



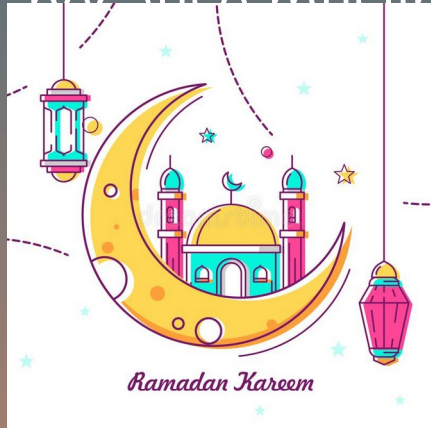
Ramadan and Eid
