

Discipline in New Mexico & Gallup-McKinley County Schools



Schools in New Mexico have to tell parents when they punish students.

Students can't be kicked out of school for more than 10 days without a hearing.

- The school has to tell parents there will be a hearing, which is a meeting.
 - Families in Gallup-McKinley County Schools can call 505-721-1074 to reschedule.
- If you don't go, the school district can still punish the student.

At the meeting, you can:

- Bring a lawyer. (You have to tell the school three days before the meeting.)
- Tell your side of the story and show evidence.
- Ask for a translator. You do not have to pay money for this.

Students with IEPs can't be kicked out for more than 10 days if:

- The student broke a rule because of their disability.
- The student broke a rule because the school did not follow their IEP.

The school needs to keep teaching suspended students who have disabilities.

You can complain. You can report discrimination to the federal government at <u>OCR@ed.gov</u> or contact the state at <u>dispute.resolution@ped.nm.gov</u> for special education.
