the race becomes a dead heat, finishing at 50% of votes going for Murkowski and 50% for Tshibaka. More specifically, 227 respondents from the core sample are voting for Murkowski on the final ballot vs. 224 picking Tshibaka. It is an understatement to call that within the margin of error. 10% of voters did not rank either of these candidates in the final round.

The race is extremely close among voters 50+, who favor Murkowski 51% - 49%. Murkowski's coalition is reliant on center-left voters. She wins Democrats over Tshibaka by 90-points and Independents by 20, while losing Republicans by 78. There is a gender gap among candidates' supporters, with women favoring Murkowski by 12-points in the final round, and men supporting Tshibaka by the same margin.

Like the governor's race, there is a significant education gap. Voters with college degrees back Murkowski by 36-points and those without favor Tshibaka by 24-points. Murkowski has a narrow edge among self-identified urban voters and a sizable 36-point advantage among those who live off the road system. Tshibaka is up 20-points among rural voters who live on the road system.

Murkowski's image and job approval are identical, in negative territory at 44% - 54%. Tshibaka's image is split among voters with 42% viewing her favorably and 43% unfavorably. Chesbro is largely unknown (15% favorable – 13% unfavorable).



ARP[®] Alaska: 2022 Elections – House Race (18+)


House: Rep. Mary Peltola (D) leads Sarah Palin (R) 45% to 30% among first-choice votes. Nick Begich (R) is in third at 20%, while Chris Bye (L) gets 2% of the vote, with 3% undecided. In the final round, with two candidates remaining, Peltola wins with 53% to Palin's 47%. In this race, voters overall prefer a Republican candidate, but 60% hold an unfavorable view of former Governor Palin. This explains in part why 10% of voters did not rank either Peltola or Palin.

Peltola holds a 53% - 47% lead over Palin among Alaska voters 50+. She wins Independents who rank at least one of the two by a 26-point margin, overcoming Alaska's Republican registration advantage. As in the other two races, there are substantial gender and education gaps, with Peltola running up her lead among women voters and those with college degrees.


Peltola is up by 12-points among urban voters. Palin has the same edge among rural voters who live on the road system, but Peltola has a significant 40-point advantage with those who live off the road system.

Newly elected, Peltola enjoys a positive 49% - 33% image. Palin is in sharp contrast with 39% viewing her favorably and 60% unfavorably. Begich's image is also underwater at 38% - 48%.

Alaska: Political Environment (18+)


Political Environment: Two thirds of Alaska voters say the state is headed in the wrong direction, with voters of each party pessimistic about the state's direction. A ballot measure for the state to hold a constitutional convention has a major uphill climb, favored by just 30% of voters while 46% would vote no.

A slight majority are worried about their personal financial situation, while 5-in-6 say they are extremely motivated to vote this November. That number is driven by the 88% of voters 50+ who are extremely motivated.

Despite Peltola's lead, a generic Republican is favored over a generic Democrat by a 51% - 37% margin for Congress. President Biden's job approval is negative at 40% - 59%, while former President Trump's recalled job approval is split at 49% - 50%.

Among voters 50+, there are a variety of issues set to determine their vote for Senate. Taxes/government spending and abortion are ranked most important at 14%, followed by inflation (10%) and the environment/climate change (10%). In a head-to-head matchup, Alaska voters 50+ say inflation will be more important to their vote over the court overturning Roe v. Wade by a 55% - 40% margin.

At the state level, economic issues take the lead on what voters 50+ care about most for their vote for governor. The state's long-term fiscal plan (16%) is followed by jobs/economy (14%), inflation (10%), and abortion (10%).


