This Mississippi Today / Siena College Poll was conducted April 16 - 20, 2023, among 783 Mississippi registered voters. Of the 783 respondents, 509 were contacted through a dual frame (landline and cell phone) mode and 274 respondents were drawn from a proprietary online panel (Lucid). Telephone calls were conducted in English and respondent sampling was initiated by asking for the youngest person in the household. Telephone sampling was conducted via a stratified dual frame sample of landline and cell phone drawn from the L-2 database of registered voters within Mississippi weighted to reflect known population patterns. Data from collection modes was statistically adjusted by region, age, race/ethnicity by congressional district, education, and gender to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 4.3 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.
