POSITION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE BODY

The victim, a white female, age 59, was found in the bedroom at the west end of her mobile home. The victim was found lying nude, stretched across her bed on her back. Her head and top portion of her torso was falling off the north side of the bed, with the back of her head resting on the floor. The victim's right arm was in a 45 degree outward position and was bent out at the elbow, with her right hand resting near her face area. The left arm was in a downward position and was bent at the elbow, with her left forearm and hand resting across her chest area. There was a lady's purple jumpsuit on a hanger in between the victim's left upper arm and upper torso. Both of the victim's legs were in a straight downward position, stretching across toward the south side of the

bed. Upon observing the victim there appeared to be two electrical cords wrapped around the victim's neck. One of the cords had a curling iron attached to it. The end of one of the cords had been pulled off or broken off. There appeared to be a stab wound to the mid stomach area and a stab wound to the right side area of the victim. The victim's right breast had bruising around the nipple area. There appeared to have been lacerations to the neck area and face and head area. There was blood covering the victim's neck, face and head area, also, blood near the wounds around the stomach area. On the left upper leg of the victim, there were glass fragments, hair fibers and also a blood smear.

DESCRIPTION OF THE CRIME SCENE

The crime scene is located on the southside of Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida, in the Mandarin area, at 12126 Plummer Grant Road. At this address is a brown single wide mobile home resting on several acres of land. The mobile home sits on the north side of Plummer Grant Road and faces a southern direction. There is a dirt driveway on the west side of the mobile home which leads to the rear of the mobile home, to a carport area. The victim's 1989 3 door Honda Accord vehicle was found parked under the carport. On the south side of the vehicle next to the north wall of the mobile home, the victim had gardening tools and work gloves on a small table. On the concrete floor of the carport, between the rear of the vehicle and the mobile home, there was a pair of gardening shears found. Just above the shears on the north wall of the mobile home, there was a small telephone box with cables. The cables had been cut by the unknown suspect(s) with what appeared to be the garden shears. At the rear of the mobile home, attached to the carport, is a screened in patio. There are two separate doors leading to this patio; one is on the west side of the patio under the carport near the victim's vehicle, the other door is on the north side of the patio. (According to the victim's family, the victim always entered via the patio door under the carport. The north side screened door was always kept locked.) The front door of the mobile home faces Plummer Grant Road and has concrete steps leading to the front door. There was a potted plant found on the concrete steps which had been turned over, possibly by the suspect(s). This writer looked completely around the mobile home and it was observed that all the window screens were intact on the windows. Going back to the carport, walking east past the victim's vehicle under the carport, there are concrete steps leading up to the west patio door. On the north side of the steps on the ground, there was a small pair of gardening shears. There was also a white Marlboro Light cigarette butt lying next to the shears. Entering the screened patio, through the carport door, there is a back door to the mobile home to the right, which is at the southwest corner of the patio and on the north side of the mobile home. This door was in an open position upon this writer's observance. Just east of the back door is a window which is at the kitchen area of the mobile home. This window was open and the screen had been removed and placed on the floor of the patio. There was a small wooden table on the patio floor under the window. There was a tennis shoe print found on top of the wooden table. There was a radio on the floor next to the wooden table,

which appeared to have been knocked off the table onto the floor by the unknown suspect(s). Also there was a lamp next to the wooden table which appeared to have been moved off the table by the suspect(s). There was a patio lounge chair next to the wooden table which had a blue bottle of Soft Soap, two bottle corks, a small ornament, a Danielle Steel Daddy Book, a green envelope, and a plastic wrap on it. On the floor next to the lounge chair was a white telephone, which was off the hook. There was also a curtain rod holder and a screw on the floor near the lounge chair. There was a smaller patio chair near the lounge chair. There were three catalog books on the floor near the smaller chair. There was also a gray pen and a package of plant food on the floor near the wooden table. On the north wall of the screened room was a fold-out table with miscellaneous papers on top of the table belonging to the victim. The screen door on the north wall had been propped open with a plastic table. On the east side of the screened room there is a laundry room. This area was checked and nothing appeared to be disturbed in this room.

After reviewing the screened room, this writer entered the mobile home through the rear door from the screened room. Upon entering the door, one enters the kitchen area of the mobile home. To the immediate right is a door which leads into the bedroom where the victim was found. There is a cabinet to the left of the rear door which had the door open. In the cabinet there was a syringe and several liquor bottles. Next to the cabinet along the north wall, there is a stove and next to that was the kitchen sink and counter. There was a bottle of Grenache' wine on the counter. Over the sink is where the opened window was found. This is apparently where the entry was made by the suspects. The curtain and rod at this window, were resting on a kitchen knife which was stuck in the wall at the top of the window. There were dishes observed in the sink and on the floor of the kitchen. There were several items found, an empty green bottle of Seagrams, an empty rum bottle, several eating utensil items, along with a green utensil pan. It appeared that the utensil items came from the utensil drawer under the counter near the sink. There were four drawers in this area. The top drawer and the third drawer down, were partially open. The top drawer was the utensil drawer. To the east of the sink the counter continues and forms into a bar. The bar separates the kitchen from the living room. On top of this bar was a woman's magazine in an open position on a page of women modeling bikinis. On the south wall of the kitchen was a pantry, with the doors open. There were several canning goods in the pantry. On the floor at the pantry door, there were two napkin rings and a blue candle. On the west wall of the kitchen, there was a table with matching chairs. On the floor near this table, there were miscellaneous papers, a pill bottle, and several items of costume jewelry, which all belonged to the victim.

After observing the kitchen, this writer walked east going into the living room. There were a pair of women's stockings and a white belt on the floor next to the bar which separates the kitchen and living room. There was a hand held T.V. remote control box in the middle area of the floor. There were also a

pair of black and white checkered shorts and a metal bar on the floor. On the south wall of the living room is where the front door of the mobile home is. The front door was in a closed position, but was unlocked. There was a set of keys in the inside lock of the front door. There was also a coffee table and a chair on the south wall. On the cushion of the chair was a brown smear and what appeared to be a pubic hair. On the east wall of the living room there is a sofa, on the north wall is a sliding glass door which was in the locked position.

After reviewing the living room, this writer continued east through the mobile home to another doorway which leads into another room which had been converted into a den area. Upon entering that door to the left, is a door which leads to a bathroom. Nothing seemed out of place in the bathroom. Upon observing the den area, the victim's black purse was found in the middle of the floor. The victim's wallet and contents of the purse had been scattered on the floor. All of the victim's credit cards were accounted for. On the south wall of the den there was a sofa. On this sofa was a telephone, along with miscellaneous papers. Next to the sofa was a night stand. On the nightstand was one coffee cup with some type of drink in it, possibly coffee. On the north wall of the den is a closet area and also a television set. On the west wall was a desk with the victim's personal papers in it. According to family members, this room is where the victim spent most of her time while at home.

After reviewing the den area, this writer went to the west end of the mobile home which is the victim's bedroom. Upon observing from the doorway, which had beads hanging down from it, into the victim's bedroom from the kitchen, this writer observed the victim lying on her bed, which was to the left. The headboard of the bed was on the east wall with the bed protruding outward. The victim was lying diagonally across the bed with her head resting on the floor on the north side of the bed, just inside the doorway. There was a .22 caliber bullet found in the doorway. The following items were observed on the floor on the north side of the bed near and within the vicinity of the victim's head:

- One white towel.
- Two blue place mats.
- One brass table stand, which had been knocked over and the glass top lying on the floor. There was blood on the legs of the brass table stand and blood splatters on the glass table top. There was also a shoe print on the glass table top.
- One paring knife, with blood on it.
- One Bols liquor bottle, with the bottle neck broken.
- One hand towel.
- One blue cloth napkin.
- One Usher's Scotch bottle, with blood on it.
- One full can of tomato juice, with blood on it.
- One glass candy bowl, with blood on it.
- One jar of Vaseline Petroleum jelly.

Walking into the room to the right is a closet and a piece of electrical cord was near the doorway of the closet. Items observed on the bed:

One comforter under the victim with blood stains and bloody foot prints from a Britannia tennis shoe.
 Two pillows with blood stains.
 One blue dishtowel with blood stains.
 Glass from a broken bottle.

At the end of the bed on the floor were several items of assorted jewelry and miscellaneous articles which were from the victim's dresser drawers which were along the west wall of the bedroom. There was also a cordless telephone and a blue lighter and a green towel on the floor at the foot of the bed. On the floor on the south side of the bed was one white belt with blood on it. There was a dresser drawer on the south wall of the bedroom which had been ransacked. According to the victim's family, this is where the .22 caliber hand gun had been kept. BEGINNING OF INVESTIGATION

carport. They could observe items scattered inside and the phone off the hook. They yelled at the kitchen window, but could not get a response. Scott then opened the door. They observed that the house had been ransacked and they saw the victim dead in her bed. They then left the victim's residence.

Detective Conn then interviewed Scott Perry who lives at 12121 Plummer Grant Road. Mr. Perry advised that the victim's boyfriend, Stan Golding, had called and said that the victim was supposed to give him a call, but did not. The boyfriend was worried about the victim. Scott advised that he would check on the victim. Scott then told his wife, Donna, to look to see if the victim's car was at her residence, which she found that it was. Scott advised that he then went over to the victim's residence and picked up the newspaper from the yard and placed it in a garbage can near the screened room. The screen door near the carport was locked. Scott then noticed the kitchen window was open and he saw the victim's door open. He yelled through the kitchen window and there was no response. He looked around the porch area, but did not touch anything. He then came back out and met with his wife, and his wife then called the police and Harry McClain. Mr. McClain then ran over and he and Scott then went into the screened in room and unlocked the back door. Mr. McClain used a rug to handle the door handle. Mr. McClain then went inside and found the victim.

Detective Conn then interviewed Linda Engler who lives at 334 Sapelo Road, who is the best friend of the victim. Linda advised that she has known the victim for approximately 11 years. The victim has one daughter and has had two previous marriages. The victim gets along well with both ex-husbands. The daughter's name is Jennifer. Linda advised that at approximately 1430 hours she and the victim went shopping on September 15, 1990. They went to the Petunia Patch Store on the Arlington Expressway. They then returned to Linda's residence and had two mixed drinks and they socialized for a while, then went to the Pizza Inn on Atlantic Blvd. At approximately 2300 hours they returned to Linda's residence. The victim then left and said she was going home. At approximately 2330 hours Linda advised that she received a telephone call from the victim saying that she made it home okay and that was the last she heard from her. She advised that they call each other all the time. She recalls this morning she received no phone call from the victim. She attempted to call the victim at 0630 hours. The victim's boyfriend Stan Golding then called Linda at approximately 0730 hours and said he could not get any answer at the victim's residence. Linda advised that she then called the Perry's residence to go check on the victim. Ms. Perry soon called back and said that something was wrong. The victim had not mentioned to Linda of any suspicious people recently or having any problem with anyone. She advised that the victim is very cautious and would not leave the kitchen window in an up position at night. Linda advised that the victim's boyfriend, Stan Golding, works for Peugeot. She advised that he is currently staying out-of-town. He was in Jacksonville approximately one month ago. Linda knows of no enemies that the victim had.

After talking to Linda, Detective Conn then talked with Officer P.B.Sandlin #5659. Officer Sandlin advised that at approximately 2130 hours on September 15, 1990, he observed a white male, 20 to 25 years of age, with sandy brown hair, 5'10", 160 to 170 pounds with a shortsleeved shirt on, with the tail sticking out. The white male had a dirty cast on his right arm from the elbow to the hand. Officer Sandlin observed the white male sitting in the roadway in the eastbound lane on Plummer Grant Road. The subject was standing in front of 12555 Plummer Grant Road. Officer Sandlin stopped the subject and asked concerning the subject sitting in the road. He then advised the subject to leave. Officer Sandlin then left and went down the street and then returned and the subject was gone. Officer Sandlin gave this information in case it was possibly related to this homicide.

Detective Conn also learned that the next-of-kin had been notified. The brother, Gene Olmstead would be enroute from Georgia and would be due in late in the evening. Detective Conn asked Scott and Donna Perry if they recognized the description of the suspicious person spotted by Officer Sandlin. They did not recognize anyone who fit that description.

At the scene, Detective K.D.Gilbreath's investigation consisted of reviewing the crime scene and also doing an area canvass. Detective Gilbreath talked with the following people during the area canvass:

evening. She had no information concerning the incident.

(8) EMERY ANDREW, 4390 MANDRAIN ROAD, 268-2767. Mr. Andrew had no information concerning the incident. He did observe a pick up truck in the area at approximately 0100 hours. It appeared to be a Nissan type truck. The truck turned left on Plummer Grant Road. He had no further information concerning the truck.

Detective Gilbreath then interviewed David Evans' wife, Reatha Ann Evans. Ms. Evans verified that David picked her up at approximately 2220 hours and then they went home.

Officer V.A. Jefferson #5685, conducted an area canvass and talked with John Scarboro at 12265 Old St. Augustine Road, 268-1968. Ms. Scarboro advised that David Evans is painting a vacant rental house, which is at the same address where he resides. Ms. Scarboro advised that he left his residence at 1930 hours and Mr. Evans was at the residence painting. When he returned home, the painter was gone.

Officer Jefferson also talked with Pamela Bailey at 12226 Old St. Augustine Road, 268-0533. Ms. Bailey advised that at approximately 2300 hours on September 15, 1990, her dog was barking. She did not notice anything unusual at the time. She had no information concerning the incident.

After investigating the crime scene, the Medical Examiner's Office was called. The victim was transported to the Medical Examiner's Office by their personnel.

AUTOPSY

On September 17, 1990, an autopsy was performed on the victim by Dr. Floro of the Medical Examiner's Office. He diagnosed the victim's death as ligature strangulation and multiple stab wounds. The manner of death was listed as homicide. The victim had a stab wound to the stomach area and a stab wound to the right rib cage area. There were stab wounds to the throat area and the upper right back area. There was a bruise behind the victim's right ear. There was also a bruise on the nipple area of the victim's right breast and also two bruises to the left knee area. The victim apparently had been strangled by the electrical cords which were still wrapped around the victim. The victim had been sexually assaulted, both vaginally and anally and there was sperm found in both cavities. The alcohol and drug test results were negative, refer to M.E.#901052.

SEPTEMBER 17, 1990, 0930 HOURS This writer talked with Mike Shepard who lives at 12375 Plummer Grant Road, 268-2578. Mr. Shepard advised that at approximately 2320 hours on September 14, 1990 or September 15, 1990, he left his residence. While leaving he noticed a white Ford pickup truck drive by real slow toward St. Augustine Road. The truck backed into a field next to the victim's residence. There were two white males in the truck. They got out of the truck and were standing at the back of the truck. The only description of the white males are approximately 5'10, 160-170 pounds, with dark hair. The truck was a mid 70's truck. The fender on the front driver's side was painted red or orange. He did not see the subject's faces.

SEPTEMBER 17, 1990, 1000 HOURS This writer went to the Medical Examiner's Office and observed the autopsy that was conducted on the victim by Dr. Floro.

SEPTEMBER 17, 1990, 1240 HOURS This writer talked with Gene McClain, 262-6709. Mr. McClain advised that the victim does use a pest control company. He believes the name of the pest control company is Alfa and there is a possibility that the exterminator has a key to the victim's place. Also Mr. McClain advised that on September 14, 1990, there were approximately four Kirby vacuum cleaner representatives selling vacuum cleaners in the area.

ago. He remember it was the Labor Day Weekend. The last time he was at the victim's residence was the Wednesday before the Labor Day Weekend. Mr. Golding advised that he owns a .22 caliber automatic pistol which is registered to him. The gun was kept at the victim's residence. Mr. Golding said that he last talked with the victim Saturday night on September 15, 1990 at approximately 2330 hours. She had just returned home from Linda Engler's residence. He advised that the victim was supposed to call him early the next morning for a wake-up call, but the victim never called. Mr. Golding advised that he was in Anaheim, Calif. at the time. He then called neighbors of the victim and the victim was soon found.

After talking with Mr. Golding, this writer then talked with Linda Engler, 334 Sapelo Road, 721-8574. Ms. Engler advised that the victim came over to her residence at approximately 1430 hours on September 15, 1990. They then went to the Petunia Dress Shop at the Arlington Expressway Mall. They left there at approximately 1900 hours. They then went to Linda's residence until approximately 2030 hours. The victim drank two Vodka drinks. They then went to the Pizza Hut on Atlantic Blvd. The victim then brought Linda back to her residence and dropped her off at approximately 2300 hours. The victim then left and went to her residence. When the victim returned to her residence, she then called Linda at approximately 2330 hours. The victim advised that she was okay. Ms. Engler advised that the victim was wearing a pair of gray and black shorts and a knit shirt. She had on a pair of anklets and sneakers.

SEPTEMBER 17, 1990, 1330 HOURS This writer met with the victim's family at the Police Memorial Building. They were advised of the circumstances surrounding the incident.

SEPTEMBER 18, 1990, 1000 HOURS This writer went back to the scene with Assistant State Attorney Bernie de la Rionda, Evidence Technician G.W.Powers, the victim's family and also the victim's boyfriend, Stan Golding. This writer escorted Stan Golding into the residence to search for possible missing items. It was learned through the search that the victim was missing a British coin pendant with a gold chain and also a thin gold chain, an Erma .22 caliber automatic pistol, serial number J18198. Mr. Golding advised that there was a crystal type costume jewelry necklace color green that could be missing, but he was not sure.

After escorting Mr. Golding around, this writer then assisted the Evidence Technician in searching for additional evidence. There was a stain found on the living room chair. Additional items taken from the residence as evidence were the cover of the living room chair, a piece of cord from the victim's bedroom, miscellaneous papers were taken off the floor of the residence and also the magazines from the bar in the kitchen area were also taken. There was also a metal rod from the victim's bedroom taken as evidence.

Mike Robinson, Detective C.L.Conn and Detective Sgt. R.H.Seibler, conducted an area canvass in the area of 59th Street and Main Street. There was no information obtained concerning the stolen vehicle found at 59th Street and Main Street.

This writer also talked with Juanita Mallard at the Main Street Methodist Church. She advised that she found records concerning Anthony Robinson. She advised that he also goes by the name of Lester Tisby and gave the address of 2230 Session Lane. She advised that the last documentation regarding Robinson was on August 23, 1988 where a check was written to the subject to help pay his rent. Mr. Robinson had also been to the Arlington United Methodist Church. This is every Monday through Friday. Also during this time period, he can check out until 2100 hours at night as long as he tells his probation officer where he is going and if he leaves a telephone number. On the weekends, it is the same routine, but he is allowed to stay somewhere else over night as long as he leaves an address and a phone

number where he can be reached. Mr. Holton advised that on the weekend of the incident, he was staying at 4858 Julington Creek Road at Cecil Slaughter's house. He advised that the house is vacated by Mr. Slaughter and he has been staying there on the weekends since he was placed in the Half-Way house. Mr. Holton advised that he was staying at the residence on September 15, 1990 and called in to the Half-Way house and checked in with them sometime between 2000 hours and 2200 hours. There was a white female named Angela Smith staying with him. He advised that she lives somewhere on Verdis Road. She was with Mr. Holton all night. She also had two kids with her. On September 15, 1990 between 2000 hours and 2100 hours he parked his car in the driveway near the house. Sometime after midnight, someone called from the Half-Way House to check on him. Mr. Holton advised that he left his keys in his car, which is a Ford Ranchero. The car was left unlocked. He woke up at approximately 0750 hours Sunday morning on September 16, 1990 and Angela looked out the window and his vehicle was gone. He then called the police. Mr. Holton advised that when he received his vehicle back, the padded dashboard was missing. he advised that the vehicle was also stolen approximately 2 weeks before this incident. It was stolen from Lane Avenue and I-10.

SEPTEMBER 26, 1990, 1230 HOURS This writer talked with Stan Golding. Mr. Golding advised that the plastic yellow table that was found at the victim's residence propping the back screen door open, was kept near the screened door near where it was found. The back screened door that was propped open was always locked, and was never used. He was asked concerning the pest control company that the victim used, and he did not know. The victim had no problems with people at her work place. There were no alcoholic beverages kept in the bedroom. The screen front door is always kept locked. she did, but she can say that the victim enjoyed sailing. Ms. Engler also advised that she remembers further details of what the victim was wearing on the night of the incident. Ms. Engler stated that she had a white wrinkling material pullover blouse. The pullover had a rib neck and bottom and it was shortsleeved. She had on a pair of gray and black checkered shorts. When she and the victim went to the Petunia Shop, the victim had picked up several items of clothing and had taken them home with her.

For information, these clothing items were possibly the clothing items found on the victim's bed with the hangers on them.

SEPTEMBER 27, 1990, 0930 HOURS This writer went by 4858 Julington Creek Road and there was no one home. This writer then attempted to contact Angela Smith on Verdis Street, but could not locate her.

SEPTEMBER 27, 1990, 2230 HOURS This writer went by the Kings Inn Motel on Arlington Expressway and talked with Walter Holton in reference to locating Angela Smith. Mr. Holton did not know the address, but advised that there was a gold Cadillac in the driveway and there is a small pool in the front yard. Sgt. because her mother-in-law had one just like it. She identified the sailboat pendant as being exactly like the one her mother-in-law wore. Ms. Smith had a photograph of her mother-in-law with a sailboat pendant on. The pendant in the photograph looked exactly like the sailboat pendant taken from the pawn shop.

This writer then showed the sailboat pendant to Carol Tokin. Carol advised that she possibly recalls seeing a sailboat pendant on the victim one time, but she could not remember well, therefore, she was unable to identify the sailboat pendant.

This writer also showed the pendant to Peggy Magee, but she did not recall the victim wearing a sailboat pendant.

SEPTEMBER 27, 1990, 1700 HOURS This writer talked with Stan Golding. He advised that he recalls the victim having a small gold sailboat pendant, but it was cut out from the shape of a coin. The coin pendant that the victim wore was either a King George or King Edward or Queen Victoria coin. The date of the coin could have been 1896.

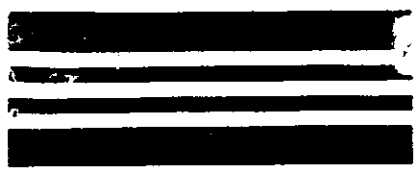

Snyder Street. Mr. McHan advised this writer that he knows Steven Taylor and Gerald Murray, whose nickname is Lane. McHan recalls the night the victim was killed was on a Saturday night. He remembers being at the Corner Pocket Pool Hall on State Road 13 at approximately 2300 hours. He advised that he was at the Corner Pocket with a subject named James Fisher, nicknamed, "Bubba." James drives a red Chevy S10 pickup truck. McHan advised this writer that James had dropped Lane Murray and Steven Taylor off at the intersection of Jody Lane and Plummer Grant Road. McHan advised that he stayed at the Corner Pocket for approximately 20 minutes and then left. The next day he talked with James Fisher who had told him that he had dropped Murray and Taylor off at approximately 0300 hours at Jody Lane and Plummer Grant Road. Fisher had told him that Murray and Taylor had left town after the incident. McHan was asked concerning Murray trying to sell jewelry or blood being on Murray's shirt. McHan denied any knowledge of Murray attempting to sell him or his mother any jewelry or seeing Murray with blood on his shirt.

FEBRUARY 7, 1991, 1215 HOURS This writer made contact with Joyce Fisher at 12605 Plummer Grant Road. Joyce is the mother of James Fisher. Ms. Fisher advised that her son James had told her that on the night of the victim's murder, he had dropped Lane Murray and someone else off nearby where the incident occurred.

FEBRUARY 7, 1991, 1230 HOURS This writer made contact with Corey James Combs at 12535 Agatite Road. Mr. Combs advised that he heard from James Fisher that he (James) had dropped Steven Taylor and Lane Murray off near where the victim had lived. Combs believes they were dropped off at Deeder Lane and St. Augustine Road. Combs also heard that Murray and Taylor had left town the day after the murder. Combs advised that a couple of days after the incident, he met Murray at James Fisher's house on Plummer Grant Road. (Murray advised that he was not involved in the incident, and asked why would they leave town if they did it and let everyone know.) Combs advised this writer that a white female who lives two houses down from him said that Taylor and Murray tried to break into her garage and they had sexually harassed her. Combs advised that Murray told him that after the white female had caught them breaking into her garage, that they should have raped her. Combs advised that a subject named Skip Rex White might have further information, phone 292-9330.

FEBRUARY 8, 1991, 2230 HOURS This writer went to the Montgomery Correctional Institute where Gerald Murray is incarcerated. Murray was checked to see what type of shoes he was wearing; he was wearing flip-flops. His property was then checked and there were no shoes in his personal belongings. This was done to compare the shoe prints found at the scene with the shoes in Murray's possession.

FEBRUARY 11, 1991, 1115 HOURS This writer talked with James Richard Fisher, Jr., (Bubba) at 12605 Plummer Grant Road. Fisher advised that he remembers the night the victim got killed. Lane Murray had called him that Saturday afternoon.

Lane Murray wanted to do something. Fisher advised he went over to Murray's house, which is next-door to his. They then went to the Northside off of Main Street and picked up a white male named Steve Taylor. He remembers picking Taylor up at a house off of Main Street and remembers the house was on a corner. He did not know the exact location of the house. He advised that there was a white pickup truck and a boat in the yard. After picking Taylor up, they then went to the Corner Pocket Pool Hall on State Road 13, in Mandarin. They got there at approximately 2315 to 2330 hours. They stayed there for approximately 35 to 40 minutes. Neither Taylor or Murray appeared to be drunk or intoxicated. They left the Corner Pocket and Murray and Taylor were talking about getting cocaine. They did not have any money. Fisher advised that he tried to get gas money from Taylor and Murray, but they said they did not have any. Fisher then took them to the corner of Herton Road and Deeder Lane and dropped them off. Fisher then went home.

FEBRUARY 11, 1991, 1400 HOURS This writer talked with Beverly Hull at 12573 Agatite Road. Ms. Hull advised at approximately two weeks before the victim was murdered, she caught Lane Murray and Steve Taylor in her garage one night at approximately 0200 hours. She made the subjects give her their driver's licenses. They said that they were kicked out of their house and were hungry. Ms. Hull advised that she told Murray and Taylor that she would feed them. Murray and Taylor stayed for a while, then upon leaving, Murray pinched Ms. Hull on her buttocks. Both subjects then left. A short time later Steve Taylor came back in a white new Cadillac. He knocked on Ms. Hull's door. Ms. Hull advised that she had a gun and told Taylor that it was too late. Taylor then left.

FEBRUARY 12, 1991, 0915 HOURS After learning that Steven Taylor had been arrested on an unrelated incident and was under sentence, this writer contacted Suzanne McKee of the Florida Department of Corrections, phone 904/496/2222, ext.107. Ms. McKee advised this writer that Steven Taylor was received at the prison on 11/29/90. He was transferred to the Lancaster Correctional Institute on 12/4/90 and released on 2/11/91.

FEBRUARY 12, 1991, 1300 HOURS This writer and Sgt. R.H.Seibler went to the area of 63rd and Main Street looking for the house that Steve Taylor was picked up at by Fisher. (For information, after interviewing Fisher on 2/11/91, he took this writer to the area of 63rd and Main Street in an attempt to locate the house that he picked Taylor up from. The house could not be located.)

This writer and Sgt. Seibler located the house at 7145 Bloxham Street. We talked with Johnny Allan Taylor and the brother Randy Lee Taylor. Both of the brothers advised that they knew Steven Taylor and that he had lived with them approximately four or five months ago at 7145 Bloxham Street. He lived with them for approximately one month. While talking to Johnny and Randy Taylor, this writer and Sgt. Seibler noticed a sailboat pendant around the neck of Johnny

Taylor. the sailboat pendant was on a long chain which was wrapped twice around Johnny Taylor's neck. The sailboat pendant resembled the pendant the victim wore in photographs received from the victim's family. The photographs were at the homicide office. This writer and Sgt. Seibler then went to the homicide office and reviewed the photographs.

FEBRUARY 12, 1991, 1415 HOURS This writer and Sgt. Seibler went back to 7145 Bloxham Street and talked with Johnny Taylor. He was asked where he got the sailboat pendant. Johnny Taylor advised that he had found the sailboat pendant along with some other jewelry in a plastic bag that his dog had dug up from their backyard. Randy Taylor then went to his apartment next door (this house is a duplex) and returned with a plastic bag. There was a gold sovereign and a gold earring in the bag. The gold sovereign was exactly like the victim wore in the photograph. Randy Taylor also had a gold necklace that he said came from the bag. All of the jewelry was taken into custody by this writer. Johnny Taylor had found a shirt that Steven Taylor had worn. This writer checked the shirt. There was a Bulova watch in the shirt and also a leather watchband. A dresser drawer that Steven Taylor had used was also checked. There were miscellaneous papers found in the drawer. Johnny Taylor was asked if any other items were left by Steven Taylor. He advised that there was an ax handle found under the bed of Steven Taylor's room and was placed there by Steven Taylor. Johnny and Randy Taylor were then requested to come to the homicide office for further interview. The jewelry and other items found at Johnny Taylor's residence, were taken into custody and placed into the property room.

FEBRUARY 12, 1991, 1510 HOURS This writer interviewed Johnny Taylor at the homicide office. Johnny advised that he found the jewelry in the backyard approximately two to three days ago. He does not know how the bag got there. He believes that his dog dug the jewelry up from the ground. Johnny Taylor also advised that Steven Taylor worked at Winn Dixie in Gateway, along with Randy Taylor. Steven Taylor worked at Winn Dixie for approximately two to three weeks then he quit. He stayed at their residence approximately two to three weeks after that and he would not pay rent.

After talking with Johnny Taylor, this writer then talked with Randy Taylor. Randy advised that Johnny found the jewelry in the backyard. Randy advised that he took a necklace from the bag and placed it around his neck.

in a small red Escort vehicle. Steven walked out into the backyard by himself for a couple of minutes and came back inside the house. Johnny asked Steven what he was doing and Steven said he was looking at the new fence. Johnny said one of the subjects with Steven was Lane Murray's younger brother. A photospread with Steven Taylor's photo was shown to Johnny Taylor and he positively identified Steven Taylor's photo.

After talking with Johnny Taylor we then talked with Randy Taylor. Randy advised that Steven Taylor and two white males came over to their residence at approximately 2145 hours on 2/12/91. Randy advised that he went to his door and saw the subjects outside. Randy told Steven that he was going to work in approximately 10 minutes so Steven and the other two white males walked over to Johnny Taylor's apartment.

After talking to Randy Taylor he was shown a photospread with Steven Taylor's photo in it. Randy Taylor positively identified Steven Taylor's photo. Randy Taylor also advised this writer that he did own a 71 Ford pickup truck, color white, with red front fenders. He has let Steven Taylor borrow the truck a few times. On one occasion Steven wanted to go see his mother. Randy advised that his uncle, Ressie Taylor has the truck at this time.

This writer then talked with George Howard Banes. Mr. Banes advised that he was in the front yard at 7145 Bloxham Street with Randy Taylor when Johnny Taylor came up and said he found jewelry in the backyard. Mr. Banes advised that there were a couple of necklaces in the ziplock bag and the bag had water in it.

Misty advised that she was sitting at a table with Scott McHan, Richard Davey, a white female named Sandy, and a white male named Tommy. While sitting around the table Scott McHan said that Lane Murray came by and said that he was going to Canada and needed some money. Scott McHan had said that Lane Murray told him that they had been over at an old lady's house.

Doyle advised this writer that he had heard that James Fisher had dropped Steven Taylor and Lane Murray off approximately one half mile from the victim's residence on the night of the incident. Lane told Doyle that he and Steven Taylor went on a trip and Steven got pulled over and arrested and Lane was let go. Doyle advised this writer that Steven Taylor and Lane Murray were seen at Doyle's mother's house on the night of the incident by his mother.

This writer and Doyle White went to Doyle's mother's residence at 5102 Siesta Del Rio Drive. This writer talked with his mother, Juanita White. Ms. White advised that on the night the victim was killed, at approximately 0045 hours, she heard her dog barking. She looked out a window at the backyard. She saw two figures coming up into the backyard. She believed one of the figures to be Lane Murray. At approximately 0050 hours Lane Murray called her on the telephone and asked for Skip (Doyle). After Lane Murray had asked concerning Skip, Ms. White told Lane about observing the two subjects in her yard. Lane offered to come down to her house and spend the night with her. Ms. White refused the offer and the conversation ended. Ms. White advised that she got up Sunday morning and learned that the victim had been killed. Lane Murray's mother called that day and asked if she had seen Lane Murray. Lane Murray's mother then told Ms. White that she knew where Lane was, that he was off with Steven Taylor. Lane's mother asked Ms. White if she knew the lady that had gotten killed and she advised no.

Richard advised that he was at the Corner Pocket with Scott McHan and he saw James Fisher, Lane Murray and Steven Taylor. They were there with James Fisher. When Davey found out the next day of the victim's murder he believed that Lane Murray and Steve Taylor had done it.

Steven Taylor was contacted and he was advised that his name had come up in a criminal investigation and was requested to come to the Police Memorial Building to be interviewed. Steven Taylor agreed. Also present with Steven Taylor at the probation office was his father, Richard Taylor. Steven Taylor went with this writer and Sgt. Seibler to the homicide office.

FEBRUARY 15, 1991, 1215 HOURS This writer and Sgt. Seibler interviewed Steven Taylor at the homicide office. Prior to the interview he was advised of his Constitutional Rights by this writer. He signed the rights form stating he understood his rights. Steven told this writer and Sgt. Seibler that he had just been released from the Lancaster Correctional Institution on this past Monday, 2/11/91. He advised that he was serving a 15 month sentence for a traffic offense. Steven was asked concerning the night the victim was murdered and he advised that on that night he was with a subject named "Bubba" Fisher (James Fisher) and Lane Murray. He advised that on that night they went to the Corner Pocket Pool Hall on State Road 13 at approximately 2330 hours. They then rode around in Bubba Fisher's vehicle. Bubba Fisher then dropped he and Lane Murray off down the road from Lane Murray's house. He advised that from there he and Lane went to Skip's (Doyle White) house. Skip was not there. They then went to Lane's house, which was around 0100 hours. Steven advised that they then went to bed and Steven got up sometime between 0800 hours and 1100 hours the next morning. Steven advised he then went home, off of 63rd Street, in Jacksonville. He advised that he hitchhiked home. He was staying with a subject named Randy Taylor off of 63rd Street. He advised that he worked with Randy Taylor at the Winn Dixie in Gateway Shopping Center. Steven said he worked at Winn Dixie for approximately two months. Steven also advised that he left town a couple of days after the victim was murdered. He and Lane Murray hitchhiked on State Road 13 and they travelled around. He advised that they got stopped by the police in Ohio at a rest area. They let Lane Murray go, Taylor was arrested for a warrant from Jacksonville, Florida. Steven Taylor was asked if he had ever been in the victim's residence and he denied ever being in the victim's residence and also denied killing the victim.

1240 HOURS This writer and Sgt. Seibler left the room.

1245 HOURS Myself and Sgt. Seibler went back into the room with Steven Taylor and continued the interview. Steven advised that he, Bubba Fisher and Lane Murray stayed at the Corner Pocket Pool Hall for a couple of hours. He advised that there were "rednecks" fighting. He advised that Bubba Fisher lives next to Lane Murray. Bubba Fisher and Lane Murray came to his house on 63rd Street and picked him up prior to going to the Corner Pocket. Steven advised that he has lived with Randy Taylor for approximately two months. To get to Randy Taylor's house, you go out Main Street and take a right. Randy has a brother named Johnny Taylor

who is crippled. Steven advised that after they left his residence off of 63rd Street, they rode back to Mandarin, then went to the Corner Pocket. He remembers Scott McHan, Kenny Clifton and Corey Combs being at the Corner Pocket. Bubba and Lane had picked him up at his residence sometime between 2000 hours and 2100 hours. After leaving the corner pocket, he, Bubba and Lane rode around until approximately 0100 to 0200 hours, then he and Lane were dropped off behind Lane's house. They then walked to Skip White's house; he was not there, they then went to Lane's house. Steven believes that Lane's mother was there at the house. Steven went to sleep and woke up the next morning and went to his residence off of 63rd Street. He messed around his house a while, then went back to Mandarin. Lane was at his mother's house. Steven did not know the address of his residence off of 63rd Street. Steven was asked if he knew Walter Holton and he advised that he did not. He was asked if he had been in a blue Ford Ranchero, and he advised that he had not. He stated that he got to his residence off of 63rd Street sometime around 0900 hours. He denied driving the blue Ford Ranchero to the area near 63rd Street and Main Street. Steven advised that he and Lane Murray were born and raised together. Sgt. Seibler asked Steven for consent to get a blood sample from him. At this point Steven advised that he wanted to talk with his lawyer.

1330 HOURS This writer went to the State Attorney's Office and obtained a search warrant for blood, hair and saliva samples of Steven Taylor and Gerald Murray (Lane). While this writer was obtaining the search warrant, Detective J.R. Bogers picked up Cheavin Shea Murray at his residence. He was then transported to the homicide office.

1400 HOURS After receiving the search warrant for subject Steven Taylor, he was transported to the nurse's station of the Duval County Jail by myself and Detective J.R. Bogers. Blood, saliva and hair (head and pubic) samples were taken from subject Taylor. While at the nurses station, subject Taylor asked Detective Bogers how long it would take to get the test results back. Detective Bogers asked why. Subject Taylor said that he was just wondering when we would be back out to pick him up.

FEBRUARY 15, 1991, 1445 HOURS Detective J.R. Bogers interviewed Cheavin Shea Murray at the homicide office. Mr. Murray advised that he goes by the name Shea. Shea advised Detective Bogers that he was familiar with the incident involving the victim. He advised that he heard that the victim had been stabbed, strangled and raped. Shea advised that he has no idea who did the crime. About two nights after the victim's murder, he was at a party and someone said that Steve Taylor and his brother Lane did the murder. Shea advised that he did not know whether Steve and Lane did the murder or not.

While Detective Bogers interviewed Shea Murray, his brother Gerald DeLane Murray (Lane) was brought to the station and interviewed by Detective H.L. Scott and

Sgt. Seibler. Gerald Murray was advised of his Constitutional Rights and signed a rights form stating that he understood his rights. He was then interviewed. Sgt. Seibler asked Gerald Murray what he knew about the victim being killed. He advised that he heard the victim had been strangled. He advised that at approximately 1800 hours the day before the victim was murdered, he was with Steven Taylor and his brother Shea Murray. He advised that he, Steven and Shea had been riding around and drinking. He advised that they went to the Corner Pocket Pool Hall. He advised that they rode with a subject named Bubba Fisher and after leaving the Corner Pocket Pool Hall, Bubba Fisher dropped he and Steve Taylor off down the road from his (Murray's) house. He advised that he and Steve Taylor then walked to Skip White's house. Skip was not home. They then went to his house and drank beer. Murray advised that they got to his house sometime between 2300 hours and 0100 hours that night. He advised that he and Steve Taylor slept in the garage. Everyone else was in bed. Approximately 0830 hours the next morning, he got up and Steve Taylor was gone. After waking up, Murray advised that he washed his clothes and his mother told him that she saw on the news that someone was dead. Late that afternoon, Steven came back to his house. He and Steven then went to Steven's house and spent the night. Murray advised that they left town the next night (Monday). They went to Pearce County, Georgia, then to Virginia Beach. They left Virginia Beach and then went to Toledo, Ohio. Steven was then arrested for a traffic violation. Murray advised that he then hitchhiked back to Georgia with a black male in a Bronco Jeep. Murray advised that while at Steven's house, a pair of shorts and a t-shirt were washed. They were left in Steven's dryer. Murray denied ever going into the victim's house and denied the incident.

FEBRUARY 15, 1991, 1720 HOURS After Detective Scott and Sgt. Seibler interviewed Gerald Murray, this writer and Sgt. Seibler went back into the interview room. He was asked again of any involvement in the incident, and he denied any involvement.

1740 HOURS This writer talked with Cheavin Shea Murray. Cheavin Murray, who goes by the name of Shea, advised that on the night of the murder, he spent the night with a subject named Steven Bensmer. Shea advised that he came home the next day at approximately 1600 hours. Lane and Steven Taylor were sitting on the couch and they would not go outside. They did not want anyone around them and they had changed clothes. Shea also advised that on Tuesday, February 12, 1991, during the night time hours, he, Steven Taylor and Jason Leister, went to Steven's house at 7145 Bloxham Street, in Jason's vehicle. Shea advised that they all went into the house. While there, Steven Taylor went into the backyard and came back inside with dirt on his hands. Shea asked Steven, "what are you looking for, a gun?" with Shea Murray. Shea gave him the following details. Shea advised that on the night before the victim's murder, he believes it was a Saturday night, he was having a little party at his house. He advised that his brother Lane and Steven Taylor were at the Corner Pocket with Bubba Fisher. Bubba had dropped Steven and Lane off at Lane's house, then Bubba Fisher went home next door. Bubba Fisher came back over to Shea's house while Lane and Steven were still there, which was around 2200 to 2300 hours. Shea then advised that he, Lane, Steven and Bubba got into Bubba's truck and Bubba drove. Bubba then dropped Lane and Steven off at the corner of Caron and Julington Creek. Steven and Lane said they were walking to Skip's house. Bubba then took Shea and dropped him off back at his (Shea's) house. Bubba then went home. Around 2400 hours, Shea and Steven Bensmer walked to Bensmer's house on Deeder Street. Shea then spent the night with Bensmer. The next day, on a Sunday afternoon, Steven Taylor and Lane Murray were sitting in the living room at the Murray residence. They both were acting like they wanted to be alone. They were both wearing different shirts than they had on the night before. Steven was wearing different pants. Shea asked them to come play pool with him, but they stayed in the living room talking for about one hour. Shea advised that a discussion came up about the murder of the victim and Shea told Steven and Lane that they were the ones who probably killed the victim. Lane and Steven told Shea to shut up.

After Detective Bogers interviewed Shea Murray, he took Steven Taylor home at 1423 Marlee Road in St. John's County. While taking Steven Taylor home, he told Detective Bogers that if the police had to come back and arrest him to not knock at his father's door, just come to his trailer, because it is not any of his father's business.

FEBRUARY 15, 1991, 1845 HOURS This writer and Detective J.R. Bogers took subject Gerald Murray (Lane) to the nurse's station at the Duval County Jail for the withdrawal of blood, saliva and hair (head and pubic) samples, per the search warrant.

2030 HOURS This writer talked with Shea Murray again. Shea advised that Steven Taylor wears Brittania tennis shoes. Shea advised that jewelry and foreign coins were found in the garage behind his house. He advised that his mother told him to get rid of the items because they might belong to the victim. Shea advised he took the jewelry and coins which were in a ziplock bag and threw them near a creek on Greenland Road.

2050 HOURS A sworn statement was taken from Shea Murray by Assistant State Attorney Bernie de la Rionda.

For information, Fran Perry had one of the rings found in the bag. This writer took the ring and placed it in the property room.

FEBRUARY, 15, 1991, 2105 HOURS This writer interviewed Fran Perry, who is the mother of Lane and Shea Murray. She came to the Police Memorial Building to

be interviewed. Ms. Perry advised this writer that on the night the victim was killed, her son Lane left with Steven Taylor and Bubba Fisher. Lane came back home at approximately 0200 hours to 0300 hours that night. Lane was by himself. She believes that he slept on the couch. She believes that Lane was wearing a pair of blue jeans. She remembers that the next morning was a Sunday and it was the day that the victim was found. She recalls Lane leaving the house with Steven Taylor on that date. Ms. Perry advised that she believes that it was the next day on a Monday, her smaller children had found jewelry at the back of her house. The jewelry, including rings, was in a white sock. Ms. Perry advised that on the date the victim was found, she was telling her husband that someone had been murdered down the street and Lane told her that someone probably just broke in and stole something.

FEBRUARY 16, 1991, 0100 HOURS This writer and Detective J.R. Bogers talked with Gerald Murray (Lane). For information, prior to talking to Lane, his mother Fran Perry talked with him and told him to be truthful, and if he knew anything concerning the incident, to tell the police. This writer and Detective Bogers then talked with Lane. Lane denied being involved in the crime. He did say that the day after the crime, Steven Taylor came over to his (Lane's) house and said that on the night the victim was murdered, he stole a car from Julington Creek. The car was almost out of gas and on empty. Steven advised Lane that he broke into the victim's house to get gas money. The victim saw him and picked up the telephone. Steven told Lane that he beat the victim to death.

After talking to Lane Murray, his mother Fran Perry then talked with him momentarily.

0115 HOURS This writer and Detective Bogers went back into the room. Lane Murray gave the following details. Lane advised that he, Bubba Fisher, and Steven Taylor went to the Corner Pocket Pool Hall to drink beer and to shoot pool. They stayed at the pool hall for approximately one hour. A fight almost broke out between Steven Taylor and some other people, therefore, he, Steven and Bubba left the pool hall. Bubba dropped Steven, and Lane off at Knotah Road. Steven and Lane then walked down Siesta Del Rio Drive to Skip White's house. Skip's truck was not there. They walked about one fourth the way down Skip's driveway and saw that his truck was not there, they then left. Steven and Lane then went on foot to Lane's house. Steven told Lane he wanted to steal a car and go to his house on Bloxham Street. Lane told Steven that he did not feel like it. Lane and Steven then sat and drank a couple of beers. Steven then left on foot. Steven was mad and said "well fuck it then." Lane advised that after Steven left, he went to bed. The next morning between 0800 and 1000 hours, Lane advised that he got up and washed his clothes because he did not have anything to wear. Later that afternoon, between 1400 and 1600 hours, Steven Taylor called. Steven said he was coming over. Someone dropped Steven off at Lane's house around 1700 hours. Steven came into the house and they drank beer. Steven again told Lane that he broke into the lady's house and that the lady tried to use the telephone. Steven

told Lane he then started to slap the lady around. Steven then told Lane that he wanted to leave town. Lane said that approximately two days later that they hitchhiked to Ohio.

FEBRUARY 16, 1991, 0325 HOURS A sworn statement was taken from Gerald Delane Murray with Assistant State Attorney Bernie de la Rionda. During this sworn statement, Lane Murray also advised that Steven Taylor said that he took some jewelry from the victim and had buried it in the backyard of his house off of 63rd Street. Lane also said that Steven had approximately \$40.00 in cash on him. Lane also advised that he tried to question Steve concerning the victim's murder, but Steven said he did not want to talk about it. concerning the incident with the victim.

William advised that while in the dorm with Gerald Murray, on three occasions he had the chance to talk with Murray. Murray was saying that he was with a friend named Steven after his friend Steven murdered a woman in Jacksonville. Murray said he was in a Rancho after the murder and said that Steven drank wine coolers and shot up drugs in the woman's house, while he was murdering her. Murray told him that Steven had killed the woman. He had strangled, stabbed and raped her. Murray told him that the night of the murder, he and Steven rode around drinking in the Rancho after the murder. Murray also said that he was not worried about fingerprints being found in the car. Murray also made the statement that Steven buried some jewelry at a house that Steven was living in and the police had found it. Murray said that Steven looked for the jewelry after he got out of prison. He searched in the backyard, but the police already had it, because the guys that Steven was living with found the plastic bag with the jewelry and gave it to the police. Murray also said that the police found the Rancho near where Steven lived. Murray then told William that he (Murray) has not said anything to incriminate himself (Murray).

JUNE 10, 1991, 1430 HOURS This writer talked with George Steffen from the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office. He advised that William Glasgow has further information for this writer.

JUNE 11, 1991, 1145 HOURS This writer, along with Assistant State Attorney Bernie de la Rionda and a court reporter went back to Zephyrhills Correctional Institution. This writer interviewed William Glasgow. William advised that a white male named Adriene Latner is currently incarcerated in the Zephyrhills Correctional Institution and is from Jacksonville, Florida. Adriene is an associate of Gerald Murray. William advised that Adriene said something to Gerald and Gerald started laughing. Adriene then said that he was glad that they didn't do the house across the street from the victim because his girlfriend was there. William advised that Gerald then said something, then caught himself saying, "I told you I'm not involved." Murray then said the only thing they could get him for is being an assessor for being in the car. Gerald also made a comment about a Britannia shoe print, he believes a 10½ size. Gerald told William that Steven's mother bought Steven shoes and they were new. Gerald also told William that Steven went through the kitchen window of the victim's residence and left a shoe print. Adriene told Gerald that he heard they cut an electric cord and peeled back the ends and shocked the victim. Gerald brushed the comment off and would not talk about it. Gerald then changed the subject. Gerald told William that they never found any clothes or shoes. After talking with William Glasgow a sworn statement was then taken.

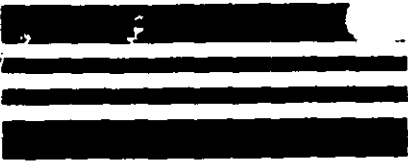

CONTINUATION OF INVESTIGATION

07-19-91: This writer talked with Steven Taylor's probation officer, Johnny Porter and received the name of Steven Taylor's mother, Francis Taylor. She is a Librarian at Jacksonville University.

09-26-91 at 1030 hours: This writer obtained handwriting exemplars from Steven Taylor.

10-08-91 at 1200 hours: This writer went to the Mandarin area to measure the distance from various locations. Gerald Murray's house to the victim's home was 6 tenths of a mile. It is 1.1 miles from the victim's house to the intersection of Hertton and Deeder Streets. It is almost 2 tenths of a mile from Hertton and Deeder Street to 4858 Julington Creek Road where the suspect vehicle was stolen from. It is 1.3 miles from the victim's residence to the residence at 4858 Julington Creek Road.

10-24-91 at 1400 hours: This writer took hairs taken from the crime scene to the Indian River Crime Lab for DNA processing. For information, prior to this, this writer sent the hairs taken from the crime scene to the FBI Lab in Washington, D.C. Analysis were made on the hairs. Pubic hair at the crime scene was matched to the pubic hair of Gerald Delane Murray. The hairs were taken to the Indian River Crime Lab for analysis.

04-08-92 at 0945 hours: After learning that the DNA of the hairs matched Gerald Delane Murray this writer and Detective Gilbreath interviewed Murray at the Homicide Office. Murray was advised of his constitutional rights and signed the rights form stating that he understood his rights. Mr. Murray was told that the DNA came back implicating him. Murray said that we should have gotten the results back last year. Detective Gilbreath asked Murray if he had any type of sexual relations with Steven Taylor. Murray advised "no". Murray advised that Bubba Fisher had dropped he and Steven Taylor

off in front of his house at 0100 hours on the date of the incident. Murray advised that he and Taylor went to Skip's house (Doyle White). They were gone for approximately one hour and then returned back to Murray's house. Murray advised that Skippy was not at home therefore, they went back to his house. Murray's mother was in bed and he did not see her or talk with her. His mother was in the trailer. He and Taylor were drinking beer in the garage. Murray said he then went to bed and doesn't know where Steve went. Murray said that the beer that they were drinking had been bought when they were with Bubba Fisher. Murray advised that he was drunk and does not remember what else happened. Murray said that he learned his hair had matched with the hair from the crime scene on TV during the trial of Taylor. Murray advised it did not worry him. Murray said that Taylor told on himself by "coming in her". Murray said, "you didn't find none of my come". He also said that we did not find his "come" on a rag. Murray was asked to explain how his hair got at the crime scene. He said it must have been when he pulled out a bag of reefer from his crotch and gave it to Steven Taylor. The hair must have stuck to the bag. Murray said he did not know where he gave the bag of reefer to Taylor. It was in Bubba Fisher's truck or in the street or in the house but said he did not remember. Murray then said some of his hair could have been on Steven Taylor's clothes and fell off. Murray said that if the hair was on Steven Taylor's clothes and Taylor took off his clothes and he's raping her on the bed it would fall off. Murray was asked how he knew Taylor had his clothes off and he said he assumed that's what he was doing.

04-09-92 at 1230 hours: Gerald Murray was indicted by the Grand Jury for First Degree Murder, Burglary, and Sexual Battery. He was again brought to the Police Memorial Building and advised of his constitutional rights. He was again asked to give us details concerning what he was doing the night of the victim's murder. He advised that he went drinking with Steven and Bubba Fisher, came home and went to bed. He said that we knew the story and he had nothing further to say. He was arrested and rebooked into the Duval County Jail.

04-15-92 at 1145 hours: This writer learned that a Charles Torak, Jr. was incarcerated in the Clay County Jail and had information concerning the victim's homicide. This writer went to Green Cove Springs and interviewed Charles Torak. Mr. Torak advised that approximately 2 and a half months ago he was in contact with Gerald Murray. This was while he was incarcerated in Duval County Jail. He advised that he was a cell mate of Murray. He told him that his best friend was on death row for a murder and that he (Murray) was just accused of driving the suspect's vehicle and waiting for Taylor. Murray also told Torak that police took samples of blood and hair from him. Torak advised that he talked with Murray on several occasions. On one occasion Torak was questioning Murray about why the police took samples from him. Torak began asking Murray if he ever testified at trial and Murray began getting a "I got away type attitude" and then started giving Torak the scenerio. Murray told Torak it was a surprise burglary, that the victim

was suprised. Murray also mentioned something about a buck knife that they had switched from using _____ to a steak knife. Murray told Torak they had talked a little while and decided to use a knife from the house because bringing their own knife was not to smart. Murray also mentioned that the buck knife was not big enough, something to the effect that it would hit and bounce or something like that. Murray also told Torak that he stabbed the victim also. Murray told Torak that he did not stab the victim as many times as Taylor. Murray also admitted to Torak that he strangled the victim along with his friend (Taylor). Murray admitted the victim resisted and put up a fight. Murray told Torak the victim "put up a hell of a fight for her age". Murray mentioned that jewelry was taken from the victim, most of it was fake jewelry but there was one nice piece of jewelry that he really liked and didn't want to get rid of it. It was a unicorn with a ruby in it and had a little horse like pendant. Murray said that a friend of his pawned the item at a pawn shop on Casset Avenue. Murray mentioned also to Torak that he buried his clothing. He believes Murray said it was somewhere near his residence. Murray said there was a lot of blood on his clothing. Murray said he killed the victim because she would be able to identify him. Murray also told Torak the reason they wanted to use a knife from the scene was so it would look like a surprise burglary and not planned. Murray told Torak he was going to act crazy and attempt to beat the murder charge. Torak also believes that Murray mentioned leaving the city but he could not recall. After talking to Mr. Torak a sworn statement was taken by Assistant State Attorney Bernie de le Rionda.

04-20-92 at 0900 hours: This writer talked with Ricky Proctor at the Duval County Jail. Ricky advised that he is in jail for auto theft, possession of marijuana and resisting arrest without violence. He has four felony convictions. He has been in the Duval County Jail since March 8, 1992. Approximately 3 and a half weeks ago he was in a jail cell with Gerald Murray. Murray was saying he and his partner, Steven Taylor would rob people and take their money and jewelry. He said that Taylor was on death row for murder. Murray said the police tried to get him but there was not enough evidence to put him at the scene. Murray said he and Steven Taylor robbed a woman in Mandarin in her house and "we killed her". Murray always bragged about how ruthless he and Steve were about robbing and pistol whipping people and robbing stores without a gun. Proctor had no further information.

Due to the arrest of both Steven Taylor and Gerald Murray I recommend this case be cleared by arrest, over 18, Detective.
