If the case has an NCL security check, the officer must place the case on hold for the corresponding security check and recommend denial. For example, if AB-123456 is IAC NCL, the officer would place AB-123456 on hold for IAC with an annotation, e.g., "Recommend denial (PA is inadmissible), IAC NCL." The officer must also place all cases that are linked, either through cross-reference or family tree relationship, to any case with an NCL security check result on hold as well. For example, if AB-123456 is IAC NCL, the officer would place all linked cases on hold for IAC as well, with the annotation "Cross-referenced case AB-123456 IAC NCL."
