5 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO VACANCIES IN TERMS OF THE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL, SHERIFF, SUPERVISOR OF 6 7 ELECTIONS, PROPERTY APPRAISER, TAX COLLECTOR, 8 CLERK OF COURT AND DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD; 9 SETTING A PUBLIC STRAW BALLOT REFERENDUM TO 10 DETERMINE WHETHER THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, CHAPTER 92-341, LAWS OF FLORIDA, 11 SHOULD BE AMENDED TO CREATE AN IMMEDIATE VACANCY 12 13 IN OFFICE UPON A FILING FOR QUALIFICATION BY A SITTING MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL MEMBER, SHERIFF, 14 15 SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS, PROPERTY APPRAISER, TAX COLLECTOR, CLERK OF THE COURT AND DUVAL COUNTY 16 17 SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER TO RUN FOR ANY OTHER OF THESE ENUMERATED OFFICES AND FILLING SUCH VACANCY IN 18 19 THE MANNER PRESCRIBED IN THE CHARTER; PROPOSING 20 AMENDMENTS TO SECTIONS 5.06 (THE COUNCIL -21 VACANCIES; TEMPORARY APPOINTMENTS), 6.06 22 (MAYOR- VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF MAYOR); 8.03 23 (SHERIFF - VACANCY), 9.03 (SUPERVISOR OF 24 ELECTIONS - VACANCY), 10.03 (PROPERTY APPRAISER 25 - VACANCY), 11.03 (TAX COLLECTOR - VACANCY), 26 12.11 (CLERK OF COURT - TWO TERM LIMIT) AND 13.05 27 (DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD - VACANCIES), OF THE 28 CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING 29 NOTICE TO THE ELECTORATE; PROVIDING OFFICIAL 30 BALLOT AND TITLE LANGUAGE; DIRECTING THE SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS TO PLACE THE REFERENDUM 31

QUESTION ON THE 2023 FIRST CONSOLIDATED CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ELECTION BALLOT FOR THE ELECTION HELD ON MARCH 21, 2023; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

6 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City that elected or 7 appointed officers of the Consolidated government should be required 8 to resign immediately from their current positions in order to focus 9 on their campaigns when they have made the decision to seek another 10 local office; and

WHEREAS, to qualify to run for a different office when the term 11 12 of such office runs concurrent with the existing office, each elected or appointed officer is required by section 99.012, Florida Statutes 13 14 to tender a resignation prior to qualifying as a candidate for another 15 office; however, the resignation does not have to immediately take effect, such that candidates can remain in office, as a paid employee 16 17 of the City, while his or her attention is not entirely focused on 18 the office; and

WHEREAS, officers who seek a different office whose term does not commence until the current term ends must still qualify and administer and participate in his or her campaign while currently employed by the City and being expected to fully uphold the duties and responsibilities of the office; and

24 WHEREAS, amendments to the Charter of the City of Jacksonville 25 are required to implement such changes; and

WHEREAS the Council believes that the issue should be offered to the voters through a public straw ballot referendum to be held during the First Consolidated City of Jacksonville Election held on March 21, 2023; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1.

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Applicability; Straw Ballot Referendum.

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straw ballot referendum of the qualified electors residing in Duval 1 County, Florida is hereby called to be held on the ballot of the 2 First Consolidated City of Jacksonville Election for the election 3 held on March 21, 2023, to afford Jacksonville's citizenry the 4 5 opportunity to speak out on the issue as described in the provisions of Section 2 below. 6

7 Section 2. Straw Ballot to advise on amending the Charter. The Charter of the City of Jacksonville is proposed to be amended to 8 9 read as follows:

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CHARTER AND RELATED LAWS

PART A - CHARTER LAWS CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA * * * 12

ARTICLE 5. - THE COUNCIL

Sec. 5.06. - Vacancies, temporary appointments.

The office of a council member shall become immediately vacant 16 upon his or her death, resignation, qualification as a candidate for 17 18 Mayor, Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, Property Appraiser, Tax 19 Collector, Clerk of the Court, or Duval County School Board, failure 20 to reside continuously in the district or residence area from which 21 he or she was elected, except in the event redistricting should occur 22 during his or her term of office pursuant to section 5.02, or removal 23 from office in any manner authorized by law. A vacancy in the council 24 shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term by election 25 of a council member at a special election to be called pursuant to 26 resolution of the city council and held on a date no sooner than 1 month and no later than 6 months after the vacancy occurs, which 27 28 special election shall, if possible, be held in conjunction with any 29 other election scheduled to be held within the county. Any resignation 30 by a council member shall be submitted in writing to the supervisor 31 of elections (with a copy to the secretary of the city council),

shall specify the date on which it is effective, and shall be 1 2 irrevocable. If any council member submits a resignation which is 3 effective at a date later than that on which it is submitted, the city council may, by resolution, call a special election for the 4 election of a successor, said special election to be held on a date 5 not less than 1 month after the date the resignation is submitted nor 6 7 more than 6 months prior to the date the resignation is effective; and such special elections shall, if possible, be held in conjunction 8 9 with any other election scheduled to be held within the county. In 10 those situations in which a vacancy exists in a council district or at-large resident area and such vacancy is filled in the first 11 consolidated government election or in the general consolidated 12 government election, the council member-elect, who has been duly 13 14 elected in the first consolidated government election, or in the general consolidated government election to represent said vacant 15 district or at-large residence area, shall take office and assume and 16 exercise all duties of office immediately after certification of said 17 election returns, as of the date of said certification, in order to 18 19 reduce the time the council district or at-large residence area is 20 vacant and without representation.

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ARTICLE 6- THE MAYOR

Sec. 6.06- Vacancy in the office of mayor.

If the mayor should die, resign, <u>qualify as a candidate for City</u> <u>Council, Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, Property Appraiser, Tax</u> <u>Collector, Clerk of the Court, or Duval County School Board, or remove</u> his residence from Duval County during his term of office, or be removed from office, the office of mayor shall become <u>immediately</u> vacant. A vacancy in the office of mayor shall be filled in the following manner:

19	removed from office, the office of supervisor of elections shall
20	become <u>immediately</u> vacant. A vacancy in the office of supervisor of

26	If the property appraiser should die, resign, <u>qualify as a</u>

30	or be removed from office, the office of property appraiser shall
31	become <u>immediately</u> vacant. A vacancy in the office of property

10	or be removed from office, the office of tax collector shall become
11	immediately vacant. A vacancy in the office of tax collector shall

17	No person elected and qualified for two consecutive full terms

21	Clerk of the Court should qualify as a candidate for City Council,

25	Clerk of the Court shall be filled as provided in general law

immediate vacancy if at any time during his term of office he lacks 1 2 any qualification for the office prescribed by this charter or if he should qualify as a candidate for City Council, Mayor, Sheriff, 3 Property Appraiser, Supervisor of Elections, Tax Collector, or Clerk 4 5 of the Court. In the event that a vacancy in the school board occurs, the vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term 6 7 by election of a school board member at a special election to be called pursuant to resolution of the city council and held on a date 8 9 no sooner than 1 month and no later than 6 months after the vacancy 10 occurs. This special election shall, if possible, be held in conjunction with any other election scheduled to be held within the 11 county. Any resignation by a school board member shall be submitted 12 13 in writing to the supervisor of elections, with a copy to the secretary of the city council, shall specify the date on which it 14 is effective, and shall be irrevocable. If any school board member 15 submits a resignation which is effective at a date later than that 16 on which it is submitted, the city council may, by resolution, call 17 a special election for the election of a successor, this special 18 election to be held on a date not less than 1 month after the date 19 20 the resignation is submitted nor more than 6 months prior to the 21 date the resignation is effective; and such special election shall, if possible, be held in conjunction with any other election scheduled 22 to be held within the county. In the event that this special election 23 cannot be held within the 1 to 6-month period prior to the qualifying 24 25 period for the next general statewide election at which such office would be filled for a full term, then no special election shall be 26 27 held and the office shall remain vacant until filled at the next 28 general statewide election for the full term. Should it be possible to hold the special election to fill a vacancy in the school board 29 30 at the same time that another election is being held in the county, 31 then this special election shall take place on the date of the first

primary of the other election and if a runoff election is required, it shall be held on the date that the other election is held whether it be another special election, a general statewide election or a consolidated general government election. A vacancy in the school board shall not be temporarily filled in any manner and shall continue until filled in the manner provided in this section.

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Section 3. Straw Ballot Referendum.

9 (a) A straw ballot referendum of the qualified electors 10 residing in Duval County, Florida is hereby called to be held on March 21, 2023, the 2023 First Consolidated City of Jacksonville 11 Election, to advise on whether the Charter amendment which provides 12 13 for an immediate vacancy in office upon a qualification by a sitting Mayor, City Council member, Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, 14 Property Appraiser, Tax Collector, Clerk of the Court or Duval County 15 School Board member to run for any other elected office established 16 in the Charter and filling such vacancy in the manner prescribed in 17 the Charter, as set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance, should be 18 recommended. 19

(b) The straw ballot referendum shall be held and conducted in the manner prescribed by law for holding elections under a referendum provision.

(c) All qualified electors in Duval County shall be entitled and permitted to vote in the referendum. The places and times of voting shall be those polling places and times established for voting by law. The inspectors and clerks for the referendum shall be designated by the Supervisor of Elections in accordance with applicable State law.

(d) The Supervisor of Elections is authorized and directed,
when printing the ballots for use in the straw ballot referendum
election called in Subsection 3(a) hereinabove, to print the ballot

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1 title and referendum question set forth in Sections 5 and 6 hereof 2 on said ballots at the appropriate place therefor. Immediately 3 after said question shall be provided a space for the voter to 4 indicate whether the vote is "yes" or "no" on the question.

5 Section 4. Notice of Straw Ballot Referendum. The 6 Supervisor of Elections is directed to ensure at least thirty (30) 7 days notice of the straw ballot referendum by publishing at least twice in a daily newspaper of general circulation in Duval County, 8 9 once in the fifth week and once in the third week prior to the week 10 in which the referendum is to be held, in the manner provided in Section 18.05 of the City Charter and Section 100.342, Florida 11 12 Statutes.

Section 5. Straw Ballot Title. The Council hereby directs that the ballot title for the straw ballot referendum question be in substantially the following form:

16 "A STRAW BALLOT REFERENDUM REGARDING AMENDING
17 CHARTER TO CREATE IMMEDIATE VACANCIES FOR CITY
18 OFFICERS AND SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS WHO RESIGN TO

20 Section 6. Official Straw Ballot. The Council hereby 21 directs that the following straw ballot referendum question, in 22 substantially the form set forth below, be placed on the ballot at 23 the election to be held on March 21, 2023, the 2023 First Consolidated 24 City of Jacksonville Election:

25 "Should the Jacksonville Charter Sections 5.06 (City Council), 6.06 (Mayor), 8.03 (Sheriff); 9.03 (Supervisor of Elections), 10.03 (Property Appraiser), 11.03 (Tax Collector); 12.11 (Clerk of Court), and 13.05 (School Board) be changed so that if any of those identified officials resign to run and qualify for election for any

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 other of those offices, an immediate vacancy in

6 Section 8. Straw Ballot Referendum Results. The Supervisor 7 of Elections for Duval County, Florida shall certify the results of 8 the straw ballot referendum to the Florida Department of State in 9 accordance with law.

10 Section 9. Exercise of County Powers. This ordinance is 11 enacted by the Council exercising its power as the governing body of 12 Duval County, Florida, under Section 3.01, of the Charter of the City 13 of Jacksonville. All duly qualified electors of the county shall be 14 entitled to vote thereon.

15 Section 10. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 16 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 17 without the Mayor's signature.
