

## HarrisX/No Labels December 2022

### 50-State Moderate Independent Candidate Study

March 30, 2023

The HarrisX/No Labels 50-state survey was conducted by HarrisX within the United States from December 7-25, 2022 among between 400 and 800 registered voters per state. Voters were randomly selected from general population lists filtered by registered voters and the survey was administered online (via smartphone, tablet, or PC). The sampling margin of error of this survey is in between plus or minus 3.6 and 5.2 percentage points in each state depending on the sample size. Results were weighted by gender, age, race/ethnicity, income, education, and political party where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population.
