This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated January 21, 2022. Your request sought:

This request includes, but is not limited to, all communications by and between the CFPB and then-FTC Commissioner Rohit Chopra and/or then-FTC Commissioner Chopra's Chief of Staff Jen Howard concerning MoneyGram that occurred before the confirmation of Chopra as Director of the CFPB on or about September 30, 2021.

This request includes, but is not limited to, all communications by and between the CFPB and Rebecca Smullin concerning MoneyGram before Ms. Smullin began working for the CFPB in or around October 2021.

Through conversations with this office and confirmed in email, you were informed that the CFPB would conduct five separate searches for documents responsive to this request.
