are to determine whatever payments Mr. Lamar's insurance coverage can provide and supplement it with Mr. Lamar's income for the time being by having Mr. Rosenbloom issue checks until you receive a commission. And upon your receipt of a commission you will assume those duties as well as all the duties that we have discussed in chambers and which will be included by Mr. Grasso in the order.

You are also to proceed expeditiously with the transfer of the Degraw Street property to Lend Trust for the purposes of converting the land into a park. And the park shall have the name of?

MR. ROSENBLOOM: Adlington Lamar Garden.

THE COURT: As well as Nathaniel Reid Lamar. Ultimately, eventually.

What else?

MS. GASNER: Your Honor, if I may, per the order, we wanted I believe that Rosenbloom and Hofflich shall be retained for legal services in connection with the real property of Mr. Lamar.
