This email acknowledges receipt of your April 3, 2023, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. § 552) request received by the U.S. Department of State, Office of Information Programs and Services on April 3, 2023, regarding email correspondence between US Embassy Islamabad, National Visa Center and the Bureau of Consular affairs discussing the Immigrant visa backlog at the embassy in Islamabad, to include discussion of officials on the size of the backlog, public impact of the backlog, steps being taken to resolve the backlog, estimated timeframes on resolution, how staffing decisions have impacted the backlog, the impact of the afghan withdrawal on the backlog and any other pertinent information on policy decisions that may have impacted this issue (Date Range for Record Search: From 8/19/2022 To 4/3/2023). Unless you advise otherwise, we will treat as non-responsive any compilations of publicly available news reports and any publicly available documents not created by the U.S. government, such as mass-distribution emails from news media.
