Amanda: same response as before. The Commissioner continues to believe that the de-escalation unit is necessary but has to be properly monitored.

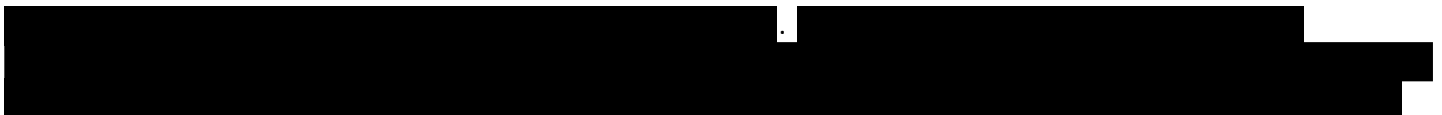
