OCTC anticipates it will use the following exhibits in connection with respondent: 001-062, 066-069, 075-082, 084-135, 137-173, 179-206, 277, 292-300, 305, 307-313, 318-321, 323, 326-331, 340-342, 352, 359-360. The issue of harm is not limited to a factor in aggravation in this case. Respondent has asserted that the First Amendment protects

26	his speech in part because the speech did not cause harm. (See Joint Pretrial Statement, p. 50 "Lawyers' statements about government or political events are often, and perhaps ordinarily, no more harmful to public discourse and public understanding than other peoples' political lies.") Furthermore, some of the State Bar's witnesses are high-ranking government officials—for example, Michigan Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson—who would be significantly inconvenienced by making two appearances in this matter and may be unavailable for a second appearance.
