The ALEC Board of Directors has finalized its review of all model policies passed by the task forces at the 2022 States and Nation Policy Summit. Both the <u>Act to Create a Feasibility Study on New Nuclear Energy Generation</u> and the <u>Act to Establish a Study on the Commercial Application of Existing Technology to Reclaim and Repurpose Nuclear Fuel Rods</u> received final approval and are now official ALEC model policy.

The board has requested a formal review of the <u>Eliminate Economic Boycotts Act</u> and will be meeting on Friday, January 20th for this discussion. Task Force members have the right to submit a letter to the board supporting or opposing the policy, so if you would like to submit a letter, please email it to me as soon as possible.



My name is Nathan Duell and I am the Arizona State Director for Heritage Action for America, a national grassroots organization with two million conservative activists nationwide, including thousands of Arizonans.

Heritage Action urges you to support <u>SB1001</u>.

In schools across the country, some teachers have started addressing children by names that are not their given name and are using pronouns that differ from their sex—without their parents' knowledge or consent. Parents know their children best, and their authority should not be superseded by teachers and school administrators. Schools should not make potentially life-altering decisions for a child without parents' knowledge!

One example of this problem happening in Arizona is in the <u>Scottsdale Unified School</u> <u>District</u>. The district allows and affirms students who change the name on their student ID to a first name that does not correspond to their sex.

Schools have failed to show any research evidence that demonstrates pushing radical gender ideology on children will help those who are bullied or suffer from gender dysphoria or confusion. A growing number of medical professionals now recommend "watchful waiting" to allow parents and doctors to observe whether the experience of puberty leads to resolution of gender confusion, with some studies showing that the confusion naturally resolves itself in up to <u>98% of children</u>.

SB1001 would stop activists in the classrooms from "socially transitioning" minors without the knowledge and consent of parents. This bill would protect the rights of parents and students by ensuring school districts only address students by the pronouns consistent with their sex, unless parents give the school written permission to do otherwise. This bill would also protect school employees from violations of their religious or deeply-held beliefs.

My name is Nathan Duell and I am the Arizona State Director for Heritage Action for America, a national grassroots organization with two million conservative activists nationwide, including thousands of Arizonans.

Heritage Action urges you to support <u>SB1001</u>.

In schools across the country, some teachers have started addressing children by names that are not their given name and are using pronouns that differ from their sex—without their parents' knowledge or consent. Parents know their children best, and their authority should not be superseded by teachers and school administrators. Schools should not make potentially life-altering decisions for a child without parents' knowledge!

One example of this problem happening in Arizona is in the <u>Scottsdale Unified School</u> <u>District</u>. The district allows and affirms students who change the name on their student ID to a first name that does not correspond to their sex.

Schools have failed to show any research evidence that demonstrates pushing radical gender ideology on children will help those who are bullied or suffer from gender dysphoria or confusion. A growing number of medical professionals now recommend "watchful waiting" to allow parents and doctors to observe whether the experience of puberty leads to resolution of gender confusion, with some studies showing that the confusion naturally resolves itself in up to <u>98% of children</u>.

SB1001 would stop activists in the classrooms from "socially transitioning" minors without the knowledge and consent of parents. This bill would protect the rights of parents and students by ensuring school districts only address students by the pronouns consistent with their sex, unless parents give the school written permission to do otherwise. This bill would also protect school employees from violations of their religious or deeply-held beliefs.

My name is Nathan Duell and I am the Arizona State Director for Heritage Action for America, a national grassroots organization with two million conservative activists nationwide, including thousands of Arizonans.

Heritage Action urges you to support <u>SB1001</u>.

In schools across the country, some teachers have started addressing children by names that are not their given name and are using pronouns that differ from their sex—without their parents' knowledge or consent. Parents know their children best, and their authority should not be superseded by teachers and school administrators. Schools should not make potentially life-altering decisions for a child without parents' knowledge!

One example of this problem happening in Arizona is in the <u>Scottsdale Unified School</u> <u>District</u>. The district allows and affirms students who change the name on their student ID to a first name that does not correspond to their sex.

Schools have failed to show any research evidence that demonstrates pushing radical gender ideology on children will help those who are bullied or suffer from gender dysphoria or confusion. A growing number of medical professionals now recommend "watchful waiting" to allow parents and doctors to observe whether the experience of puberty leads to resolution of gender confusion, with some studies showing that the confusion naturally resolves itself in up to <u>98% of children</u>.

SB1001 would stop activists in the classrooms from "socially transitioning" minors without the knowledge and consent of parents. This bill would protect the rights of parents and students by ensuring school districts only address students by the pronouns consistent with their sex, unless parents give the school written permission to do otherwise. This bill would also protect school employees from violations of their religious or deeply-held beliefs.


20 Ways States Can Prevent Illegal Immigration



llegal immigration has soared to record highs under the Biden Administration's purposeful dismantling of our nation's borders and our immigration enforcement infrastructure. Due to radical open-border policies and the current border crisis, states across the country are bearing the consequences of illegal immigration like never before. While it is true that the federal government has primary responsibility to enforce our immigration laws, they are failing to do so. States can play a crucial role in upholding our country's laws and fighting illegal immigration, protecting their own citizens. States can help enforce the law by deterring illegal aliens from residing in their states and publicizing the problems caused by uncontrolled, illegal immigration. The list that follows can act as a roadmap and starting point in that effort.

Require E-Verify

Requiring licensed businesses to use this Web-based verification system can quickly and accurately reveal the authenticity of the information and credentials offered by new hires so employers hire authorized workers.



Target Business Licenses of Employers Hiring Illegal Aliens

Requiring employers to use the federal government's own system and laws for checking immigration status, then suspending or revoking the license of a business if an employer knowingly hires an illegal alien is a right held by states and upheld by the Supreme Court since 2011—it helps fight willful ignorance of immigration status by businesses.

Pass Vehicle Laws Preventing Day Labor

Passing vehicle laws—such as those making it illegal to stop and impede traffic to hire someone or pick up a passenger—cuts down on the "day labor" practices of illegal aliens trying to avoid official work verification.

Require State/Local Law Enforcement to Determine/ Communicate Immigration Status

Requiring law enforcement to attempt to determine the immigration status of anyone (if reasonable suspicion exists that the person is unlawfully present in the United States) they stop, detain, or arrest is reasonable and doable through U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)'s 24-hour Law Enforcement Support Center and allows agencies to report illegal aliens' status to the federal government.

Prevent Sanctuary Cities and Counties

Passing state laws forbidding state, county, or local jurisdictions and officials from operating under "sanctuary policies" (withholding information from federal law enforcement) protects law enforcement, Americans, and migrant communities.

Empower State Residents to Sue Officials Who Obstruct Federal Law Enforcement

Allowing legal residents to sue officials who carry out sanctuary policies reinforces opposition to sanctuary policies and prevents political subdivisions within the state from obstructing the state's cooperation with federal law enforcement.



Require the Majority of Law Enforcement Agencies to Participate in the 287(g) Program

Requiring state and local law enforcement agencies to participate in this program—authorizing U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to enter into agreements with the agencies, train local and state officials, and supervise them—expands immigration enforcement.

Require Small, Rural Jurisdictions to Enroll in the Warrant Service Officer Program

Enrolling law enforcement officials from rural or low-budget jurisdictions in the 1-day training for the Warrant Service Officer (WSO) program, rather than the full, 4-week 287(g) program training, allows warrant service officers in these smaller jurisdictions to at least serve administrative warrants and execute arrests on behalf of ICE.

Enact Laws Making It a Crime to Transport/Conceal/Induce an Illegal Alien

Passing laws making it a crime to knowingly transport and further the illegal presence of an alien in the U.S., harbor an alien from detection in any place or building in the state, or encourage an alien to come into the state, discourages residents





Prohibit Illegal Aliens from Receiving Driver's Licenses/License Plates/Business, Commercial, Professional Licenses



Prohibiting driver's licenses prevents illegal aliens from obtaining downstream benefits, such as voter registration, government benefits, bank accounts, and credit cards.

Collect Data and Publish Crimes Committed by Illegal Aliens

Collecting data on immigration status of arrested and incarcerated criminals in state and local prisons and jails provides states with valuable information to address the problem.

Publishing this data and these stories fights the open borders narrative that Americans are unharmed by high illegal immigration and sanctuary policies.



Prevent or Tax Remittances Sent Abroad

Requiring banks to verify immigration status or imposing taxes on remittances sent abroad disincentivizes illegal aliens from sending wages back to their home country.

Prohibit State and Local Taxes from Funding Attorneys for Removeable Aliens

Pass laws stating that taxpayer funds shall not go to attorneys or NGOs to pay for aliens' legal representation in immigration proceedings, including appeals, as they seek relief from removal.

Prohibit Business Licenses/ Contracts/Grants for NGOs Transporting/Smuggling

Prohibiting licenses/contracts/grants for NGOs transporting or assisting in the transport of aliens discourages organizations from funding, operating, or aiding smuggling operations.

Prevent Biggest State Costs for Illegal Aliens

Requiring agencies and social service providers to verify immigration status and benefit eligibility by using SAVE (a U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services online tool to quickly verify a benefit applicant's immigration status) prevents aliens from illegally obtaining public funds for education, health, social services, etc.









Require Voter ID and Clean Voter Rolls Regularly

Requiring Voter ID would prevent aliens from voting illegally.

Cleaning up voter rolls regularly ensures that aliens who have purposely or inadvertently been registered to vote are removed.

Sue the Federal Government

As seen in Biden vs. Texas, suing federal government officials for reckless or illegal changes made to immigration policies—as well as disregard for states' interests—can better force accountability for the federal government when it comes to the enforcement of proper immigration law and policy.

Heritage Action urges you to support <u>SB1001</u>.

In schools across the country, some teachers have started addressing children by names that are not their given name and are using pronouns that differ from their sex—without their parents' knowledge or consent. Parents know their children best, and their authority should not be superseded by teachers and school administrators. Schools should not make potentially life-altering decisions for a child without parents' knowledge!

One example of this problem happening in Arizona is in the <u>Scottsdale Unified School</u> <u>District</u>. The district allows and affirms students who change the name on their student ID to a first name that does not correspond to their sex.

Schools have failed to show any research evidence that demonstrates pushing radical gender ideology on children will help those who are bullied or suffer from gender dysphoria or confusion. A growing number of medical professionals now recommend "watchful waiting" to allow parents and doctors to observe whether the experience of puberty leads to resolution of gender confusion, with some studies showing that the confusion naturally resolves itself in up to <u>98% of children</u>.





THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WILL NOT BENEFIT FROM RANKED CHOICE VOTING

TOPLINE POINTS

- Ranked Choice Voting is an overly complicated system that is not popular among the vast majority of Americans.
- Under Ranked Choice Voting, the voter does not have the ability to explicitly say who they would like to win compared to the other candidates.
- Instead of making it easier to vote and harder to cheat, Ranked Choice Voting will confuse voters and discourage more citizens from voting.

Ranked Choice Voting: What Is It?

Ranked Choice Voting is an elections system in which voters can vote for multiple candidates ranking the candidates in order of preference. If any candidate wins a simple majority of first-preference votes (50% plus one vote), he or she is declared the winner. If no candidate wins a simple majority of first-preference votes, an algorithm—rather than a run-off election or simple plurality winner elections—determines the ultimate winner. Specifically, with Ranked Choice Voting, the candidate who receives the least votes is removed from the race, and any ballots on which that candidate was marked as a first-preference are recounted with the second-preference marking, moving into the first-preference spot. This process continues until one candidate receives the simple majority of the ballots. Unlike an actual run-off system, candidates are not able to retool their campaigns as the pool of contenders shrinks, and voters are never given the opportunity to reassess the pool and actively affirm their top preference (Ballotpedia, 2019).

Research Shows Ranked Choice Voting Has Negative Effects on Elections

An article written by FairVote—a left-leaning nonprofit that advocates for Ranked Choice Voting—and published in the National Civic Review in late 2019, claims that it minimizes the political furor surrounding elections by incentivizing candidates to appeal to a broader electorate

in the pursuit of second-preference votes (Lavin, 2019). The article also denies that the system is complicated. However, the facts show just the opposite.

Currently, the states of Maine and Alaska utilize Ranked Choice Voting. In both states, elections remain contentious. A Massachusetts Institute of Technology study on Ranked Choice Voting in Maine revealed that it "produced significantly lower levels of voter confidence, voter satisfaction, and ease of use. It also increased the perception that the voting process was slanted against the respondent's party. Similarly, [the study] found that it increased the amount of time it took to vote by nearly 12 seconds per candidate than voting using a plurality ballot" (Clark, 2021). The study also found that negative campaign ad spending increased after implementation of Ranked Choice Voting, in contrast to the claim that it increases civility in campaigning.

Ranked Choice Voting Disenfranchises Voters

The principle behind the democratic process of casting a vote is that each person has the right to equal and proportionate representation in government. Leaders are chosen by voters, comparing the candidates against each other and casting a ballot. If there are going to be multiple rounds of casting ballots, each voter should be able to weigh in actively and vote once in each of those rounds, and candidates should be allowed to continue campaigning after anybody drops out. Campaign strategies, media attention, and voter perceptions are bound to change anytime the field of candidates is shaken up; running a simulated algorithm is not a substitute for this important democratic process. Ranked Choice Voting prohibits a voter from knowing which candidates remain in subsequent rounds and therefore makes it impossible for voters to be able to reassess the field accurately and consistently. Under Ranked Choice Voting, the voter does not have the ability to explicitly say who they would like to win compared to the other candidates because they do not know until after their only ballot is cast which candidates will be eliminated and which will remain.

Additionally, implementing Ranked Choice Voting prolongs the elections process. States and counties already struggle to deliver election results within a reasonable timeframe, and this contributes to the lack of public trust in elections currently. Ranked Choice Voting adds in several more rounds of tabulating ballots, leading to longer waiting periods before election results are announced, and opening the door for more errors in the tabulation process, while placing even greater a strain on the election workers and poll watchers.

A Majority of Americans Do Not Approve of Ranked Choice Voting

When recently polled, Americans reinforce what we already know from real-time experience. A new Rasmussen poll shows that 42% of respondents had never heard of Ranked Choice Voting. Once the concept was explained, 60% of those polled did not agree with Ranked Choice Voting and only 23% agreed with it. And when the possibility that one candidate could have received the most first-preference votes in the election but that another candidate could win the election with the second-preference votes, 8% of Americans viewed Ranked Choice Voting as very favorable. -C+ /N S2T



The American people will not benefit from policies that implement Ranked Choice Voting. The effects will only confuse and discourage citizens, which is not in line with the Center for Election Integrity's mission of making it easy to vote and hard to cheat.

PROHIBITING RANKED CHOICE VOTING ACT

PURPOSE OF THIS ACT

Ranked Choice Voting (RCV), as defined below, is an overly complicated system that is not popular among the vast majority of Americans and often prevents the candidate receiving the most votes from being declared the winner. Studies show Ranked Choice Voting discourages voter participation, adds wait time for results, does not decrease negative ads, puts a greater strain on election workers, and increases voter distrust. Instead of making it easy to vote but hard to cheat, RCV will confuse voters and discourage more citizens from voting. The purpose of this act is to ban RCV in states.

Section 1. {Definitions}

A) Ranked Choice Voting is defined as a method for casting and tabulating votes in which voters rank candidates for an office in order of preference, and then tabulation occurs in rounds, with each round dropping the candidate with the least support and then reallocating the first-place votes from the eliminated candidate to the second-choice candidates.

Section 2. {Basic Elements of the Bill}

- A) As of [bill effective date], Ranked Choice Voting may not be used to elect or nominate any candidate to any local, state, or federal office in [state]. Any election utilizing Ranked Choice Voting is invalid. No official may be sworn into office on the basis of such an election.
- B) The prohibitions of this section do not apply to the internal processes of political parties, such as conventions, the elections of political party officers, or other non-public decision-making procedures by political parties.

My name is Nathan Duell and I am the Arizona State Director for Heritage Action for America, a national grassroots organization with two million conservative activists nationwide, including thousands of Arizonans.

Heritage Action urges you to support <u>SB1001</u>.

In schools across the country, some teachers have started addressing children by names that are not their given name and are using pronouns that differ from their sex—without their parents' knowledge or consent. Parents know their children best, and their authority should not be superseded by teachers and school administrators. Schools should not make potentially life-altering decisions for a child without parents' knowledge!

One example of this problem happening in Arizona is in the <u>Scottsdale Unified School</u> <u>District</u>. The district allows and affirms students who change the name on their student ID to a first name that does not correspond to their sex.

Schools have failed to show any research evidence that demonstrates pushing radical gender ideology on children will help those who are bullied or suffer from gender dysphoria or confusion. A growing number of medical professionals now recommend "watchful waiting" to allow parents and doctors to observe whether the experience of puberty leads to resolution of gender confusion, with some studies showing that the confusion naturally resolves itself in up to <u>98% of children</u>.

SB1001 would stop activists in the classrooms from "socially transitioning" minors without the knowledge and consent of parents.
