
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

Sgt. King was advised of the incident.
ID unit was not called to the scene due to the time delay between when the incident occurred to when reported the incident.
Officer Sarver took photographs of the injuries present to which he later uploaded to evidence.com.
advised that he would like to pursue charges and I gave him a department issued case card. I also sent evidence links to and for screenshots of the text messages/phone calls they had been receiving.
Officer Sarver conducted a neighborhood check; see his report for further.
I spoke with the stated that he was not at the residence when the incident occurred but stated that he talked that he was not at the residence when the incident occurred but stated that he talked that he was aware of the mysterious messages that was receiving since he was also getting phone calls from various numbers.
said that was had lived at his residence until February of 2023 when he kicked her out. He stated that was friends with and was upset with for kicking out. He noted that ever since was kicked out of the residence he had been receiving phone calls/text messages from various phone numbers threatening to beat him up. Since the phone calls/text messages started shortly after kicking out of the residence; believed that was behind these mysterious messages as well. However, this could not be confirmed since it appeared the individual was using an app that sent messages/calls from various phone numbers.
advised that the male forced his way into the residence by opening the screen door but the male did not damage the door to the residence when he made entry.  noted that he knew the male that battered him as an acquaintance. He noted that the male's street name was "and he was a male, years old, tall, and weighed approximately lbs. He noted that the male had black hair with waves and was covered in arm tattoos (both arms)/had a neck tattoo. Dispatch had noted on the ticket that the suspect was wearing a black hat/black shirt.  noted that he knew the male because the male was friends with his previous roommate.
Upon arrival, I met with and his cousin (outside of around 1300 hours. After work he took his grandmother to a nearby store and then returned home. He noted that since it was nice outside he left his door open with only the screen door to the residence closed. He said that he was walking to the bathroom, when he heard his dog barking, and then he was bear hugged by a male from behind. The male, known as ",body slammed to the ground and then repeatedly punched and kicked advised that he felt like he was punched about 90 times in total. advised that the left side of his rib cage hurt from the incident but he declined medical attention. While speaking with did observe that he had a black eye (left side of face). He said that after the male battered him; the male left southbound on main St.
On, Wednesday, 05/03/2023, around 2250 hours, Officers were dispatched to in reference to a battery later determined to be a home invasion. The caller advised that his cousin wanted to report being assaulted by a man named ". The male was wearing a black hat/black shirt.

On 05/03/2023 at 2256 hours, Officer Beu and I responded to reference a battery complaint which was later determined to be a home invasion. The communication center advised called the 911 center because his cousin, had been battered earlier in the day by a male who went by the name "
Officer Beu and I arrived on scene. Officer Beu spoke with and and I heard advised Officer Beu around 1300-1400 hours a male he knew by the name "came in to his residence and battered him. I observed to have bruising around his left eye. See Officer Beu's report for further details.
I conducted a neighborhood check at the following addresses:
spoke with resident advised he did not see or hear anything this afternoon. further advised he has exterior cameras on his residence, but they only the capture the sidewalk in front of his residence. indicated he would review the cameras to see if there was anything of evidentiary value and callback at a later time.
- spoke with residence advised he was not home between the hours of 1300-1400 hours. I observed exterior cameras on advised he did not believe the cameras worked.
- spoke with an uncooperative female resident who advised she did not know anything that happened across the street.
I contacted Sgt. King via telephone and advised him of the incident.
I took photographs of injuries and later uploaded them to evidence.com.
I took no further action.
