**This Mississippi Today / Siena College Poll was conducted June 4 - 7, 2023, among 646 likely Mississippi Republican primary voters. Of the 646 respondents, 646 were contacted through a dual frame (landline and cell phone) mode. Telephone sampling was conducted in English via a stratified dual frame probability sample of landline and cell phone telephone numbers of likely Republican primary voters from the L-2 Voter list.**

**A likely-to-vote probability was computed for each respondent based on both their stated likelihood to vote as well as by virtue of the imputation of a turnout probability score based on past voting behavior applied to their specific voting history. This probability to vote was applied as a weight along with a weight by gender, region, age, race/ethnicity, and education to ensure representativeness. It has an overall margin of error of +/- 4.8 percentage points including the design effects resulting from weighting.**
