## ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2023-13

AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 6.40 – REPORTS AND AUDITS TO ESTABLISH THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ONLINE CHECKBOOK, REQUIRE THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF AN INTERNET WEBSITE PROVIDING INFORMATION ON MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS AND CONTRACTS AND SPECIFYING THE INFORMATION TO BE MADE AVAILABLE ON THE WEBSITE.

**WHEREAS,** the Municipality of Anchorage holds transparency to be one of its highest values; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality of Anchorage Online Checkbook is intended to offer information and details to citizens in an effort to provide a more open government; and

**WHEREAS**, a fair and open government requires that revenues and expenditures be accounted for and easily accessible to the public at no cost; and

**WHEREAS**, the MOA should strive to create an internet website that is user friendly, that allows a member of the public to easily understand all city financial information, and that allows members of the public to view all city information in a centralized location; now, therefore

## THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 6.40 – Reports and Audits is hereby amended by adding a new section 6.40.012 to read as follows:

## 6.40.012 - Online Checkbook.

A. The municipality shall on or before January 1, 2024 establish and maintain an internet website providing information on municipal financial transactions.

B. The department of information technology, in conjunction with the chief fiscal officer, finance department, purchasing department, and office of management and budget, shall develop, operate, and

- 1. Reporting of financial transactions of the preceding month to the assembly, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, with comments and supplementary data that the chief fiscal officer considers necessary. This report shall be submitted by assembly information memorandum and shall be made available to the public on the municipal website.
- 2. Reporting on compensation and allowances of the preceding month to the assembly containing detailed information for the salaries, per diem, relocation expenses, and any additional allowances for the Assembly Members, Mayor, Chief of Staff, Municipal Manager, and other executive department head-level positions. This report shall be submitted by assembly information memorandum and shall be made available to the public on the municipal website.
- 3. On a quarterly basis, monthly reporting shall include the additional reporting requested by the assembly and shall be made available to the public on the municipal website.
- [B. AT THE LAST ASSEMBLY MEETING PRIOR TO JUNE 30 OF EACH YEAR, THE MAYOR SHALL IDENTIFY BY ASSEMBLY MEMORANDUM THE FINANCIAL REPORTS PROPOSED FOR INCLUSION IN THE MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORTING TO BE PROVIDED TO THE ASSEMBLY BY THE CHIEF FISCAL OFFICER FOR THE NEXT 12 MONTHS INCLUDING IDENTIFICATION OF THE FREQUENCY, DATA, AND FORMAT OF THE REPORTS. THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO REPORTS REQUIRED BY OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE CHARTER OR THIS CODE. IN THE EVENT AN ASSEMBLY MEMORANDUM GOVERNING THESE REPORTS IS NOT APPROVED BY JUNE 30, THE MAYOR'S PROPOSAL SHALL BE IN EFFECT UNTIL SUPERSEDED BY ASSEMBLY ACTION.]
- <u>B.</u> [C.] Financial reporting under this section shall include an executive summary in the transmittal assembly information memorandum.
- C. [D.] Reported positive or negative variances of five percent or more for expenses by department and one percent or more for revenues in aggregate for all general government funds within the one hundred series of accounts shall be noted with specificity in the executive summary. Failure to note variances in the executive summary shall not constitute a violation of the Charter or this Code.
- <u>D.</u> [E.] Upon the request of three or more assembly members after receipt of reported positive or negative variances of five percent or more for expenses by department or a one percent or more for revenues in aggregate for all general government funds within the one hundred series of accounts, the public shall be given notice and an

opportunity to provide comment. 1 E. [F.] The mayor shall notify the assembly in writing within 21 days if a 2 projected revenue shortfall in aggregate exceeds one percent of the 3 total general government operating budget. 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Section 4. The internet website established under AMC section 6.40.012 shall be available to the public on or before January 1, 2024. Beginning on January 1, 2024, information on the website shall be updated monthly or annually, as specified in

AMC Chapter 6.40.
Section 5. The Administration shall present an implementation plan and budget for this project to the Assembly prior to fiscal year 2023 first quarter budget revisions.
<b>Section 6.</b> This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.
