ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR No. 2023-332

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY REQUESTING THE FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION INTERVENE TO BLOCK THE PROPOSED MERGER OF KROGER AND ALBERTSONS IN RECOGNITION WITH RESPECT TO FOOD INSECURITY AND MARKET COMPETITION IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AND THE STATE OF ALASKA.

WHEREAS, The United States' two largest grocery store chains announced a \$1.9 billion divestiture plan on Friday, September 8, 2023, including the sale of 14 Albertsons-owned stores in Alaska¹; and

WHEREAS, Kroger, the parent company to Fred Meyer, operates five stores in the Municipality of Anchorage, and Albertsons, the parent company of Carrs Safeway, operates nine stores in the Municipality, are the two most prominent grocery store chains within the Municipality of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, the history of grocery store mergers has not been favorable for Alaskans – when Safeway took over the Alaska-based Carrs chain in 1999, they made a similar deal, which included the sale of seven stores to a competitor. Alaska Marketplace acquired six of those stores, but they closed in little more than a year; and

WHEREAS, More than 78,000 Alaskans, or 1 in 10 residents, struggle with food insecurity and 13% of Alaska kids live in homes without enough food²; and

WHEREAS, The Council for Community and Economic Research produces a *Cost of Living Index*, which measures regional differences in the cost of consumer goods and services, excluding taxes and non-consumer expenditures, across 61 items on a quarterly basis. In the *Cost of Living Index Review of Quarter Two in 2023*, Anchorage is listed as the number 2 most expensive places for grocery items, behind Fairbanks in the number 1 place, with matching index scores³; and

WHEREAS, Upwards of 95% of Anchorage's food supply is shipped from outside the state, with most imported food entering the state through the Port of Alaska, a Municipality of Anchorage asset; now, therefore

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

<u>Section 1.</u> To request that the Federal Trade Commission intervene to block the proposed merger of Kroger and Albertsons to prevent further concentration of the grocery store market in the Municipality of Anchorage, where the potential divestment of stores would effectively monopolize the grocery store market and threaten basic food security in the Municipality.

<u>Section 2.</u> This resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.
