1. A motor junk unit of the 22 Army has approximately 200 motor junks in the Ningpo and Choushan Islands area.
2. [Redacted] approximately 5,000 troops arrived at Changchou (117-42, 24-32) from Ch'angt'ing (116-20, 25-45) via Lungyen (117-02, 25-07).
3. The 12 Artillery Regiment is in the Foochow-Lienchiang (119-31, 26-12) area, and the 13 Artillery Regiment is in the Amoy-T'ungan (118-10, 24-44) area.
4. Elements of the 12 Anti-Aircraft Regiment are at an airfield in the Amoy area. The remainder of this unit is at Mahsiang (118-14, 24-40) Airfield. Elements of the 7 Anti-Aircraft Regiment are at Ihsu Airfield, in the Foochow area.
5. Headquarters of the 1 Marine Regiment is at Anhai (118-30, 24-40), with the 1 Battalion at Tateng (大潭) and the 3 Battalion at Shihching (118-24, 24-37). Approximately four battalions of marines and the Chinchiang (118-34, 24-54) Self Defense Battalion are in the Chinchiang-Nanchiang (119-05, 25-28) coastal sector.
6. During February the Honan Shipbuilding Yards in the Canton area received orders from the Kwangtung authorities to construct 500 landing craft with armor-plated wooden hulls of 50-100 tons. Approximately 10 were completed [Redacted]
7. [Redacted] the Chiangmen (113-06, 22-34) Military Control Commission received one ton of telephone wire and 60 telephone sets from Canton. This equipment was stored in warehouses at Shuinan (水南), in the Chiangmen area, and is to be used soon to establish communications between Chiangmen and Chungshan (113-36, 22-22).

8. [Redacted] 24 trucks loaded with 500 boxes of rifles and ammunition, each box marked "Repaired", left Canton headed southward toward Foshan (113-08, 23-02), and continued on through Chiangmen and toward Kungifou (112-46, 22-26). [Redacted] the rifles and ammunition were destined for local militia in southern Kwangtung. 25X1

9. [Redacted] 60 naval experts, most of whom were Soviets, left Whampoa for Hainan aboard a gunboat. They first stopped at Haik'ou and then proceeded to Yulin Harbor,* where a submarine base is under construction. 25X1
