

BEAD

Broadband Equity Access & Deployment

Federal program funding from the Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act. \$42.6 billion being administered by the NTIA (National Telecommunications & Information Administration.) Michigan is expected to receive \$1.6 to 1.8 billion.

Funding

We expect to get the remaining funding through ROBIN and/or BEAD.



Detailed design

The county is divided into 8 zones. Decisions about where to start and construction schedule in June.



Permits and materials

123Net has an experienced permitting and procurement team to prepare for construction.



Construction

Trenching, boring or aerial placement of fiber, along with handholes to connect homes to the backbone.

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

WHAT IS IT?

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The benefit provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for internet service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

ACP: WHO IS ELIGIBLE?



A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Participates in any of the following assistance programs: SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in any of the following Tribal specific programs: Bureau of Indian A airs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or Tribal Head Start (income based);
- Participates in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income internet program.

ACP: HOW DO I ENROLL?



STEP ONE

Go to **AffordableConnectivity.gov** to submit an application or print a mail-in application

STEP TWO

Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.

Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.
