When you raise taxes, it drives people to shop in suburban Cook County, Indiana, and other places. I will not raise taxes on our citizens.

I will do the following:

- 2. Roll back bag tax.
- 3. Create a Task Force to advise on ways to cut bureaucratic red tape and stream-line city services.
