COMPLAINT

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Murder - 2nd Degree - With Intent-Not Premeditated

Minnesota Statute: 609.19.1(1), with reference to: 609.11.5(a), 609.19.1, 609.11.9

Maximum Sentence: 40 YEARS

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 05/20/2022

Control #(ICR#): 22003843

Charge Description: That on or about 5/20/2022, in Hennepin County, Minnesota, Julissa Angelica Genrich Thaler, caused the death of Victim, a human being, with intent to effect the death of that person or another, but without premeditation, while using a firearm.

Minimum Sentence: 3 YEARS

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant, a licensed peace officer with the Orono Police Department, has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

On May 20, 2022, Mound Police Officers conducted a traffic stop on a Chevrolet Impala that was driving without one of the front tires and was riding straight on the rim. Upon stopping the vehicle, Officers approach and encountered the driver, JULISSA ANGELICA GENRICH THALER, the defendant herein. Officers observed that the back window was broken out and there appeared to be blood on the defendant's hand. Officers also observed a shotgun shell as well as a spent casing in the vehicle. Officers also observed blood in the vehicle and what appeared to be a bullet hole in the back seat.

Based on the state of the vehicle, it was determined that there was probable cause to search the vehicle and that it could not be operated safely. Prior to towing the vehicle, officers searched the vehicle, including the trunk. Upon searching the trunk, officers located the body of a juvenile male who had been shot. There was also a shotgun in the trunk.

Prior to the finding of the body, the defendant had been released from the scene. Upon discovering the deceased child, hereinafter referred to as Victim, officers immediately went to the defendant's apartment. By the time they arrived, the defendant had left the apartment and the washing machine was running. Officers located the clothes the defendant had been wearing at the time of the traffic stop being washed in the machine. Officers located the defendant leaving the area on foot. She was placed under arrest. Officers observed that the defendant had blood and what appeared to be brain matter in her hair at the time of her arrest.

Officers received information from citizens related to the defendant's vehicle. A citizen saw the vehicle at a gas station not long before the traffic stop. The information provided was that the vehicle had stopped near the dumpsters. Officers searched the dumpster and located a backpack, blood, bone and what appeared to be brain matter.

Officers were able to follow damage done to the roads by the vehicle's rim as well as information from citizens to track movements of the defendant's vehicle. Officers located multiple locations where blood and brain matter were discarded. Officers found a bloody child booster seat in one dumpster. The seat had sustained damage consistent with a shotgun blast.

Officers spoke to a friend of the defendant R.P. R.P. reported that over the past week, the defendant wanted to learn how to use a gun so they had gone to the gun range. R.P. indicated that the defendant had been carrying a shotgun in and out of the apartment and that when she did, it would be wrapped in a gray blanket. R.P. indicated the defendant bought the shotgun on March 17th and they went to the range the next two days.

A thorough search of the vehicle revealed significant blood and what appeared to be brain matter in the backseat of the vehicle. A gray blanket was located in the trunk.

Preliminary autopsy findings revealed that Victim was shot multiple times, possibly up to nine times including shots to the torso and head.

The defendant is currently in custody.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.

Complainant declares under penalty of perjury that everything stated in this document is true and correct. Minn. Stat. § 358.116; Minn. R. Crim. P. 2.01, subds. 1, 2.

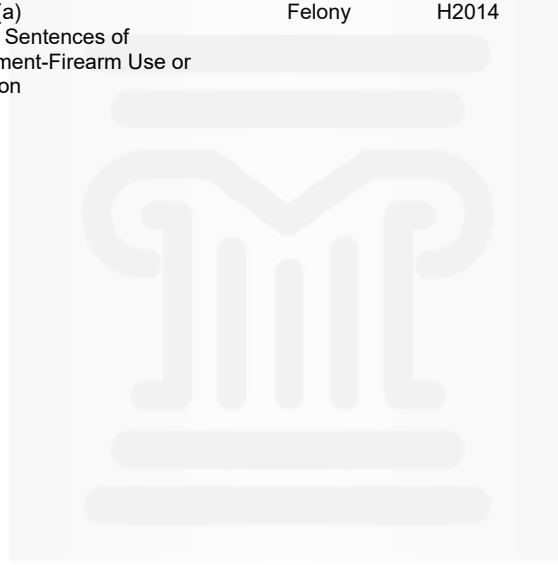
