I have decided to seek re-election for the United States House of Representatives. Ohio has one terrible Senator right now and the prospect of retiring him and flipping control of the Senate to Republicans has held my attention for years. Together we have done some great things for and with our constituents. I have been elevated ahead of my peers in the House Financial Services Committee, serving as Chairman of Housing and Insurance. We have had early success with efforts to reform the House Foreign Affairs Committee – both in process and priorities. Lastly, staying focused on the House keeps me engaged in the substantive reforms that have built our narrow House majority and have thus far made it effective.

We are truly in a battle to save our country. With opposition in every direction there in DC, it's an honor to remain in the fight. I am confident that Ohio's voters are onto Sherrod Brown and will send him home. I shall always wonder if it would have been me, but it won't. Instead, I will continue to defend freedom from Ohio's 8th District and seek re-election in 2024.
