IT IS ORDERED:

1. The Petition for Rehearing is **GRANTED IN PART**.
2. Opinion No. 7622, issued on 9/30/2022, is **MODIFIED** at footnote 1, paragraph 2 as follows:

The legislature has since amended the HEIF statute; ~~removing the HEIF from the general fund and thus making it ineligible for the sweep.~~ Ch. 15, § 3 SLA 2022. Our decision is based on ~~reflects~~ the statutes in place during the proceedings underlying this appeal.
