SUBJECT : Top Secret National Security Classification Authority

REFERENCE : Executive Order 11652 issued in June 1972

1. Background: Executive Order 11652 requires that Top Secret classification authority be delegated by the head of an agency or his duly authorized principal deputy in writing. At the time the Executive Order was issued, certain positions were identified as requiring Top Secret classification authority. Over the years numerous officers and positions have been added and/or deleted so that some of the listings were current while others were outdated. In February a review was conducted throughout the Agency to update the listings of Top Secret classification authorities and the results of this review are attached.

2. Staff Position: The present system is unduly burdensome and inefficient. Currently, DDCI approval of Top Secret classification authority is required whenever an officer changes positions -- either to add or delete his name from the computer registers. Your approval of this memorandum will designate the positions and current incumbents on the attached lists as Top Secret classification authorities, thus eliminating the necessity for your re-approval of the authority upon an officer's rotation. In the future, persons assigned to one of the designated positions will be delegated Top Secret authority on the basis of this memorandum and the routine submission of a personnel action form indicating the level of classification authority required in the officer's new position. This authority will be revoked automatically by the formal personnel action upon the officer's rotation to a position not designated as requiring Top Secret authority. In only two cases will your personal delegation be necessary in the future: reorganizations or reviews which identify new positions requiring Top Secret classification authority and assignments of officers to development complements, pending permanent assignments, whose duties require Top Secret authority.

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3. Recommendation: Your approval of the attached list of Top Secret classification authorities is requested. Reports of classifying authorities at all levels will continue to be reviewed semi-annually to ensure accuracy and effective control. The Office of General Counsel has stated that the procedure outlined above is consistent with the requirements of Executive Order 11652 and a Headquarters notice implementing this procedure will be issued upon your approval.
