Joseph Vickery's intended target of a homemade bomb due to a recent issue she
had with him. Kimberly advised the Mount Airy Police that her daughter
and Joseph Vickery have no fixed address and have been staying at different
hotels around Columbia, MD. The report information was forwarded to the FBI
and the ATF and to the Howard County Police Department. During their
investigation, Howard County was granted an emergency ping on Joseph
Vickery's cell phone. The phone was currently showing at the Rodeway Inn
located at 1654 Whitehead Court in Woodlawn.
Information obtained from the Mount Airy police report provided Joseph
Vickery's vehicle information which is a
Uniformed officers went to the Rodeway Inn and conducted surveillance on
Joseph Vickery's vehicle. It was determined at that time, to not attempt to make
contact by knocking on the door due to the late hour and the fact that Joseph
Vickery was supposedly armed. Officers made contact with the front office at the

due to check out on 09/21/22. Sergeant McGladrie forwarded all of the above information to the Woodlawn Precinct's Investigative Services Team for further investigation.

During the morning hours of 09/20/22, Detectives Davis #5219 and Kolb #5678, from the Woodlawn Precinct's Investigative Services Team, conducted surveillance on room 207 of the Rodeway Inn. Joseph Vickery's 2001 Ford F-150 was not observed parked in the area of the hotel. Around 8:56 a.m., a white female, positively identified by her MVA photo as Kristen Lee Vickery F/W

exited room 207 and placed trash in the trash can on the sidewalk in front of room 209. Kristen Vickery returned to the room and obtained more trash. She then placed that trash in the trash can on the sidewalk in front of room 215 and returned to room 207 and shut the door. Around 9:11 a.m., Detective Temple #4789 recovered the trash from both trash cans. The trash was then picked up by Detectives Davis and Kolb and was transported to the Woodlawn Precinct to be searched. A search of the trash by Detectives Davis and Kolb revealed the following:

After examining the items recovered from the trash cans and reviewing the items purchased on the receipts, Detectives Davis and Kolb believed through their training, knowledge and experience that the items were precursors for manufacturing explosive devices. The Baltimore County Bomb Squad was requested to assist with this investigation.

Due to the serious risk to public safety, Sergeant Cougnet #4617, from the Woodlawn Precinct's Investigative Services Team, obtained an emergency ping through T-Mobile on Joseph Vickery's cell phone

T-Mobile complied with the request and the phone was showing on the parking lot of Pine Grove Middle School located at 9200 Old Harford Road, Parkville, MD 21234. Investigative units were directed to the area to attempt to locate Joseph Vickery.

Around 11:30 a.m., Joseph Vickery was detained in the area of Pine Grove
Middle School in Baltimore County. Vickery's black
was also located on the street next to Pine Grove Middle
School and was held pending a search and seizure warrant. While being
debriefed, Joseph Vickery advised officers that there was an explosive device
inside of his vehicle. At that time, Joseph Vickery was placed under arrest and
was transported to Baltimore County Police Headquarters to be interviewed.
Around 11:40 a.m., Detective Kolb and Temple observed Kristen Vickery exit
room 207 of the Rodeway Inn. Kristen Vickery was then placed under arrest for
an outstanding Violation of Probation warrant through Carroll County (Case # D-
102-CR-22-000557). She was transported to the Woodlawn Precinct for

Through Officer Slenker's training, knowledge and experience he recognizes that the Ammonium Nitrate removed from the instant cold packs is commonly used in the production and manufacturing of improvised homemade explosives. The propane cylinders are often used as an additional heat source or container for an improvised explosive device. The hot plate and steel pot are often used for the manufacturing of improvised homemade explosives. The strainer is a common component used to filter precursors/energetic materials used in manufacturing of explosives. The coffee grinder is also used to grind ammonium nitrate pellets and other energetic materials to a fine powder used in the manufacturing of improvised homemade explosives. The Scotts Turf Builder is a common fertilizer containing urea which is a chemical commonly used in the production and manufacturing of improvised homemade explosives. Lastly, the components of the remote controlled car are commonly used in the manufacturing of improvised explosives devices as a form of initiation.

Based on Officer Slenker's training, knowledge and experience, the above items are consistent with the manufacture and production of energetic/explosive materials or improvised destructive devices.

Detective Davis and Officer Slenker drafted a search and seizure warrant for 1654 Whitehead Court room 207, Baltimore, MD 21207 and Joseph Vickery's

The

search and seizure warrant was reviewed and signed by the Honorable R. Cahill of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County on 09/20/22 around 12:32 p.m.

Around 2:30 p.m., Detective Davis, ATF Special Agent Parker #5841 and ATF Explosives Enforcement Officer Eldredge #44 conducted an audio/video recorded interview with Joseph Vickery at Baltimore County Police Headquarters. In summary, Joseph Vickery admitted to researching "IEDs" on the internet using his cellphone and constructing the explosive device using a paper tube, ammonium nitrate from cold packs, aluminum foil, matches, wire, caulking and an RC car remote as an initiator. He also stated that he previously attempted to use fertilizer to extract ammonium nitrate, but was unsuccessful. Lastly, he

Vickery's vehicle. At approximately 1:00 p.m., members of the Hazardous
Devices Team gained access to the vehicle. Utilizing standardized methods
approved by the FBI Hazardous Devices School, members of the Hazardous
Devices Team rendered the improvised destructive device safe. The improvised
destructive device was identified as containing a heavy/thick cardboard tube

the cardboard tube were sealed utilizing wooden match head sticks and glue.
Protruding from one end of the cardboard tube was a heavy gauge double
stranded wire with a remote-controlled toy car "receiver." Next to the improvised
destructive device, a corresponding remote-controlled toy car "transmitter" was
located on the center floorboard between both the driver and passenger seats.
During their render safe procedures, members of the Hazardous Devices Team
conducted several presumptive field tests utilizing Raman Spectroscopy to
identify any potential energetic materials. These tests identified the following
explosive precursor chemicals located inside of the improvised explosive device:
-Ammonia nitrate
-Manganese nitrate
-Nitric acid
-Aluminum
Officer Slenker and Corporal Conroy recognized through their training,
knowledge and experience that these chemicals in combination are consistent
with a homemade improvised explosive mixture. Additionally, members of the
