

Answer: No.

Question: Can fantasy and role-playing games, such as Dungeons and Dragons, be purchased for the inmates?

Answer: No.

Question: Are tennis courts permitted?

Answer: No. Courts constructed and used solely for tennis are not permitted; however, multi-purpose courts are permitted.

Question: Are pool tables and horseshoes permitted?

Answer: Yes.

Question: Can institutions utilize outside entertainment?

Answer: Yes. However, it is important to consider local institution variables such as cost, potential for unfavorable publicity, or security concerns.

Question: Can Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and first aid training be provided to inmates?

Answer: Yes. However, please adhere to the following guidance:

1. The training or instruction must be provided by an independent contractor, volunteer, or organization qualified and approved to certify the training (for example, the American Heart Association or the Red Cross).
2. The independent contractor, volunteer, or organization providing the training may not have any existing contractual or volunteer arrangement with the institution to provide health care or other services.
3. BOP staff (to include medical), regardless of whether they are qualified or certified trainers in CPR or other aspects of first aid, may not provide CPR and first aid training or instruction to inmates.
4. CPR and first aid certifications expire, and training must be provided on a recurring basis to maintain certification.
5. In situations requiring CPR or other medical attention, inmates must immediately summon Medical or other institution staff for assistance before beginning CPR or first aid. Upon arriving at the scene, BOP staff are responsible for controlling the situation.
