PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVIT CFS#23006738

In the Name and by authority of the State of Texas: **BEFORE ME**, the undersigned authority on this day personally appeared the undersigned affiant, who after being by me duly sworn on oath, deposes and says that he or she has good reason to believe and does believe, that heretofore, to wit: between January 8, 2023 and January 10, 2023, and anterior to making and filing this complaint, in the County of Collin and State of Texas <u>Ocastor Ferguson B/M 06/21/90</u>, did then and there commit <u>Kidnapping</u>, a criminal offense against the laws of the State of Texas.

Affiant <u>Sgt. J. Reim #204</u>, is employed by the Collin County Sheriff's Office, Collin County, Texas, assigned as a <u>Criminal Investigator</u>. Affiant's belief is based on the following summary of the investigation:

On January 11, 2023 at approximately 1654 hours, Collin County Sheriff's Officer received a call in reference to a missing person. A report was taken advising Kayla Kelley had not been heard from by her aunt or co-workers for several days. During the initial interviews, it was learned Kelley had a boyfriend named "Kevin" and she recently found out he was married. Kelley told friends she was going to blackmail "Kevin". Friends and family advised Kelley they did not want to talk to her about dating a married man, so no one had any further information about "Kevin." Kelley was placed on the nationwide computer as a missing person.

On January 12, 2023, Affiant received a phone call from the Frisco Police Department advising they located Kelley's vehicle on a deserted County Road in Frisco. The car had been burned beyond recognition and the incident was not consistent with a natural fire. Affiant responded to the location and observed the vehicle. The vehicle did not appear to contain any physical evidence to the whereabouts of Kelley. Investigators went to Kelley's duplex, located at 4018 Jett in Collin County, Texas. Investigators obtained access to the duplex from management to ensure the welfare of Kelley. Kelley was not located in the duplex, but her dog was located. The dog was without food and water and had to relieve itself on the floor. It appeared the dog had been in that condition for a few days. Family and relatives advised the dog was like Kelley's child and she would never leave it unattended for an extended period of time.

Investigator obtained phone records for Kelley's phone and observed she was talking to a subject who was later identified as Ocastor Ferguson. Investigators conducted a background on Ferguson and learned his wife had recently reported their 2004 Lexus vehicle stolen. Deputies were sent to Kelley's residence and located Ferguson's vehicle in the area of Kelley's duplex. A search warrant was conducted on the vehicle and gloves, duct tape and a blanket were located in the vehicle.

Phone records for Kelley showed the last time her phone was used was on January 10, 2023 at 1859 hours. The last location of her phone was in the area of Ferguson's work in the Dallas area. NTTA records were also obtained which showed Kelley's vehicle travelling north on Dallas North Tollway in Frisco at Eldorado on January 10th, 2023 at approximately 0156 hours.

On January 13, 2023, Affiant and Texas Ranger T. Fitzpatrick located Ferguson at his place of work. Ferguson was interviewed and admitted to knowing Kelley and the last time he saw her was on Tuesday, January 10th when she dropped him off for work at around noon. Kelley was supposed to bring him lunch around 1800 hours, but she never showed up. Ferguson advised his car was at Kelley's duplex because he was hiding it from his wife. Ferguson gave Affiant consent to look at his phone and the conversations between Ferguson and Kelley. In those conversations, Kelley advises Ferguson that she will tell his wife about their affair if he doesn't answer her. During the interview, Ferguson admitted that he went by the name of "Kevin" when talking to Kelley. Ferguson said he lied about his name to Kelley so she did not know his true identity. Ferguson stated Kelley figured out his real name and identifying information and the fact that he was married. Ferguson gave affiant the background of their relationship. They met online and started talking and eventually met in person and started dating during the summer of 2022. Ferguson said he would go to Kelley's residence, area hotels or other areas to meet. They would never come to his residence in Grand Prairie.

On January 14, 2023, call detail records of Ferguson's phone were analyzed. The analysis showed Ferguson was at work on January 10th and left and went to his residence in Grand Prairie, Texas. He then left and drove up Dallas North Tollway and went to the area of Kelley's duplex and then drove to the area where Kelley's vehicle was found burned. Ferguson then travelled back to his house in Grand Prairie. Affiant and Fitzpatrick re-interviewed Ferguson and he denied being in the area where the vehicle was located and claimed to have no knowledge of what happened to the vehicle. Ferguson did affirm he was driving the vehicle during this timeframe and advised Kelley was in the back while he was driving. Ferguson advised he does not know where Kelley is located or her condition.

Investigators went to Ferguson's residence in Grand Prairie and obtained consent to search the residence from Ferguson and his wife. Affiant talked to Ferguson's wife and she advised on January 4th she received a text message from an unknown person advising they needed to tell her something. Ferguson's wife never made contact with the person, but felt it was a female based on the language used in the text exchange. The wife's phone was broken so she was unable to provide the number she received the text messages from.

Based on the circumstances associated with this event, there is reason to believe that Ocastor Ferguson, did then and there intentionally and knowingly abduct Kayla Kelley, hereafter styled the complainant, by restricting the movements of the complainant without her consent, so as to interfere substantially with

her liberty, by moving her from one place to another or confining her, with the intent to prevent her liberation by secreting or holding her in a place where she was not likely to be found, in violation of the **Texas Penal Code Statute 20.03 (Kidnapping)**, a **Third Degree Felony.** Furthermore, Affiant believes that this offense took place within the confines of the County of Collin, State of Texas.
